AT the Court at *Buckingham-Palace*, the 30th day of *June* 1845,

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, in the words following, that is to say :

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of

the district of Saint James, in the parish of Bermondsey, in the county of Surrey, and in the diocese of Winchester.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of

any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the meantime, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council, that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as hereinafter provided :

“ And whereas the said district of Saint James, in the said parish of Bermondsey, is of great extent, and contains a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of such district hereinafter-mentioned and described, such part not at present containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth :

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Richard Bishop of Winchester, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said district of Saint James, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth in

the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—shall be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, “ The District of Christ Church, Bermondsey.”

“ And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures

relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ SCHEDULE.

“ The district of CHRIST CHURCH, BERMONDSEY, being—

“ All that part of the district of Saint James, in the parish of Bermondsey, in the county of Surrey, and in the diocese of Winchester, bounded as follows; that is to say, on the north, by the river Thames; on the east and south east, by an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked *a* on the map or plan hereunto annexed) on the southern bank of the said river at East-lane-stairs, and opposite to the middle of East-lane; and thence extending southward, along the middle of such lane, as far as the middle of Neckinger-road; and thence towards the south west, along the middle of such road, as far as the boundary of the parochial district of Saint Mary Magdalene, Bermondsey, in the same county and diocese; and on the west, by such last-mentioned district and the parish of Saint John, Horsleydown, in the same county and diocese.”

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbents and to the patrons of the church of the parish and of the church or chapel of the district out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, and one calendar month has expired since such draft was so transmitted, and no objections have been made thereto:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Winchester.

“ Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any

“ And whereas the said parishes of Ryton and Winlaton are, respectively, of great extent, and contain a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendance therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of each of such parishes hereinafter mentioned and described, neither of which parts at present contains within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth :

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Bishop of Durham, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Ryton, and also all that part of the said parish of Winlaton, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all which parts, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also

annexed,—shall be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, “ The District of Saint Cuthbert, Stella.”

“ And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from

recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ SCHEDULE.

“ The district of SAINT CUTHBERT, STELLA, being—

“ All that part of the parish of Ryton, in the county and diocese of Durham, comprised within the township of Stella, and all that part of the township of Winlaton, in the parish of Winlaton, in the same county and diocese, situate on the northern side of an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked *a* on the map or plan herewith) at the southern angle of the said township of Stella, near Haggerston's mill; and thence extending eastward, and partly towards the north east, along the middle of the Mill-lane, and of Nipper's Wood-lane, and Winlaton West-lane, as far as the middle of the public road leading from Winlaton to Blydon (marked *b* as aforesaid); and thence towards the north east, along the middle of such last-mentioned road, as far as the middle of the Blydon main colliery waggon way (marked *c* as aforesaid); and thence in the same direction, along the middle of such waggon way, as far as the middle of the Hexham south turnpike road (marked *d* as aforesaid); and thence towards the south east, along the middle of such last-mentioned road, to a point (marked *e* as aforesaid) opposite to the angle formed by the boundary wall of Axwell-park, near a certain house or cottage, now occupied by colliery workmen in the employ of George Hepple Ramsay, Esquire, and being the most northern of a group sometimes known by the name of the “ Old Engine Cottages;” and thence first towards the south west, along such boundary wall, to the lodge at the eastern angle of the said park, near the river Derwent (marked *f* as aforesaid); and thence eastward in a straight line with the southern corner of the Derwent-bridge toll bar-house, across the said river, as far as the middle of the Hexham south turnpike road aforesaid (marked *g* as aforesaid); and thence towards the south east, along the middle of such last-mentioned road, as far as the ancient boundary between the said parish of Winlaton and the parish of Whickham, in the said county and diocese (marked *h* as aforesaid).”

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbents and to the patron of the churches of the parishes out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and such incumbents and patron have respectively consented to the said scheme :

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Durham.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentlemen Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read*; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to repeal the several laws relating to the customs.

An Act for the management of the customs.

An Act for the general regulation of the customs.

An Act for the prevention of smuggling.

An Act for the encouragement of British shipping and navigation.

An Act for the registering of British vessels.

An Act for granting duties of customs.

An Act for the warehousing of goods.

An Act to grant certain bounties and allowances of customs.

An Act to regulate the trade of British possessions abroad.

An Act for the regulating the trade of the isle of Man.

An Act to increase the stamp duty on licences to appraisers; to reduce the stamp duties on registry searches in Ireland; to amend the law relating to the duties on legacies; and also to amend an Act of the last session of Parliament for regulating the issue of bank notes in England.

