THE Right Honourable Sir James Graham, Bart has received a dispatch from the Earl of Aberdeen, K. T. dated Gotha, the 1st of September 1845.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to amend the law respecting the " office of county coroner," it is enacted, that, when and as often as it shall seem expedient to the justices of any county that such county should be divided into two or more districts, for the purposes of that Act, or that any alteration should be made of any division theretofore made under that Act, it should be lawful for the said justices, in general or quarter sessions assembled, to resolve that a petition should be presented to Her Majesty, praying, that such division or alteration be made, and thereupon to adjourn the further consideration of such petition until notice thereof should be given to the coroner or coroners of such county as thereinafter provided; and it is thereby further enacted, that the clerk of the peace should give notice of any such resolution to every coroner for

such county, and of the time when the petition would be taken by the said justices into con-sideration, and the justices should confer with every such coroner who should attend the meeting of the justices for that purpose, touching such petition, having due regard to the size and nature of each proposed district, the number of the in-habitants, the nature of their employment, and such other circumstances as should appear to the justices fit to be considered in carrying into execution the provisions of that Act; and such petition, with a description of the several proposed districts, and of the boundaries thereof, with the reasons upon which the petition is founded, should be certified to Her Majesty, under the hands and seals of two or more of the justices present when such petition should be agreed to, and the clerk of the peace for such county should forthwith give or send a true copy of such petition, certified under his hand, to every coroner for such county; and it is further enacted, that it should be lawful for Her Majesty, if she should think fit, with the advice of Her Privy Council, after taking into consideration any such petition which might be presented to Her by any coroner of the same county, concerning such proposed division or alteration, or whenever it should seem fit to Her Majesty, to direct the issue of a writ de coronatore eligendo, for the purpose of authorising the election of an additional coroner above the number of those who had been theretofore customarily elected in such county, to order that such county should be divided into such and so many districts, for the purposes of that Act, as to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, should seem expedient, and to give a name to each of such districts, and to determine at what place within such district the court for the election of coroner for such district should be holden, as thereinafter provided; and every such Order should be published in the London Gazette:

And whereas the justices of the peace for the county of Lincoln, at a court of gaol sessions for

the said county of Lincoln, held on the twenty-sixth day of December one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, did resolve, that a humble petition should be presented to Her Majesty, praying for such division or alteration as thereinafter mentioned, and did adjourn the further consideration thereof to a court of gaol sessions for the three divisions of Lindsey, Kesteven, and Holland, in the county of Lincoln aforesaid, held at the Castle of Lincoln, in and for the said county, the eleventh day of March one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, due notice thereof having been given to the several coroners of the said county, and four of the justices attending such adjourned sessions did thereby certify, under their hands and seals, that such petition was agreed to:

And the said justices further certified and declared, that, at the aforesaid adjourned court of gaol sessions for the said county of Lincoln, due notice having been in the mean time given to the several coroners for the said county as required by the said Act, of the said resolution, passed at the said December sessions, and of the time when the said petition would be taken by the justices into consideration; and the said justices then

present having conferred with such of the several coroners as then attended that adjourned session for that purpose touching such petition, having due regard to the size and nature of each proposed district, the number of the inhabitants and the nature of their employments and such other circumstances as appeared to them fit to be considered in carrying into execution the provisions of the said Act; and the said justices having carefully examined the lists of the several proposed districts, and made such alterations therein as appeared to them to be necessary, it was resolved and ordered by the adjourned court of gaol sessions aforesaid, and by the justices then present, that the districts as then corrected be confirmed, and that the division of the county of Lincoln into seven districts was thereby agreed to:

And the said justices further certified, for the reasons set forth in the said petition, that they approved of the proposed division; and they further certified that descriptions of the several proposed districts, and of the boundaries thereof, were fully set forth in the schedule hereunder written:

