

Chorley Waterworks.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing session, for an Act to incorporate a company for supplying with water the town and parish of Chorley, in the county Palatine of Lancaster; and for that purpose to purchase or construct, and to maintain reservoirs, filters, wells, cuts, conduits, aqueducts, roads, mains, pipes, and other works and conveniences necessary for effecting the purposes aforesaid, within the several parishes, townships, extra-parochial, or other places of Anlezark, Rivington Heath, Charnock, Heapey, Chorley, Leyland, Bolton and Standish, or some of them; and to lay and maintain aqueducts, pipes, and conduits for the conveyance of such water through private lands, and in and along roads, streets, and public passages in the several parishes, townships, and extra-parochial or other places aforesaid, or some of them. And it is intended by such Act to obtain power to collect and obtain water from certain lands, springs, streams, and brooks, situate within the several parishes, townships, and extra-parochial or other places aforesaid, or some of them, the waters of which brooks and streams, or some of them, now directly or derivatively flow into the Leeds and Liverpool Canal: and it is also intended by such Act, to take power for the purchase, by compulsion or otherwise, of such lands and houses and other buildings, springs, streams, and brooks, as may be necessary for the purposes aforesaid, and to levy and recover rates, rents, and duties for the use of the water to be supplied by the said company, and to grant exemptions from the payment thereof, and to vary or extinguish all rights and privileges connected with the lands, houses, and buildings, springs, streams, and brooks, so to be purchased or taken, which would in any manner impede or interfere with the construction or maintenance of the said intended works, or any of them, and to confer other rights and privileges.

And notice is hereby also given, that plans and sections of the said intended reservoirs, aqueducts, and other works, and of the streams to be directly diverted into the same, and of the lands proposed to be taken for the purposes thereof, together with books of reference to such plans, describing the names of the reputed owners, lessees, and occupiers of such lands, will be deposited on or before the thirtieth day of November in the present year, with the clerk of the peace for the county of Lancaster, at his office in Preston, and that a copy of so much of the said plans, sections, and books of reference as relates to each of the parishes in which the said intended reservoirs, aqueducts, and other works are intended to be made, will be deposited on or before the thirty-first day of December in the present year, with the parish clerks of those parishes respectively, at their respective residences.
