

Devonshire Lighting Company.

And powers will also be sought by such Act or Acts for laying down and maintaining mains and pipes for the conveyance of gas through private lands, and also in and along turnpike roads, highways, streets, and public and private passages and places in the several parishes or other places aforesaid, or some of them, and to break up either compulsorily or by agreement, the soil or pavement of such roads, highways, streets,

and public or private places; and by the said Act or Acts, it is intended to take powers for the purchase, by compulsion or otherwise, of such lands and houses as may be necessary for effecting the purposes aforesaid; and to vary or extinguish all rights and privileges connected with the lands and houses, so to be purchased or taken, which would in any manner impede or interfere with the purposes aforesaid, and to confer other rights and privileges.

And it also intended by such Act or Acts, to take power to levy and recover rates or rents for the supply of such gas from all companies or persons using or consuming the same, and to grant exemptions from the payment thereof.

And it is also proposed by such Act or Acts, to empower the company to be thereby incorporated, to contract and agree with other existing gas light companies, or any other company or person, either for the supply to such companies or persons respectively, all or any of them, by the company to be incorporated by the said intended Act of gas for lighting the districts under their control, or within their respective jurisdictions, or for the purchase by the company to be incorporated by the said intended Act of the gas works belonging to the said companies; and generally to authorise and empower the said company, to be incorporated by the said intended Act, and such other companies or persons, as aforesaid, to enter into and carry into effect such arrangements in reference to all or any of the purposes aforesaid, as may be mutually agreed upon between them respectively.
