

Cromer.—Protection from the Sea.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the present session, for an Act, for protecting the town and parish of Cromer, in the county of Norfolk, from the further encroachment of the sea, by erecting and maintaining a new jetty or break-water, and sea walls, groins, and other works and defences on the beach and cliffs, in the said parish, with convenient ways, walks, or promenades on or along the same, and regulating the use thereof; and also for putting under the controul and management of the Commissioners to be appointed by such Act, the future maintenance of the existing sea walls, groins, and other works and defences, situate in the said parish; with powers to alter, rebuild, and, from time to time, extend and improve the same; and to make and maintain proper approaches to all or any of such works, with convenient ways, walks, or promenades on or along the same, and to regulate the use thereof.

And it is also intended by the said Act, to obtain powers for the compulsory purchase of houses, lands, tenements, and hereditaments requisite for the purposes aforesaid, and to vary or extinguish all rights and privileges in any manner connected therewith.

And it is also intended by the said Act, to obtain powers for levying rates or assessments on the owners of all houses, buildings, curtilages, and small pieces of land in the parish of Cromer, for raising money for defraying the expences of the several works aforesaid, and of obtaining and passing the Act, and carrying the same into execution; and for borrowing money on the credit of such rates or assessments.

And notice is also hereby given, that duplicate plans of the said intended jetty and approaches, together with books of reference thereto, will be deposited, for public inspection, at the office of the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Norfolk, at Aylsham, on or before the twenty-eighth day of February instant; and that, on or before the same day, a copy of such plan and book of reference will be deposited with the parish clerk of the said parish of Cromer, at his place of abode, in Cromer; and it is also intended by the said Act, to obtain powers to deviate to an extent not exceeding two hundred yards from the site marked on the said plans, as the site of such jetty and approaches.
