AT the Court at *Buckingham-Palace*, the 30th day of *June* 1845,

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes;" and of another Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to explain and amend an Act for making better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, in the words following, that is to say :

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes;" and of another Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to explain and amend an Act for making better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for altering the bounds of the district of Etruria, in the county of Stafford and diocese of Lichfield.

"Whereas it is by the secondly-recited Act enacted, that it shall be lawful, by the authority provided in the first-recited Act, at any time or times within twelve months after the date of the licence of the minister first licenced to any separate district, constituted under the provisions of the same Act, to alter the bounds of such district, although any alteration be not required

with a view to the constituting of another separate district; provided always, that the scheme for making any such alteration shall be subject to all the provisions relating to schemes for constituting separate districts under the said first-recited Act; and that any portion of any such separate district which, by any such alteration as aforesaid, shall become detached or excluded therefrom, shall, to all intents and purposes, again belong to and form part of the parish, chapelry, or district out of which such portion was taken, upon such separate district being originally constituted, or to and of any new district, as shall be determined by the like authority :

"And whereas the said district of Etruria was duly constituted out of the parish of Shelton, in the said county of Stafford and diocese of Lichfield, under the provisions of the said first-recited Act, by a scheme prepared by us, and ratified by an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the twenty-third day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, and since duly gazetted :

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and appears to us to be expedient, that the bounds of such district should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned :

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Bishop of Lichfield, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that the bounds of the said district of Etruria shall be altered as follows; that is to say, instead of the imaginary line described in the schedule to the scheme hereinbefore mentioned, and forming the southern, south eastern, and eastern boundary thereof, such district shall be bounded, on the south eastern side thereof, by an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked *a* on the map or plan hereunto annexed) in the middle of the turnpike road leading from Newcastle to Shelton, where such road crosses Fowlea-brook, and thence extending towards the north east, along the middle of such

road, and of Russel-street, in the town of Shelton, to a point (marked *b* as aforesaid) in the middle of Oldfield-lane; and on the eastern side thereof, by an imaginary line extending towards the north west, from such last-mentioned point, along the middle of the said lane, as far as Boothen-brook; and thence northward, along the middle of such last-mentioned brook, as far as the boundary of the parish of Burslem, in the said county and diocese.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that the portion of the said district which, by reason of the alteration hereinbefore recommended and proposed, shall become and be detached or excluded therefrom, shall, to all intents and purposes, again belong to and form part of the said parish of Shelton.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron of the church of the parish out of which the district, the bounds of which are therein recommended to be altered, has been taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Acts; and such incumbent has consented to the said scheme; and one calendar month has expired since the draft thereof was so transmitted to the said patron :

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Lichfield.
