In consequence of the numerous Notices of Applications to Parliament for Railway Bills, and other Bills, which Notices must be inserted in the Gazette before the expiration of the present Month, a Gazette will be published To-morrow, Wednesday the 5th, and also on Thursday the 6th instant.

AT the Court at *Buckingham-Palace*, the 8th day of *August* 1845,

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fifth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting three separate districts for spiritual purposes out of the chapelry of Attercliffe, in the parish of Sheffield, and in the county and diocese of York.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part

thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the meantime, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council, that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as hereinafter provided :

“ And whereas the said chapelry of Attercliffe is of great extent, and contains a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular parts of such chapelry hereinafter-mentioned and described, neither of which parts at present contains within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be respectively constituted separate districts in manner hereinafter set forth :

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Edward Archbishop of York, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all those parts of the said chapelry of Attercliffe, respectively described in the schedule hereunto annexed, and therein numbered respectively, 1, 2, 3,—all which parts, together with the boundaries thereof, are respectively delineated and set forth in the maps or plans hereunto also annexed, and respectively numbered in like manner—shall be respectively constituted separate districts for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be respectively named as follows (that is to say), the district numbered 1 in the said schedule, shall be named “ The District of Pits Moor;” that the district numbered 2 therein, shall be named “ The District of Wicker;” and the district numbered 3 therein, shall be named “ The District of Brightside.”

“ And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of each of the districts so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within either of such districts, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same

Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to the minister thereof, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within either of such districts shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sums of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of either of such districts or new parishes shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ SCHEDULE.

“ No. 1.—The district of PITS MOOR, being—

“ All that part of the chapelry of Attercliffe, in the parish of Sheffield, in the county and diocese of York, situate on the western side of an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked *a* on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and numbered 1.) on the boundary of such chapelry, in the middle of the Sheffield and Wakefield turnpike road, near Bolsover-hill, and thence extending towards the south west, along the middle of such turnpike road, to a point (marked *b* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Osgathorpe-lane, and thence towards the south east, along the middle of such lane, as far as the middle of a certain occupation road near Hall Car-wood, and thence towards the south west, along the middle of such occupation road, as far as the middle of the New Sheffield and Wakefield turnpike road, and thence towards the north west, along the middle of such last-mentioned road, to a point (marked *c* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of a certain street or

road called Rock-street, and thence towards the south west, along the middle of such street or road, as far as the middle of a certain street or road called Pyebank, and thence towards the south east, along the middle of such last-mentioned street, and Bridge-houses, to the Iron-bridge over the river Don.

" No. 2.—The district of WICKER, being—

" All that part of the said chapelry of Attercliffe bounded as follows; that is to say, on the western, north western, and north eastern sides thereof, by the said district of Pits Moor; on the south western side thereof partly by the said district and partly by the said river; on the southern side thereof by the same river; and on all other sides thereof by an imaginary line extending from the boundary of the said district of Pits Moor, near the south eastern corner thereof, along the middle of the New Sheffield and Wakefield turnpike road, as far as Sackville-street, and thence eastward, along the middle of such street, and of the Rotherham and Doncaster turnpike road, as far as Burton Head.

" No. 3.—The district of BRIGHTSIDE, being—

" All that part of the said chapelry of Attercliffe bounded as follows; that is to say, on the north and east by the parish of Ecclesfield, in the same county and diocese; on the west by the said districts of Pits Moor and Wicker; on the south partly by such last-mentioned district, and partly by the river Don aforesaid; and on the south east by the same river."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbents and to the patrons of the church of the parish, and of the church or chapel of the chapelry out of which it is intended that the districts therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the said Act; and whereas one calendar month has expired since such draft was so transmitted, and no objections have been made thereto :

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of York.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing session, for an Act or Acts to extend the period for taking lands compulsorily, for the purposes of the Thames Haven Dock and Railway, and to alter, amend, enlarge, and extend the provisions of the several Acts, or some of them, relating to the said Thames Haven Dock and Railway Company, that is to say, an Act, passed in a session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for making a railway from or near Romford, in the county of Essex, to Shell Haven, in the same county, and for constructing a tide-dock at the termination of the said railway, at Shell Haven aforesaid;" and an Act, passed in a session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for extending and enlarging some of the provisions of an Act, relating to the Thames Haven Dock and Railway Company;" and it is proposed, by the said intended Act, to enable the said company to sell, or let on lease for a perpetuity, or for such term as may be agreed on, all, any, or either of the railways, dock, lands, and works belonging to them, or which they are authorized to construct, hold, or maintain, together with all rights, title, powers, privileges, and authorities now vested in them by virtue of the said recited Acts, or any of them, in reference thereto; and to enable any other company to purchase or rent the said dock, railway, lands, and works, or either of them, together with such right, title, powers, privileges, and authorities; and to insert in the same Act or Acts all such powers and provisions as may be considered proper or expedient for carrying into effect the several objects above mentioned.
