eff Execution. The Spanish Galleys 22 in number Sailed the 14 Inflant from Porto Longone for Naples. This Morning the two Galleys of this State returned hither from Marfeilles'; The Doge Landed at Voltri tenm.les from hence, and will come privately hither this night.

Venice, June 9. The 3d Inftant arrived here an Express from Corfu, with an account that Captain General Morofini was gone to Dragomefire to expect there the Auxilliary Galleys : That Prince Maximi-Han had joyned the faid General with the Troops of Hanouer; and that four Galleys of Maltha had taken a great Ship belonging to Tripoli in which were soo Turks who were made flaves. The laft week Signior Francifeo Rosta was received into the Body of the Nobility, he paying 100 thouland Duca's. And the 4th Inftant Signior Carlo Contarini took poficiion of the Dignity of Procurator of St. Mark.

Warfaw, June 1. The Dyct is at laft happily concluded, having fetled the Contributions, which are to be raifed by the feveral Provinces for the War againfi the Turks, and regulated feveral oth r matters to the Kings fatisfaction. The Troops are on their march to the general Rendezvous near Leopal, where the King intends to be in perfon about the middle of this month. The King and Queen are gone to Villanous, from whence his Majeliy is expected back to morrow to be prefent at a great Councal that will be held here.

The 7th Inftant arrived here Vienna, June 10. 4000 men railed by the Elector of Bavaria to ic-ruit his Troops which are now in Hungary; and two Re-ginents of Horie railed for his Electoral Highneff. sService at Hamburgh and other places in Germany are dayly expected. The Horles for the Artiliery and Biggage are come from Bubemia, and will be fent for Hungary in a day or two; The great Cannon and 18 Mortar Pieces with feveral thouland Bombs and Grenado-fheils have been already fent by Water to The Duke of Lorrain who intended to have Rasb. parted from hence for Hungary the 6th Instant hath been obliged by fome important affairs to defer his The Duke de Croy is to lourney for fome days. Command the Luot under his Highnels, in quality of Lieutenant General. The Count de Esterbass Palahin of Hungary is arrived here to receive the Em-perors directions concerning the making provision for the sublishence of the Troops of that Kingdom. Of these, five came from Batzvia the 28th of November last, three on the 10th of Fanuary from Ceylon, and on the 31. of December from Bengale. The Molcovite Amballadors that were lately in France are arrived at Rotuerdam in their return home.
