Leicester and Bedford Railway Bill.

And terminating at or near certain lands, called New Found Pool, the liberty of Leicester Abbey, and Freaques's Ground, or some or one of them, in the said county of Leicester, either by a junction with the Leicester and Swannington Railway, or by an independent terminus there.

Together with a branch or side railway, diverging from the said main line of railway in the said parish of Knighton, passing through the same parish, and terminating therein by a junction with the Midland Railway.

And also another branch or side railway, diverging from the said main line of railway at or near Chester House, in the said parish of Irchester, and terminating by a junction with the Northampton and Peterborough Railway on the east side thereof, at or near Ditchford Mill, in the parish of Irchester aforesaid.

And also another branch or side railway, diverging from the said main line of railway at or near a windmill in the said parish of Irthlingborough, and terminating by a junction with the said Northampton and Peterborough Railway on the west side thereof, near to Ditchford Mill, in the parish of Irchester aforesaid; and the promoters of the said undertaking reserve to themselves power to confine the application in the next session of Parliament to a part only instead of the whole of the said railways and works.

And it is intended to take power by such Bill or Bills to construct stations, communications, works, and other conveniences in the several parishes, townships, and extra-parochial places before mentioned, or some of them, for the working and using the said railway, and also to authorise junctions with any railway or railways, at the commencement or termination, or on the line or course of the said railway, as before described, in the several parishes, townships, and extra-parochial places aforesaid. And in the said Bill, powers will be applied for to deviate from the line or lines laid down on the plans, hereinafter mentioned, to the extent thereon defined, and to vary or alter all such turnpike roads, parish roads, and other highways, aqueducts, canals, navigations, and railways within the parishes, townships, and extra-parochial places aforesaid, or some of them, as it may be necessary to vary or alter for the purposes of such railway. And it is intended to apply for power to levy tolls, rates, or duties for the use of the said railway, and to grant certain exemptions from such tolls, rates, or duties. And also for the powers usually conferred for the compulsory purchase of the lands and houses to be described upon the plans hereinafter mentioned. And also for power to vary and extinguish all rights and privileges
