

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing session, for leave to bring in a Bill for making, erecting, constructing and maintaining a Bridge or Bridges over the Goight, commonly called "Vickers Goight," otherwise "Cotton Mill Goight," and the river Dun, in the parish of Sheffield, in the West Riding of the county of York, together with all proper and necessary works, conveniences, and approaches, roads, and streets thereto, and which said new Bridge or Bridges, works, conveniences, roads, streets, and approaches, are intended to be made and will be situate in the several townships of Sheffield and Brightside Bierlow, or one of them, both in the parish of Sheffield aforesaid; and it is intended to apply for powers to make lateral deviations from the line of the proposed works, to the extent or within the limits defined upon the plans hereinafter mentioned, and to cross, divert, alter, or stop up, whether temporarily or permanently, all such highways, streams, sewers, streets, passages, and places within the said parish and townships, or such of them as it may be necessary to cross, divert, alter, or stop up for the purposes of the said works.

And notice is hereby further given, that duplicate plans and sections of the said Bridge or Bridges, works, conveniences, roads, streets, and approaches, together with books of reference thereto, will be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace, for the West Riding of the county of York, at his Office in Wakefield, in the said riding, on or before the thirtieth day of November instant, and on or before the thirty-first day of December next, a copy of the said plans and sections, together with a book of reference thereto, will be deposited with the Parish Clerk, of the parish of Sheffield aforesaid, at his place of abode.

And notice is hereby further given, that it is intended by the said Bill to apply for powers for the compulsory purchase of lands and houses, and to vary or extinguish all rights and privileges in any manner connected with the lands and houses proposed to be taken for the purposes aforesaid. And it is also intended by the said Bill to apply for powers for authorizing and empowering the Trustees acting in the execution of an Act passed in the eighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled, "An Act for facilitating the execution of certain trusts for charitable and public purposes within the Town of Sheffield, in the county of York," and of an Act passed in the first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for making a new street or thoroughfare, and widening and improving certain other streets or thoroughfares within the Town and Borough of Sheffield, in the county of York," to raise money upon mortgage or security of the trust estates vested in them, under or by virtue of the said Acts, or either of them or otherwise, and to apply such money, or any part thereof, for all or any of the purposes aforesaid; and for altering, amending, and rendering effectual some of the powers and provisions of the said Acts, with reference to the several matters aforesaid.

And it is also intended to take powers to levy tolls, rates, or duties, upon or in respect of the said bridge or bridges, approaches and works, and to confer, vary, or extinguish exemptions from the payment of tolls, rates and duties, and other rights and privileges.

Plymouth and North Cornwall Railway.
