OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing session, for leave to bring in a Bill to repeal, alter, amend, enlarge, and abridge some of the powers and provisions of the three several Acts of Parliament following (that is to say), an Act passed in the fifty-third year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for improving the pier and port of Hartlepool, in the county of Durham;" another Act passed in the second year of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for amending and rendering more effectual an Act of King George the Third, for improving the pier and port of Hartlepool, in the county of Durham;" and another Act passed in the first year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act for amending an Act of the second year of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, and for granting further rates and powers for improving the port of Hartlepool, in the county of Durham."

And notice is hereby further given, that it is intended by the said Bill (amongst other things) to alter or vary the number of the Commissioners appointed or to be appointed under or by virtue of the said recited Acts, some or one of them, for executing the powers and provisions of such Acts, and to alter or vary the qualification of such Commissioners, and the mode or modes of nominating, and appointing; and qualifying such Commissioners.
