And also to make and maintain a branch or side railway, diverging from the said first-described railway at or near Ringstead Mill, in the said parish of Ringstead, and terminating by a junction with the Northampton and Peterborough Railway, on the east side thereof, at or near to an ancient water-course called Hogs Dyke, in the parish of Raunds aforesaid.

And also another branch or side railway, diverging from the said first-described railway, at or near Addington Mill, in the said parish of Great Addington, and terminating by a junction with the said Northampton and Peterborough Railway, on the west side thereof, at or near Woodford Mill, in the parish of Woodford aforesaid.

And the promoters of the said undertaking reserve to themselves power to confine the application in the next Session of Parliament to a part only, instead of the whole, of the said railways and works.

And it is intended to apply for powers to make lateral deviations from the line of the proposed works to the extent or within the limits defined upon the plans hereinafter mentioned; and also to authorise a junction or junctions with any railway or railways at the commencement or termination, or on the line or course of the said railway or railways as before described, or either of them, in the several parishes, townships, and extra-parochial or other places aforesaid; and also to cross, divert, alter, or stop up, whether temporarily or permanently, all such turnpike roads, parish roads, and other highways, streams, sewers, canals, navigations, railways, or tramroads, within the said parishes, townships, and extra-parochial or other places aforesaid, or some of them, as it may be necessary to cross, divert, alter, or stop up, for the purposes of the said works.
