### whitehal, June 21.

E have an account from *Chard* of the 19th, initiant; that my Lord *churthil*, having upon his Arrival there with His Majeflies Forces under his Command, fent out

Licutenant Monaux with twenty Commanded Men and a Quartermalter of the Earl of Oxfords Regiment, they came up, within two Miles of Taunton, with a Party of the Rebels of the fame number, and charging them killed 12 of them upon the place, and wounded most of the reft, and then perceiving ano ther Party of the Rebels, they retired. Licutenant Monaux was flot in the Head fo that he cannot live; and three of his Men were wounded; this party of the Rebels were very well Armed, being their belt Men.

We are Informed that the Rebels are between Taunton and Bridgewater. His Majeffics Forces Commanded by the Earl of Fever/ham, are Marching towards them, and we doubt not to have in few days a very good account of them.

Edinburg, June 18, Thu May at Noon, We have an Account this day that the late Earl of Argile, upon the notice he had of the arrival of His Majefties Ships, had refelved to caufe his Ships and Boats to Sail into Lochfyne, but being detained by constary winds, His Majellies Ships the King-Fifter, and Faulcon came up to the Entrance of Lochrowan, where the Rebels Ships lay, by which they were fo difcouraged, that laying afide the defign of Sailing into Lochfyne, they began upon the 19th inflant, to for-tlifie a little Caffie, called Ellengreg, and a Rock that lies near to it in a little Ifland; for fecuring their Ships in Locbrows; which done, humfelf tharched away towards the head of Locbfyste, leaving 150 Men for the Guard of the Ships, having first put his Cannon, Arms, and Ammunition into the Caffle. Upon the 11th, a Party of His Majeflics Forces under the Command of the Marquis of Atbol; confifting of 300 Foot, encountred a Party of the Rebels of 400 Foot and 80 Horse, and defeated them ; fome of the Rebels being Killed upon the place, feveral wounded, and fome of their Horfes and Arms taken; upon which they marched back to Ellengreg, where they continued until the 15th, at which time the Rebels having passed Locblong, marched towards the Lenox in the Shire of Dumbarton.

the fame day His Majeflies Ships came up to the Caffle (where the Rebels Arms and Ammunition fill lay) with a Refolution to batter it, and to deflivey their Ships; but upon the firing of the firfl Gun two Men came off in a Boat with a white Flag, and told them they might fave their labour; for there were none to oppose them, all the Rebels having Fled; whereupon they fent a Boat on Shear, and finding it to be fo, took pofferfion of the Caffle, Ships and Boats, with all the Arms, Ammunition, Cannon, Ge. A particular Account whereof cannot be given at prefent, but what are already found, de amount to 5000 Arms, 500 Barrils of Powder, with Ball and other Stores in proportion, befides the Canmon, fome whereof are mounted, and others funk,

though eafily recoverable. . The Rebels had a defign to Blow up the Powder, but it was prevented. On the 16th they marched by the head of Gairloth towards the Fords of the River Levin, Betwixt Lebblomond, and the Town of Dumbarton. On the 17th in the Morning the Earl of Dumbarton, having an Account of their pating that River, and of their being entred into the Shire of Dumbarton, fent 3 i Troops of Dragoons to prevent their croffing the River Cilde, under the Command of the Lord Charles Mintray their Licutenant Colonel, while the Earl of Dums barton, with the Army under his Command is marching with all dilgence from Glafgor towards the Rebels (who are about 12 miles dillant) to attack them. The Rebels have the River of Cilde on the right hand (guarded by the aforementioned Drageuss, and the Troops of that Country) the Duke of Gordon on their left, and the Marquis of Atbol in their Rear.

An Express from the Marquis of Atbol does inform us, that he met confiderable numbers of the Rebels deferting, not only for fear, but also for hunger, having no fort of Provisions: On the other part; the Noblemen and Gentlemen now in Arms for His Majeflies fervice, thew great zeal and forwardnefs, and when any of them are fent home (their Atteas dance being judged unneceflary) they repine to be deprived of the Honor to serve His Majefly upon this occasion.

We have just now received Letters from the Borders, affuring us, that all is in perfect Peace there, both on the scotch and English file.

Warfare, May 25. The King of Peland has fent orders to the leveral Regiments to march with all the diligence poffible towards Leopol, near which place the general Rendezvous its believed will be appointeda The Turks and Tartars make daily incursions, in othe Ukrain 3 and it's reported, that the Mofcovites have committed divers Hoftilities upon the subj.es of this Crown, and that they are marching in a confiderable Body towards the Frontiers of Lithuania ; Whereupon the King we are told has with the advice of the Senate refolved to fend an Envoy to Molcote to endeavour to prevent a Rupture between the two Nations in this Conjuncture. We have yet no certain account of the Force the Turks will have on this fide this Campagne ; It's faid indeed that they turn their chief firength towards Hungary, and that they will not joyn above 25 or 30000 Men with the Tartars to act again ft. this Crown, but these are repor s that cannot be relyed upon. The Dyet issfill alsembled, but it's believed they will feparate to morrow. They have defired the King, whenever he thinks it necessary, to fummon the Arreirban, as has been heretofore practiled in great and prefling occasions ; and have laid great Penaltics upon fuch Gentlemen as fhall not appear in purfuance of the faid fummons. The Sicur 244-ziewsky Bishop of Warmia is made Vice-Chancellof of Poland; the King having given him the Scal the 19th inftant. The Count de Deneffe Colonet of the Kings Regiment of Guards is made Palatin of Mas riemburg.

