WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to authorize the division of " the parish and vicarage of Leeds, in the county " of York, into several parishes and vicarages,"

Council a scheme, bearing date the eighth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioner's for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled " An Act to " authorize the division of the parish and vicarage " of Leeds, in the county of York, into several "parishes and vicarages," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council; the following scheme, for setting out, constituting, and annexing to the church or chapel of Saint John the Evangelist, in the parish of Leeds, in the diocese of Ripon, a district for spiritual purposes.

" Whereas it was by the said Act enacted, that it should be lawful, by the authority in certain Acts therein recited provided, that is to say, by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England; by a scheme or schemes prepared by us, according to the provisions of the same Acts, and by your Majesty in Council, by an Order or Orders ratifying the same according to the like provisions, at such time or times, and from time to time as by such authority should be deemed expedient, to duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in set out and constitute and to annex to any and

every church or chapel already duly consecrated within the limits of the existing parish of Leeds, but in each and every such case with the consent of the bishop of the diocese and of the trustees of the advowson of the vicarage of Leeds, a district for spiritual purposes, within such boundaries as by the like authority might be considered to be most suitable and convenient; and, for that purpose, to vary the boundaries of any district then subsisting; and the same Act contained a proviso for postponing the operation of any such scheme and Order in the case of a church or chapel then consecrated, till the next vacancy thereof, unless with the consent of the incumbent thereof then in possession:

- " And it was by the same Act provided and enacted, that a district should not be annexed under the foregoing provisions to any such church or chapel, unless or until the nave or body thereof should be or should have been made free for the use of the inhabitants of such district (subject to the order and disposal of the ordinary), nor unless or until a house of residence for the incumbent of such church or chapel should have been provided, or the means of providing the same should have been secured, to the satisfaction of us, and of the bishop of the diocese:
- " And whereas it has been made to appear to us, that the entire floor or body of the consecrated church or chapel of Saint John the Evangelist, in the township and within the said parish of Leeds, is entirely free, and that there is a house of residence belonging to the same church or chapel in which the incumbent thereof now resides:
- " And whereas no ecclesiastical district has yet been legally assigned to the said church or chapel; but a competent income has been provided for the incumbent thereof:
- " And whereas it has been represented to us, that it would be, and it appears to us to be, expedient, that a district, comprised within the boundaries hereinafter specified, should be forthwith set out and constituted and annexed to the said church or chapel:
- " Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Thomas Bishop of Ripon, and of the Reverend Francis Thomas Cookson, Clerk, the

Saint John the Evangelist, in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this scheme, and also with the consent of the patrons of the church of Saint Peter, Leeds, in testimony whereof they have hereunto affixed their common seal, that all that part of the parish of Leeds, particularly specified and described in the schedule hereunto annexed, -all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed, - shall be forthwith constituted and annexed to the said church or chapel of Saint John the Evangelist, in the said parish of Leeds, so as fully to entitle the said church or chapel, and such district so annexed thereto, and the present and every future incumbent thereof, to all the benefits, rights, privileges, advantages, and attributes accruing and attaching thereto, under the provisions of the same Act, and that the nave or body of the said church or chapel shall for ever hereafter be free for the use of the inhabitants of the said district (subject to the order and disposal of the ordinary); and the said house of residence, now occupied by the incumbent as aforesaid, with its appurtenances, shall be and for ever remain the house of residence and vicarage of the incumbent and vicar of the same church or chapel, and of the parish and vicarage of Saint John the Evangelist, in Leeds.

" And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said recited Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

" All that part of the township and parish of Leeds, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon, comprised within and bounded by an imaginary line, commencing at a point (marked a on the map or plan hereunto annexed) in the middle of Park-lane, opposite to the middle of Cookridge-street; and thence extending northward along the middle of such street, as far as the middle of Great George-street; and thence westward, along the middle of such last-mentioned street, to a point (marked b as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of the street called Portland-crescent; and thence northward, along the middle of such present Incumbent of the said church or chapel of street, as far as the middle of Woodhouse-lane;

and thence eastward, along the middle of such i, "the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly lane, to and along the middle of Coburg-street, to a. point (marked c as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Clay-pit-lane; and thence northward, along the middle of such last-mentioned lane, to a point (marked d as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of the street called Back Grove-terrace; and thence eastward, along the middle of such lastmentioned street, across Camp-road, and along the middle of Grafton-street as far as the middle of North-street; and thence southward, along the middle of such last-mentioned street, to a point (marked e as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of the street called Lower-head-row; and thence westward, along the middle of such last-mentioned street, and of the street called Upper-head-row, and of Guildford-street and Park-lane aforesaid, to the point where the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas notice of the said scheme has been duly given to the incumbent of the said parish and vicarge of Leeds, and no objections have been made thereto:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Ripon. "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An " Act to make better provision for the spiritual " care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parishes of Heanor and Ilkeston, in the county of Derby, and in the diocese of Lichfield.

" Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the mean time, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereinafter provided;

And whereas the said parishes of Heanor and Ilkeston are, respectively, of great extent, and contain a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of each of such parishes hereinafter mentioned and described, neither of which parts at present contains within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be together constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Bishop of Lichfield, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Heanor, and also all that part of the said parish of Ilkeston, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all which parts, together with the boundaries thereof, are delincated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—shall be together constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, "The District of Cotmanhay."

