

CONTRACTS FOR COALS FOR HER MAJESTY'S MAIL STEAM PACKETS, &c.

for the service of Her Majesty's Mail Steam Packets, viz.

Dover, -	-	3300 tons.
Holyhead, -	-	4200 tons.
Kingstown, -	-	1000 tons, but to be increased to 1500, if necessary.

To be delivered within twelve months from the 1st of May next, in equal monthly proportions.

And also for supplying at Pembroke, Waterford, Port Patrick; and Donaghadee, for the like service, during the said period of twelve months, all such quantities of Coals as shall, from time to time, be demanded.

The Coals for Donaghadee to be supplied by the contractor for Port Patrick; and the contractors for Pembroke and Waterford will also be required to supply such quantities of Coals as may be demanded for the service of any other of Her Majesty's steam vessels, stationed at or visiting those ports, during the continuance of the contracts.