An Act to provide for the payment of compensation allowances to certain persons connected with the courts of law in England, for loss of fees and emoluments.

An Act to amend the law of real property.

An Act to defray, until the first day of August one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, the charge of the pay, clothing, and contingent and other expences of the disembodied militia, in Great Britain and Ireland; to grant allowances in certain cases to subaltern officers, adjutants, paymasters, quartermasters, surgeons, assistant-surgeons, surgeons' mates, and serjeant-majors of the militia; and to authorise the employment of the non-commissioned officers.

An Act to amend the law respecting testamentary dispositions of property in the public funds, and to authorise the payment of dividends on letters of attorney, in certain cases.

An Act to continue, until the thirty-first day of August one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, and to the end of the next session of Parliament, and to amend an Act, of the fifth and sixth years of Her present Majesty, for permitting wheat to be delivered from the warehouse or the vessel, duty free, upon the previous substitution of an equivalent quantity of flour or biscuit in the warehouse.

An Act for the regulation of the care and treatment of lunatics.

An Act to make further regulations respecting the tickets of work to be delivered to persons employed in the manufactory of hosiery, in certain cases.

An Act to continue, until the fifth day of July one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, the Acts for regulating the vend and delivery of coals in London and Westminster, and in certain parts of the adjacent counties; and to alter and amend the said Acts.

An Act to continue, until the first day of October one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, and to the end of the then session of Parliament, the exemption of inhabitants of parishes, townships, and villages from liability to be rated as such, in respect of stock in trade or other property, to the relief of the poor.

An Act for facilitating the winding up the affairs of joint stock companies, in Ireland, unable to meet their pecuniary engagements.

An Act to restrict the powers of selling or leasing railways contained in certain Acts of Parliament relating to such railways.

An Act to empower the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Woods to appropriate to building purposes the area of Darby-court, in the parish of Saint James, Westminster.

An Act to amend an Act, of the tenth year of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, for consolidating and amending the laws relating to the management and improvement of His Majesty's woods, forests, parks, and chases; and for other purposes relating to the said land revenue.

An Act to exempt Van Diemen's Land from the provisions of an Act, intitled "An Act for regulating the sale of waste land belonging to the Crown in the Australian colonies."

An Act for the amendment and better administration of the laws relating to the relief of the poor in Scotland.

An Act for regulating the criminal jurisdiction of assistant barristers as to certain counties of cities and counties of towns in Ireland.

An Act to amend an Act of the last session, for consolidating and amending the laws for the regulation of grand jury presentments in the county of Dublin.

An Act to rectify a mistake in an Act of the present session, relating to the Leeds and Bradford Railway.

An Act for making a railway to be called "the Glasgow Junction Railway," with branches.

An Act to enable the Birmingham and Gloucester Railway Company to make extension lines at Gloucester, a branch at Stoke Prior, and a junction with the Midland Railway at Aston juxta Birmingham.

An Act for making a railway from Oxford to Worcester and Wolverhampton.

An Act to amend the Acts relating to the London and South Western Railway, and to authorize the London and South Western Railway Company to buy, and the Guildford Junction Railway Company to sell, the Guildford Junction Railway.

An Act to enable the South Eastern Railway Company to widen certain parts of the London and Greenwich Railway.

An Act for making a railway from Londonderry to Coleraine, with a branch to Newtown Limavady.

An Act for making a railway from the city of Oxford to the town of Rugby.

An Act for making a railway from the Midland Railway, in the parish of Sawley, in the county of Derby, to the parish of Alfreton, in the same county, together with several branch railways communicating therewith, to be called "the Erewash Valley Railway."

An Act for making a railway to be called "the South Wales Railway."

An Act for making a railway from Monmouth to Hereford, with branches therefrom to Westbury, and to join the Forest of Dean Railway.

An Act for making a railway from Glasgow to Crofthead, near the town or village of Neilston, to be called "the Glasgow, Barrhead, and Neilston Direct Railway."

An Act to amend the Acts for regulating the pipe water of the city of Dublin, and to enable the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of the city of Dublin to extend the supply of pipe water to the several parishes, or portion of parishes, situate in the city and county of Dublin, and adjoining to the borough of the said city of Dublin, but outside the boundary thereof.

An Act for lighting, draining, cleansing, and improving the hamlets or liberties of Duddeston and Nechells, in the parish of Aston, near Birmingham, in the county of Warwick.

An Act for more effectually maintaining, improving, and repairing the road leading from the city of Glasgow to Yoker-bridge, and certain roads communicating therewith.

And three private Acts.

And also to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms.