"And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the

sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for exclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

- " The district of COTMANHAY, being-
- "All that part of the liberty of Shipley, in the parish of Heanor, in the county of Derby, and in the diocese of Lichfield, situate on the

eastern side of an imaginary line extending along the middle of the coach road from Mapperley to Heanor; and also all that part of the parish of Ilkeston, in the same county and diocese, situate on the northern side of an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked a on the map or plan hereunto annexed) on the boundary of such lastmentioned parish opposite to the middle of Grasslane, and thence extending eastward along the middle of such lane, as far as the middle of Cotmanhay road, and thence towards the north east, along the middle of such road, to a point (marked b as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Duke-street; and thence eastward along the middle of such last-mentioned street, and continuing thence in a straight direction to the boundary of the said parish of Ilkeston."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbents and to the patrons of the churches of the parishes out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and whereas one calendar month has expired since such draft was so transmitted, and no objections have been made thereto:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Lichfield. " And whereas his Highness Pertaub Shean so conducted himself as an ally of the East India

Company that, on the 29th December 1835, the following letter was unanimously agreed to by the Court of Directors:

" Your Highness,

"We have been highly gratified by the information from time to time transmitted to us by our Government, on the subject of your Highness's exemplary fulfilment of the duties of that elevated situation in which it has pleased Providence to place you.

" A course of conduct so suitable to your Highness's exalted station, and so well calculated to promote the prosperity of your dominions and the happiness of your people, as that which you have wisely and uniformly pursued, while it reflects the highest honour on your character, has imparted to our minds the feelings of unqualified satisfaction and pleasure: the liberality also which you have displayed in executing, at your own cost, various public works of great utility, and which has so justly raised your reputation in the eyes of the Princes and people of India, gives you an additional claim to our approbation, respect, and applause.

"Impressed with these sentiments, the Court of Directors of the East India Company have unanimously resolved to transmit to you a sword, which will be presented to you through the Government of India, and which, we trust, you will receive with satisfaction, as a token of their high esteem and regard.

"With sincere wishes for your health and prosperity, we subscribe ourselves, in the name of the Court.

"Your Highness's most faithful friends, " W. S. CLARKE, Chairman. " J. R. CARNAC, Deputy.

" And whereas, in 1836, certain enemies of his Highness the Raja of Sattara did conspire to effect the ruin and dethronement of that Prince, by preferring false charges against him to the Bombay Government.

"And whereas when these charges, and the evidence in support of them, had been forwarded to the Court of Directors, and had been considered by them, it was the decided opinion of that body, that it would not only be a waste of of time, but seriously detrimental to the character of the Government to carry on any further inquiry into the matter.

"And whereas this opinion was communicated to the Government of Bombay and the Government of India, in dispatches from the Court of Directors, dated, repectively, the 13th June 1838,

and the 20th January 1839.

" And whereas Sir James Rivett Carnac, on his appointment to the office of Governor of Bombay, received no instructions from the Court of Directors to dethrone or otherwise to punish the Raja of Sattara; but, on the contrary, was empowered to suppress all further inquiry into the charges that had been made against the Raja, and to consign the matter to entire oblivion.

"And whereas Sir James Carnac did, in a minute, recorded by him on the 19th June 1839, propose, that the Resident of Sattara should be instructed to assure his Highness of the desire of the British Government to maintain the relations of amity with him, and did further declare, 'that the British Government had nothing to fear from the Raja, and could afford to act with generosity.'

"And whereas Sir James Rivett Carnac did,

"And whereas Sir James Rivett Carnac did, at a personal interview with the Raja, on the 23d of August 1839, inform his Highness, that three important violations of the treaty had been proved

against him.

"1st. Of the fifth article, in having, during a series of years, held improper communications with the Goa Authorities.

"2d. Of the same article, in having held a clandestine intercourse with Appa Sahib, the Ex Raja of Nagpoor.

"3d. Of having tampered with the native officers

of the 23d regiment native infantry.

"And whereas Sir James Rivett Carnac did, at a subsequent interview, on the 27th August, peremptorily require the Raja to sign certain articles, to which the following preamble was affixed, viz.

"Information having been received by the British Government that your Highness, misled by evil advisers, had, in breach of the treaty which placed you on the throne, entered into communications hostile to the British Government, an inquiry into these accusations was considered indispensable. This inquiry has satisfied the British Government, that your Highness has exposed yourself to the sacrifice of its alliance and protection; nevertheless, moved by considerations of clemency towards your Highness and your family, the British Government has resolved entirely to overlook what has passed, on the following conditions, namely, &c. &c.

"And whereas the Raja of Sattara did at these interviews declare his entire and absolute innocence, and earnestly implore permission to be heard in reply to the charges which his enemies had brought against him, and in refutation of the evidence in support of them, and did also express his willingness to submit to any conditions which did not require him to abandon his religion, or to acknowledge, in violation of his conscience, that he had been the enemy of the British Government.

"And whereas, for the sole reason of having refused to sign the articles and preamble submitted to him, he was, on the 5th of September 1839, and by the authority of Sir James Carnac, forcibly taken a prisoner and dethroned, and a proclamation issued by the Resident, declaring his brother, Appa Sahib (his bitter enemy), the Raja of Sattara.

"And whereas, by the 33d George III. chap. 52, sec. 43, it is enacted, that 'it shall not be lawful for the Government of Bombay,' &c. 'to make or issue any order for commencing hostilities or levying war, or to negociate or conclude any treaty with any Indian prince or state (except in cases of sudden emergency or imminent danger, when it shall appear dangerous to postpone such

hostilities or treaty), unless in pursuance of express orders from the Governor General in Council, or from the Secret Committee by the authority of the Board of Control.'

"And whereas it is further enacted, in section 42 of the same Act, that 'it shall not be lawful for the Governor General in Council, without the express command and authority of the Court of Directors, or of the Secret Committee by the authority of the Board of Control, in any case (except where hostilities have actually been commenced or preparations actually made for the commencement of hostilities against the British nation in India) either to declare war or commence hostilities, or enter into any treaty for making war," &c.
