THE Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland do hereby give notice, that, on Friday the 22d instant, at one o'clock, they will be ready to treat with such persons as may be willing to contract for supplying Her Majesty's several Dock-yards with

11,000 Loads of African Timber; half to be delivered within the year 1846, and the remainder within the year 1847.