Naples; Maj 24. The Popes Gallie's who attlved in this Port the laft week Sailed again the 22d Inflands. pane for Melfind where they joyned those of Tuscany, and Maltha, and then Sailed together to joyn the Venetian Flace. The Gallies of this Kingdom and of Sardinia are arrived herefrom Censu.

Ventee, May 301, Several Veffels that wore senwith Provisions and Ammunition for the fervice of the Fleet, are come back, by which we have an account that the great Convoy with the Troops of Hanouer arrived at Carfu the 29th of the laft Month And that the Popes Gallies and those of Tuscany and 1 Maltha were daily expected there to joyn the Fleet. Me nave no freih newsfrom [ Dalmatia ; buc feveral Companies of Foot have been fent thither this Week The Letters from Constantinople from the Lido. broughtiftigm thence by a Dutch Veffel, lay, That Provisions began to be very fearce in that City, especially Corn; They not being supplyed as they used to he from Alexandria, by realoa their Ships cannot pals without great hazard of falling into the hands of the Christians; to prevent which the Turks were fitting out feyeral Gallics and other light Ships to ferred for Convoys.

Fanice, June 2. The '31 past, being Afcention. day, the Doge, accompained with the Senate, perforshed the accuftomed Geremony of Marrying the Sea 3 And afterwards gave the Senators and the perfons of Quality that were prefent a Magnificent Enterain-The faft Letters from Dalmatia gave an ge-. mant. coupt shat deveral Furkish, Troops which were Marching towards Hungary had been met and defeated by a Warty of Venetians Commanded by the Chevalier de Lence; And that many of them were killed upon the place. That the Holfilities continue beowers ther relainstes and the Tarks; and that the latter having taken an Abbot out of a Monaftry near, the Golf of Prevela had empaled him, for having very much contributed to the resple of the Greeks. We have advite from Configurinopic that the Tunks hav fi ded out we Galliss, puting on board each of them a 100 Janifaries; and that they are defigned to be f mero Varponio.

Fiernes Finese. The 29th of the last month the Imperial Court returned highpriron Neufladt; and the next day the Emperor was prefent at a review of the R. gimenhof Baden, coulding of soor men which embarqued the ult Inflant on the Danube for Hunga er.' OluMonday Ista Council of War was held here, at which the Duke of Lottain and all the ga-acral Officersin Town were prefent; who are now on their departure to the Army. The letters from the Imponial Camp near Newherfel, confirm the Advice we had the last week that the Scrafquice Baffa had ordered the Convoy of Provingits which had, been provided at Fiecia for the helief of Newbeufel to be fant to Buda; near which place we are told there are encamped zoooo Turks. General Heusler has brought his Droops nearer to Newheufal; and we are assured that he will in few days be joyned by the Troops of Auzenburgei The Troops of Bunaria are likwife on their march howards Hungary; and pars, of his - Electoral Highneffes Artillery is already arnived here. The Emperor will have three Armies, in the Field this Summer in Hungary and Croatias hived here. That Commanded by the Dake of Lorrain will be of 40000 men , and the other tworks is or reapo each. Prince Charles of Baden Dourlach who, is to Command the Troops of the Circle of Suebia in the quality of Major General arrived here the full inflant; He expects here to morrow the Infantry of the faid Quale; and the Cavalry towards the end of this week. Yestenday arrived here an Express from Upper Hungary with an account that General Schultz hath taked the Lower Town of Ungmar, but that the Garlion defends the Upper Town, with great obilinacy; and that the Imperialilis have already loft above 300 Men and feveral Officers before the of Bf London. place. It is reported that the Jurk to have now ap,

pointed the general Rendezvous of their Army to bEnear Buda, and that there will be about 60000 Men at it The Emperor has named the Count de Labcounts to go in quality of his Envoy Extraordinary to the Molt Christian King Cardinal. Bonvif the Popes Nuncio at this Court has given 100 theufand Florins towards the Expences of the Blockade of Newbeufal, and hath promifed the Emperor a much greater Sum from the Pope when that place is taken.

Hamburg, June 13. The Marquis de Torcey Envoy Extraordinary, from his Molt Christian Majelly to the King of Denmark, arrived the eighth instant at the Court of Zell, and is in few days expected here in his way to Holftein, where he purpoles to meet the King of Denmark at, his return from Norway. They write from Stockholm that the Marsechal de Koningfmark was gone over to Pomeren, from whence its faid he will go for Hungary to pass the Campagne, there. The Letters from Berlin of the 11th, juliant lay, the Troops which the King of Sweden lends to. the Emperors affiftance were on their march to-, wards Breflaw, and that the Elector of Brandenburgh having been informed that they had paffed within his Territories without his leave, had fent an Officer to enquire into the Truth of it. The Letters from. Warfaw confirm that the Dyct is feparated, having The Letters from. concluded the most important matters that were before them to the Kings fatisfaction. And that his Majefly would very fuddenly take the field.

Hague, June 19. There was yefterday a review at Sciveling of the Regiment of Guards and other Troops quartered he cand at Delf, where they excrcifed in the prefence of the Prince of Orange, and divers perfons of Quality. His Highnefs will part from hence to morrow or next day for Breda. Prince Waldeck is gone from his House of Culembourg for Germany.
