NOTICE is hereby given, that the carriages coming to Her Majesty's Drawing-Room, on Tuesday the 27th of May, are to fall into the line at the top of St. James's-street, come down the left hand side, and enter at the iron gate nearest to the Palace, set down at the Arcade, return by the iron gate nearest to Marlborough-house, and pass through Pall-mall into St. James's-square, by George-street. When called, they are to pass from St. James's-square, by Charles-street, into Regent-street, Jermyn-street, come down St. James's-street as before, take up, and go away through Pall-mall.

No hackney carriages will be permitted to come within the gates.

For all persons having the privilege of the *entrée*, tickets will be delivered at the Board of Green Cloth, on Friday next, between the hours of eleven and three o'clock; their carriages are to enter the gate at Constitution-hill, proceed down St. James's-park, through Stable-yard, into the Ambassadors'-court, set down, and go out into Cleveland-row. The carriages of the Ambassadors, Foreign Ministers, Cabinet Ministers, and Great Officers of State may afterwards wait in the Ambassadors'-court, and those of all other persons having the *entrée* may wait in Stable-yard or St. James's-park till called; they are then to take up in the same order as they had set down, and pass away up the left hand side of St. James's-street.

No carriage will be admitted with company a second time with the same ticket, to prevent which, it must be produced at Constitution-hill-gate, and Stable-yard-gate also, where a corner of it will be torn off by the Marshalmen in attendance; and no person can be allowed the privilege of the *entrée* by any other approach to the Palace than the gates last mentioned.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-second day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for augmenting the income of the archdeaconry of Bedford.

"Whereas by the said recited Act it is enacted, that any archdeaconry may, subject to the consent of the bishop, be endowed, amongst other modes, by augmentation out of the common fund in the said Act mentioned, but not so as to raise the average annual income thereof to an amount exceeding two hundred pounds; provided that no archdeacon shall be entitled to hold any endowment, or augmentation or other emolument, as such archdeacon, under the provisions of the same Act, unless resident for the space of eight months in every year within the diocese in which his archdeaconry shall be situate, or as to any archdeacon then existing within the diocese in which his archdeaconry was situate before the passing of the said Act, but subject to the same provisions as to licence for non-residence as are enacted with respect to incumbents of benefices by the Act relating to pluralities and the residence of the clergy, in the same Act mentioned:

"And whereas the said archdeaconry of Bed-

ford has no fixed endowment, and the average annual income thereof arising from fees and other emoluments does not exceed the sum of fifty pounds:

"And whereas the Venerable Henry Tattam was, on the twelfth day of March last, appointed, and now is Archdeacon of Bedford:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Thomas Bishop of Ely, testified by his having signed and sealed this scheme, that the said archdeaconry of Bedford shall be endowed in manner herein-after mentioned, that is to say, that there shall be paid by us, to the said Venerable Henry Tattam, Archdeacon of Bedford, and to his successors in the said archdeaconry, so long as they shall respectively hold the same, and shall duly reside in the diocese in which the same is or shall be situate, the annual sum of one hundred and fifty pounds, on the first day of January in every year; and every such whole yearly payment shall be made only on production to us of a certificate, under the hand of the bishop for the time being of the diocese in which the said archdeaconry is situate, that such archdeacon has duly resided during the preceding year, and a proportionate part of the first such yearly payment, calculated from the day of the date of his appointment to the first day of January next, shall, on such first day of January next, be paid to such archdeacon; and that whenever a vacancy in the said archdeaconry shall happen on any other day than the first day of January, the then next yearly payment shall be duly apportioned and paid between and to the archdeacon making the vacancy, or his representatives, and the archdeacon succeeding to the archdeaconry so becoming vacant.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas notice of the said scheme has been duly given to the said Archdeacon of Bedford, and no objection has been made thereto:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Ely.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled "An Act for carrying into effect the reports of the Commissioners appointed to consider the state of the Established Church in England and Wales, with reference to ecclesiastical duties and revenues, so far as they relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and patronage," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for revising the fixed annual payment charged upon the see of Ely.

"Whereas, under the provisions of the said recited Act, we prepared, and laid before His late Majesty in Council, a scheme, bearing date the twelfth day of April one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, for charging upon the Bishops of Ely the fixed annual payment to us of two thousand five hundred pounds towards the augmentation of the incomes of the smaller bishopricks, so as to leave to the Bishop of Ely the average annual income of five thousand five hundred pounds fixed by the said recited Act, and the said scheme was ratified by an Order of His said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the nineteenth day of the same month of April; and such Order was duly registered and gazetted :-

"And whereas, in pursuance of the further provisions of the said recited Act, we did, at the expiration of the first seven years, reckoning from the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, that is to say, after the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, obtain a new return of the revenues of the said see of Ely; and it appears upon such return, that, in order to preserve as nearly as may be to the Bishop of Ely an amount of income equivalent to that which was determined in the first instance to be suitable to the circumstances of his bishoprick, the fixed annual payment aforesaid ought to be raised to the sum of three thousand five hundred pounds :

"And whereas the said see of Ely became vacant on the twentieth day of March last, and a new bishop thereof has not yet been consecrated :

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that there shall be paid to us by the Bishop of Ely for the time being, instead of the fixed annual sum of two thousand five hundred pounds hereinbefore mentioned, the fixed annual sum of three thousand five hundred pounds, by equal half-yearly payments, on the twentieth day of March and the twentieth day of September in each year; and that the first such half-yearly payment shall be made to us on the twentieth day of September next; and that whenever a vacancy of the said see of Ely shall happen on any other day than the half-yearly day of payment so calculated as aforesaid, then the next half-yearly payment shall be duly apportioned between and paid by the bishop making the vacancy, or his representative, and the bishop succeeding to the said see.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing further measures relating to the said see of Ely, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, and of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Ely.

To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty.

Address of the Right Honourable the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of Dublin.

*May it please your Majesty,*

RUMOURS having reached us that your Majesty has been graciously pleased to express your royal will to visit your Irish subjects in the approaching autumn, we seize, with joy, the opportunity thus afforded us of again approaching your Majesty to reiterate our devoted attachment and loyalty to your Majesty's Person and Throne.

We assure your Majesty, that the mere rumour of your intention has filled every Irish heart with gladness, and we receive it as an evidence of the tender solicitude for the welfare of Ireland, which we know actuates your Majesty.

Warmly as your Majesty has been greeted in your royal visits to other portions of your

dominions, we pledge ourselves that your Irish subjects shall not be exceeded in the true and hearty welcome which, with united voice, they shall hail the landing of that Monarch on their shores, who, by her example in every relation of life (in the midst of a Court), has added new lustre to the diadem which she wears for the good of a faithful people.

May we indulge the hope, that your Majesty will fulfil your gracious intention to visit Ireland, and there receive, in person, the homage of your loyal and devoted Irish subjects.

An Act to amend the Acts relating to the docks and harbour of Liverpool.

An Act to alter the provisions of an Act for lighting with gas the town of Bradford, and the neighbourhood thereof, within the parish of Bradford, in the west riding of the county of York.

An Act for abolishing the Sunday toll authorized by an Act, passed in the sixth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the