And that each of the said districts is to include any extra-parochial or other place which may lie within the circuit of the parishes and places hereinafter particularly mentioned, as comprised in such district, although such extra-parochial or other place may not be therein specifically mentioned or referred to:

And whereas the said justices have since presented their petition to Her Majesty, representing, "That, in pursuance of the Act, made and passed in the session held in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An

"Act to amend the law respecting the office of county coroner," the said justices thinking it

divided into seven districts for the purposes of the said Act, at the court of gaol sessions for the said county of Lincoln, resolved, that this said humble petition should be presented to Her Majesty, praying, that such division may be made, and they had accordingly, in pursuance of the said Act. adjourned the further consideration of the said petition to the next gaol sessions for the said county of Lincoln, which would be held, by adjournment, on Tuesday in the next March assize week, and of which adjournment due notice would be given to the several coroners for the said county, as directed by the said Act:

"That the county of Lincoln is one of the most expedient, that the county of Lincoln should be important agricultural districts in the kingdom, and is of great extent and population, being upwards of seventy-seven miles in length from north to south, and from east to west, varying in distance, from thirty-five to forty-eight miles; that it contains twenty-nine hundreds, the old city of Lincoln, the four boroughs of Boston, Grimsby, Grantham, and Stamford, thirty-one market towns, and eight hundred and ninety parishes, extra-parochial places, chapelries, and hamlets; that the area of the county is two thousand six hundred and eleven square statute miles; and that it consequently contains one million six hundred and seventy-one thousand and forty acres of land; and that, according to the last census taken in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, the population of the whole county then amounted to three hundred and sixty-two thousand six hundred and two:

"That from time immemorial there have been seven coroners appointed for and acting in the said county of Lincoln, and they have usually resided, one in or near the city of Lincoln, one in or near the town of Louth, one in or near the town of Caistor, one in or near the town of Kirton in Lindsey, one in or near the borough of Boston, one in or near the town of Spalding, and one in or near the borough of Grantham; but that it did not appear to the said justices that the said county has hitherto been customarily divided into distinct districts, for the purpose of holding inquests, during the space of seven years before the passing of the said Act, although usage had in most cases formed convenient boundaries of districts in which the coroners have generally acted; and that, with a few exceptions, it is the opinion of the said justices that the same might be now advantageously and conveniently confirmed; and as it appeared, from the last registers of persons entitled to vote in the election of Knights of the Shire to serve in Parliament for the division of Lindsey, in the said county, and also for the division of Kesteven and Holland, that there are now not less than twenty thousand seven hundred and twenty names of persons on those registers, of whom more than one half are freeholders of the county, and would now have a right of voting in the election of a coroner on any one vacancy taking place, and as great inconvenience and expence would necessarily thereby result, as well to the candidates as the electors, it is obvious that the provisions of the said Act might be very beneficially carried out in the county of

"And, therefore, praying Her Majesty, that the said petition might be taken into Her royal consideration, and that the county of Lincoln might be divided into seven districts for the purposes of the said Act."

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, having taken the said petition into consideration, doth, pursuant to the said Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her reign, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, declare, order, and direct, that such county should be divided into seven districts for the purposes of the said Act, to be called by the several and respective names following, that is to say, No. 1, to be called "the Lincoln District,"

to contain all the places appropriated to that district in the before written schedule; No. 2, to be called "the Kirton District," to contain all the places appropriated to that district in the aforesaid schedule; No. 3, to be called "the Caistor District," to contain all the places appropriated to that district in the aforesaid schedule; No. 4, to be called "the Louth District," to contain all the places appropriated to that district in the aforesaid schedule; No. 5, to be called "the Boston District," to contain all the places appropriated to that district in the aforesaid schedule; No. 6, to be called "the Grantham District," to contain all the places appropriated to that district in the aforesaid schedule; and No. 7, to be called "the Spalding District," to contain all the places appropriated to that district in the aforesaid schedule; and No. 7, to be called "the Spalding District," to contain all the places appropriated to that district in the aforesaid schedule:
