prorogued to Thursday the second day of October
next, be further prorogued to Thursday the
twenty-seventh day of November next.

The **QUEEN's** Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the seventh
and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign, in-
titled "An Act to amend the laws respecting the
"office of county coroner," it is enacted, that,
when and as often as it shall seem expedient to the
justices of any county that such county should be
divided into two or more districts, for the purposes

of that Act, or that any alteration should be made
of any division theretofore made under that Act,
it should be lawful for the said justices, in general
or quarter sessions assembled, to resolve that a
petition should be presented to Her Majesty,
praying, that such division or alteration be made,
and thereupon to adjourn the further consideration
of such petition until notice thereof should be
given to the coroner or coroners of such county as
thereinafter provided; and it is thereby further
enacted, that the clerk of the peace should give
notice of any such resolution to every coroner for
such county, and of the time when the petition
would be taken by the said justices into con-
sideration, and the justices should confer with
every such coroner who should attend the meeting
of the justices for that purpose, touching such
petition, having due regard to the size and nature
of each proposed district, the number of in-
habitants, the nature of their employments, and
such other circumstances as should appear to the
justices fit to be considered in carrying into execu-
tion the provisions of that Act; and such petition,
with a description of the several proposed districts,
and of the boundaries thereof, with the reasons
upon which the petition is founded, should be
certified to Her Majesty, under the hands and
seals of two or more of the justices present when
such petition should be agreed to, and the clerk of
the peace for such county should forthwith give
or send a true copy of such petition, certified
under his hand, to every coroner for such county;
and it is further enacted, that it should be lawful
for Her Majesty, if she should think fit, with the
advice of Her Privy Council, after taking into

Consideration any such petition which might be presented to Her by any coroner of the same county, concerning such proposed division or alteration, or whenever it should seem fit to Her Majesty, to direct the issue of a writ *de coronatore eligendo*, for the purpose of authorising the election of an additional coroner above the number of those who had been theretofore customarily elected in such county, to order that such county should be divided into such and so many districts, for the purposes of that Act, as to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, should seem expedient, and to give a name to each of such districts, and to determine at what place within such district the court for the election of coroner for such district should be holden, as hereinafter provided; and every such Order should be published in the London Gazette :

And whereas the justices for the county of Somerset, in general or quarter session assembled, at the city of Wells, in and for the said county, on the twenty-fifth day of March one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, did resolve, that a humble petition should be presented to Her Majesty, praying for such division or alteration as therein-after mentioned, due notice thereof having been given to all the coroners of the said county ; and two of the justices attending such general or quarter session did thereby certify, under their hands and seals, that such petition was agreed to :

And whereas the said justices have since presented their petition to Her Majesty, representing,

That great inequality exists in the three districts into which the said county is practically though not legally divided, as regards the duties of the three coroners for the whole of such county; that one of such coroners now holds inquests over almost the whole of one of the two divisions of the county (as divided by the Reform Act), viz. the western division; that that coroner is seventy-eight years of age, and has availed himself of the power given him to appoint a deputy; that Her Majesty's petitioners have had due regard to the size and nature of each proposed district, the number of the inhabitants, the nature of their employments, and such other circumstances as appear to Her Majesty's petitioners fit to be considered in carrying into execution the provisions of the statute of the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign, chapter 92, and have sent to the said several coroners, as directed by the said Act, notices of the intention of taking this into consideration at the present session, and have also sent with such notices copies of the map or plan hereinafter mentioned; and the said coroners have, on the twenty-fourth of March instant, appeared before the justices of the peace composing the finance committee of the said county, and acquiesced in the proposed division :

And, therefore, praying that, for the reasons hereinbefore set forth, the said county may be divided into three districts, as shewn and delineated on the map or plan thereunto an-

nexed, describing the several proposed districts, and the boundaries thereof; and that Her Majesty will be graciously pleased to give to district No. 1, the name of the Northern District; to district No. 2, the name of the South Eastern District; and to district No. 3, the name of the Western District; and also to determine, that the place within each district, at which the court for the election of coroner for such district shall be hereafter held, shall be as follows; that is to say, at Axbridge, for district No. 1; at Castle Carey, for district No. 2; and at Taunton, for district No. 3.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, having taken the said petition into consideration, doth, pursuant to the said Act, of the seventh and eighth years of Her reign, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, declare, order, and direct, that such county shall be divided into three districts, for the purposes of the said Act, to be called by the several and respective names following, that is to say, No. 1, comprising the places and parishes before named and appropriated to that peculiar district, to be called the Northern District; No. 2, comprizing the places and parishes before named and appropriated to that peculiar district, to be called the South Eastern District; and No. 3, comprising the places and parishes before named and appropriated to that peculiar district, to be called the Western District.

And it is hereby further declared, ordered, directed, and determined, that the courts to be holden for the purpose of the election of any coroners of any one or more of the said districts, respectively, when and as often as the same shall become necessary, under the provisions of the said recited Act, shall be as follows, that is to say, for No. 1, the Northern District, to be holden at Axbridge aforesaid, and the poll to be taken there; for No. 2, the South Eastern District, to be holden at Castle Carey aforesaid, and the poll to be taken there; for No. 3, the Western District, to be holden at Taunton aforesaid, and the poll to be taken there.

And it is hereby also further declared, ordered, and directed, that this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fifth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the district of Saint George, Leeds, in the parish of Leeds, and out of the said parish, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or

transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the meantime, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as hereinafter provided;

“ And whereas the said district of Saint George, Leeds, and the said parish, are of great extent, and contain a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular parts of the said district and parish hereinafter respectively mentioned and described, neither of such parts at present containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth :

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Thomas Bishop of Ripon, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said district of Saint George, Leeds, and all that part of the said parish of Leeds, respectively described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—which parts, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—shall be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, “ The District of Saint Philip, Leeds.”

“ And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum

of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

“ And whereas it is by the said Act further enacted, that it shall be lawful, by the authority aforesaid, at any time to assign the right of patronage of any such district or new parish as aforesaid, and the nomination of the minister or perpetual curate thereof respectively, either in perpetuity, or for one or more nomination or nominations, to any ecclesiastical corporation, aggregate or sole, or to either of the Universities of Oxford, Cambridge, or Durham, or to any college therein respectively, or to any person or persons, or the nominee or nominees of such person or persons or body respectively, upon condition of such corporation, university, college, person or persons contributing to the permanent endowment of such minister or perpetual curate, or towards providing a church or chapel for the use of the inhabitants of such district or new parish, in such proportion, and in such manner, as shall be approved by the like authority :

“ And whereas certain persons have contributed certain sums of money towards providing a church or chapel within the limits of the district of Saint Philip, so herein recommended to be constituted; and it has been agreed by such persons that such church or chapel, when erected and completed, shall be offered for approval by us, and for consecration, as the church or chapel of the said district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof; and whereas a sum of one hundred and seventy-six pounds two shillings has been deposited with us, upon trust, to be applied in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient, as a permanent fund, towards the repairs and maintenance of the fabric of such church :

“ And whereas the principal contributors towards the said church or chapel have, by an instrument in writing under their hands, nominated to us the Incumbent of the said district of Saint George, as the patron of the said district of Saint Philip, for the first turn :

“ We, therefore, further recommend and propose, that the right of patronage of the said district of Saint Philip, and the nomination of the minister thereof, shall, for the first such nomina-

tion, be assigned to and vested in the Incumbent, for the time being, of the said district of Saint George.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ SCHEDULE.

“ The district of SAINT PHILIP, LEEDS, being—

“ All that part of the district of Saint George, Leeds, and all that part of the parish of Leeds, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon, bounded as follows, that is to say, on the north by an imaginary line extending eastward, from the eastern boundary of the new parish of Saint Andrew, Leeds, at a point (marked *a* on the map or plan herewith) along the northern side of a certain yard and estate called Rider's-buildings, and along the northern side of Lower Hanover-street, so far as the middle of such street where it takes a northern direction, and thence northward along the middle of the same street to a point (marked *b* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Duncombe-street, and thence eastward along the middle of such last-mentioned street as far as the middle of Fountaine-street; on the east by an imaginary line extending southward along the middle of the last-mentioned street across West-street, and along the middle of Lisbon-street, as far as the middle of Wellington-street, and thence eastward along the middle of such last-mentioned street to a point (marked *c* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Lower Queen-street, and thence southward along the middle of such last-mentioned street as far as the middle of the Leeds and Halifax new turnpike road, and thence towards the south west along the middle of such road as far as the river Aire; on the south by the said river; and on the west by the new parish of Saint Andrew, Leeds, aforesaid.”

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbents and to the patrons of the churches of the parish and district out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and such incumbents and patrons have respectively consented to the said scheme :

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Ripon.
