And notice is hereby further given, that duplicate plans and sections, describing the line and levels of the said intended railway, and the works connected therewith, and the lands to be taken for the purposes thereof, together with books of reference to such plans containing the names of the owners or reputed owners, lessees or reputed lessees and occupiers of such lands, will, on or before the thirtieth day of November instant, be deposited for public inspection, at the office of the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Lancaster, at his office in Preston, in the said county; and that on or before the thirty-first day of December next, a copy of so much of the said plans and sections as relates to each of the parishes aforesaid, in or through which the said railway will pass, or be situate, together with a book of reference thereto, will be deposited with the parish clerk of each such parish.

Harrogate Water-Works.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the next session, for an Act for supplying with water, the hamlets or places of High and Low Harrogate, in the several townships of Knaresborough, Pannal, Bilton-with-Harrogate and Scriven-with-Tentergate, and in the parishes of Knaresborough and Pannal, all in the west riding of the county of York; and it is proposed by the said intended Act to incorporate a company and to give to such company powers to take and acquire lands and houses, and other buildings, by compulsion or otherwise, to divert springs, brooks, streams, and rivulets, and the water of wells and watering places, and to appropriate such waters respectively, and to purchase, or construct, and maintain reservoirs, filters, wells, cuts, aqueducts, conduits, roads, mains, pipes, drains, dams, goits, engines, buildings, and other erections and works, necessary for effecting the said purposes, and carrying on the said undertaking; which said reservoirs, filters, wells, cuts, aqueducts, conduits, roads, mains, pipes, drains, dams, goits, engines, buildings, and other erections and works, will be made in, or will pass from, through, or into the several townships, parishes, extra-parochial, or other places following, that is to say, Knaresborough, Pannal, Bilton-with-Harrogate, High Harrogate, Low Harrogate, Scriven-with-Tentergate, and Killinghall, in the several parishes of Knaresborough, Pannal, and Ripley, or some of them, or some parts thereof, all in the west riding of the county of York.

And notice is hereby also given, that it is intended by such Act to repeal, alter, amend, extend or enlarge such and so many of the powers and

provisions of an Act passed in the tenth year of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for dividing and enclosing such of the open parts of the district, called the Forest of Knaresborough, in the county of York, as lie within the eleven constaberies thereof, and for other purposes therein mentioned;" and of an Act passed in the fourth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for improving certain parts of the townships of Bilton-with-Harrogate and Pannal, called High and Low Harrogate, in the west riding of the county of York, for protecting the mineral springs, and regulating the stinted pasture in the said townships;" and of the award of the commissioners dated the nineteenth day August, 1778, made in pursuance of the said first-mentioned Act; or of any other Act or Acts as relate to the appropriation and use of the waters of certain springs, wells, and watering places in the same Acts and award, or any of them mentioned, and the ground set out adjoining thereto; and any other powers and provisions contained in such Acts, or award, which it may be necessary to repeal, alter, amend, extend, or enlarge, for the procuring of water for, and otherwise for the carrying into effect the purposes of the said undertaking, or which would in any manner impede or interfere with the construction or maintenance of the said intended works, or any of them.

And it also intended to take powers in the said Act to levy and recover rates, rents, and duties, for the use of the water to be supplied by the said company, and to grant exemptions from payment of such rates, rents, and duties, and to vary or extinguish all rights and privileges connected with the lands, houses, and buildings, so to be purchased or taken, or the waters of the springs, brooks, streams, and rivulets, wells, and watering places, so to be diverted and appropriated, which would in any manner impede or interfere with the construction or maintenance of the said intended works, or any of them; and to confer other rights and privileges; and in the said Act the usual powers will also be inserted to enable the company to deviate from the line to be marked upon the plans hereinafter mentioned.

And notice is hereby also given, that duplicate plans and sections of the said intended works, as required by the standing orders of Parliament, with books of reference to the said plans, will be deposited for public inspection, on or before the thirtieth day of November instant, with the Clerk of the Peace for the west riding of the said county of York, at his office at Wakefield, in the said county; and that on or before the thirty-first day of December next, copies of so much of the said plans, sections, and books of reference as relates to each of the said parishes hereinbefore mentioned, in or through which the said intended works respectively are proposed to be made, will be deposited for public inspection, with the parish clerk of each such parish, at his place of abode.
