

est Execution. The Spanish Gallies 22 in number Sailed the 14 Instant from *Porto Longone* for *Naples*. This Morning the two Gallies of this State returned hither from *Marseilles*; The *Doge* Landed at *Voltri* ten miles from hence, and will come privately hither this night.

*Venice, June 9.* The 3d Instant arrived here an Express from *Corfu*, with an account that Captain General *Morosini* was gone to *Dragonestre* to expect there the Auxilliary Gallies: That Prince *Maximilian* had joynd the said General with the Troops of *Hanover*; and that four Gallies of *Malta* had taken a great Ship belonging to *Tripoli* in which were 200 Turks who were made slaves. The last week Signior *Francisco Rotta* was received into the Body of the Nobility, he paying 100 thousand Ducats. And the 4th Instant Signior *Carlo Contarini* took possession of the Dignity of Procurator of *St. Mark*.

*Warsaw, June 1.* The Dyet is at last happily concluded, having settled the Contributions, which are to be raised by the several Provinces for the War against the Turks, and regulated several other matters to the Kings satisfaction. The Troops are on their march to the general Rendezvous near *Leopol*, where the King intends to be in person about the middle of this month. The King and Queen are gone to *Vilanova*, from whence his Majesty is expected back to morrow to be present at a great Council that will be held here.

*Vienna, June 10.* The 7th Instant arrived here 4000 men raised by the Elector of *Bavaria* to recruit his Troops which are now in *Hungary*; and two Regiments of Horse raised for his Electoral Highnesss Service at *Hambourgh* and other places in *Germany* are daily expected. The Horses for the Artillery and Baggage are come from *Bubemia*, and will be sent for *Hungary* in a day or two; The great Cannon and 28 Mortar Pieces with several thousand Bombs and Grenado-shells have been already sent by Water to *Raab*. The Duke of *Lorraine* who intended to have parted from hence for *Hungary* the 6th Instant hath been obliged by some important affairs to defer his Journey for some days. The Duke de *Croy* is to Command the Foot under his Highness, in quality of Lieutenant General. The Count de *Esterhass* Palatine of *Hungary* is arrived here to receive the Emperors directions concerning the making provision for the subsistence of the Troops of that Kingdom. Yesterday a tryal was made in the Plain near *Ebersdorf* of the Cannon, Mortars Bombs, and Carcasses invented by the Spanish Ingenier, which succeeded all to the great satisfaction of the Emperor, the Duke of *Lorraine*, and a great many persons of the first quality who were present. We have an account from the Imperial Camp near *Newbusefel*;

That besides the 60 Janisaries of whom we have already made mention, they have taken 30 deserters more, who confirm the ill condition that place is in; and that the Garrison is reduced to about 1200 men, but that the *Bassa* continues to encourage them with assurances of speedy relief. The Troops of *Lunenburgh* encamped the 5th Instant in the Neighbourhood of *Tirnaw*, and the next day between *Schinda* and *Schella* on this side the *Waag*, from whence they would march the 7th or 8th to join Colonel *Hensler*. The Letters from Upper *Hungary* tell us that Count *Teckley*, having drawn together all the Force he could, marched to the relief of *Ungwar*, dividing his Troops into three Bodies, who marched different ways; Whereupon General *Schultz* sent out a great detachment, who met and defeated one of these Bodies and took three Standards; but that notwithstanding this Success General *Schultz* hath been obliged by the obstinate defence of the Besieged, and the discovery of the correspondence he had with some persons in the place to raise the Siege, in which he hath lost several Officers, and a considerable number

of his men. They write from *Gran* that there are 20000 Turks encamped in the Neighbourhood of *Buda*; that they work without intermission on the Fortifications of that place; And that their Parties make incursions as far as *Gran*.

*Vienna, June 14.* The Duke of *Lorraine* parted from hence the 11th Instant for *Hungary*, having full power to act with the Imperial Forces this Campagne, as he shall judge most for the Emperors Service. The 4000 Recruits for the Troops of *Bavaria* who arrived here the 7th Instant continued their march on monday last for *Hungary*: And the same day 7 great Boats were sent from hence with Provisions for the Troops of *Lunenburgh*, who have joynd the Imperial Forces Encamped near *Newbusefel*. The news of General *Schultz* having raised the Siege of *Ungwar* is confirmed. We have advice that 10000 Turks have passed the Bridge of *Esecke*, and that they are marching to joyn the Body encamped near *Buda*; And that the Turks give out they will relieve *Newbusefel* whatever it cost.

*Hague, June 30.* We have an account of the arrival of 9 Ships from the *East-Indies*; four for the account of the Chamber of *Amsterdam*, two for the Chamber of *Zealand*, one for the Chamber at *Delft*, one for *Hooorn*, and one for *Enckbuisen*. Of these, five came from *Batavia* the 28th of *November* last, three on the 10th of *January* from *Ceylon*, and on the 31. of *December* from *Bengale*. The *Moscovite* Ambassadors that were lately in *France* are arrived at *Rotterdam* in their return home.

*Whitehal, June 23.* The Marquis *Augustin de Paltaucini*, Envoy Extraordinary from the Republick of *Genova*, hath had Audience of her Majesty, of the Queen Dowager, and of his Royal Highness Prince *George of Denmark*, being conducted by Sir *Charles Cotterel* Master of the Ceremonies.
