A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

THEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Tuesday the thirtieth day of December instant; We, with the advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued, on the said Tuesday the thirtieth day of December instant, to Thursday the twenty-second day of January next; and We have given order to Our Chancellor of that part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly: and We do hereby further, with the advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, that the said Parliament shall, on the said Thursday the twenty-second day of January next, assemble and be holden for the dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs: and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to subjects, the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons

give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said Thursday the twenty-second day of January next.

Given at Our Court, at Windsor, this twentythird day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fortyfive, and in the ninth year of Our reign.

GOD save the QUEEN.

Windsor-Castle, January 3, 1846.

This day the Right Honourable the Lord Mayor, the Aldermen, Recorder, Sheriffs, Common Council, and Officers of the city of London, waited upon Her Majesty with the following Address and Petition, which was read by the Honourable Charles Ewan Law, M. P. the Recorder, and which Her Majesty was graciously pleased to receive on the Throne:

To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty.

The humble Address and Petition of the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the city of London, in Common Council assembled.

Most Gracious Sovercign,

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal

of the city of London, in Common Council assembled, humbly approach your Royal Person

respectfully to represent to your Majesty,
That great, powerful, and wealthy as this nation is, by far the largest portion of your Majesty's subjects in Ireland, and a great portion of your Majesty's subjects in England, Scotland, and Wales, have long been reduced, for their principal food, to potatoes;

That all classes, but especially the poor, have been and are great sufferers from this result of

the national economy;

That the blight which has fallen upon the potato has subjected your Majesty's people to great anxiety and distress, and to the danger of famine;

That their sufferings are attributable to erroneous legislation, which, by excluding the importation of food, and restricting commerce, shuts out from the nation the bounty of Providence;

We, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to use the means in your Majesty's power to open the ports of this kingdom for the free importation of food.

To which Address and Petition Her Majesty was pleased to return the following most gracious Answer:

"The motives which have induced you to present this Address are duly appreciated by me.

" The wants and sufferings of my people at all times command my warmest sympathy; and I deeply regret the failure in the present year of a full supply of an article of food on which so many of

my subjects are accustomed to subsist.

"I have directed Parliament to assemble on an early day, and I shall gladfy sanction any measure which the wisdom of the Legislature may suggest, as conducive to the alleviation of this temporary distress, and to the permanent welfare of all classes of my people.'

They were all very graciously received, and had the honour of kissing Her Majesty's hand.

The Right Honourable the Lord Mayor of the city of Dublin, accompanied by the Town Clerk and a Deputation from the Corporation, attended at Windsor-Castle, on the 3d instant, and had the honour of presenting to the Queen, Throne, the following loyal and dutiful Address:

To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty.

of the Right Honourable the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of Dublin.

May it please your Majesty,

Land Mayor, Aldermen, WE, the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of the city of Dublin, approach your Majesty with feelings of

loyalty and profound respect for your Majesty's Person and Throne, but, impelled by an imperative sense of duty, we cannot refrain longer from laying before your Majesty that which must cause much pain and anguish to a Monarch who feels acutely

for the sufferings of her people.
"We assure your Majesty, that we would not address you on the destitution of our country, but that we are deeply impressed with the awful responsibility that would attach to us in the eyes of an All-ruling Providence, if we were silent and did not make known to your Majesty the melancholy situation to which the inhabitants of Ireland may be reduced, and the danger that exists of a whole people under your Majesty's sway falling victims to the scourge of famine and pestilence, its usual concomitant, if measures shall not be promptly taken by your Majesty's Government, under the blessing of a merciful God, to avert from Ireland such a calamity.

We beg to inform your Majesty, that from causes over which your people of Ireland have had no controul, they have been reduced, for many, very many years, to look to the potato crop as the only source from whence to draw their daily sustenance. To them, beyond the people of all other nations, was assigned, as their only food, the poorest food in the world, and of that, for the vast majority of them, their supply was scanty; but their wretchedness did not terminate even at this point, for them there was still a step lower in the depths of misery, their supply of food was not only scanty, and of the worst kind, but of late years they were coerced to eke out existence on the very worst species of that food; alas! food unfitted for the brute animal, was and is the food of the vast majority of your Majesty's subjects in Ireland.

May it please your Majesty, this state of destitution of your people, although known to us who live among and form a portion of them here, rests not on our evidence, Commissioners, appointed by your Majesty, in their report, now published to the world, have announced that the agricultural labourers of Ireland, and their families, are calculated to amount to more than four millions of human beings, whose only food is the potato, whose only drink is water, whose houses are pervious to the rain, to whom a bed or a blanket is a luxury unknown, and who are more wretched than any other people in Europe.

This statement is too true; but it is confined to one class alone, agricultural labourers. We are compelled to add, that this misery which is so descriptive of the destitution of four millions of your subjects, when it says they are more wretched than any other people in Europe, does not convey the whole truth, for there are, alas! many more of your people, not included in the class designated by the Commissioners, who should be added, who are on the verge of famine, and this is related of the inhabitants of a country which, of late years, may be justly termed the granary of England, exporting annually, from the midst of a starving population, food of the best kind in sufficient abundance for treble its own inhabitants.

Such, may it please your Majesty to be informed, was the situation of the Irish people at the commencement of the late autumn. The Wise Ruler of All was pleased then to bless our land with a harvest teening with abundance of the best food of man. Our people gathered it, and saved it; but, alas! when He was pleased thus to reward the labours of the husbandman, He, for His own wise purposes, blighted the potato crop, and destroyed at least one-third of their sole, their only support for one year, and this involves a state of utter destitution for four months of a great majority of your Irish people.

May it please your Majesty, we have reflected on the awful truth, a vast number of fellow beings, created for the same wise purposes, destined for the same great end, in danger of being without food for four months, and thus to fall the victims of famine and pestilence, if immediate measures shall not be resorted to to avert the calamity. However, in appealing to, and thus submitting to your Majesty the danger advancing on your people, we know you have the will, and we confidently rely on it to save them; and we know also that, placed at the head of the most powerful nation of the world, the power to save exists; but we ask not alms; we desire not the dolings out of charity from the affluent of one portion of the kingdom to the people of the other. We submit, that to avert a national calamity of this kind, great national undertakings of public utility for national good should be resorted to; that the national treasury should be poured out to give employment to the people, at remunerative wages, such as would enable them to pay for food at the high rate at which it may be had, either arising from its better quality than that heretofore used by your people, or the encrease of the demand where the supply may be straitened from the loss of the crop; such, we submit, are the leading measures to be promptly resorted to, employment of the people on national works; wages commensurate with the costs of living; freedom for import of provisions; mercantile enterprise will supply

We submit to your Majesty, that our country affords a wide field for such national undertakings, in the cultivation of our waste lands, the drainage of our soil, by the improvement of our numerous streams and rivers, the opening out the remote parts of the island by making roads throughout the country; and the erection of railways.

We, humbly laying before your Majesty the state of detitution to which your subjects in Ireland have been reduced, the awful and appalling calamity that advances on them, and suggesting the means by which its horrors may be alleviated, if not altogether averted, are not unmindful that we live under a constitutional monarchy, and that these things cannot be granted without the concurrence of the three estates; we, therefore, hope that it may please your Majesty, in the exercise of your percogative, to summon your Parliament to meet

you at an early day, and that you may be pleased to inform them of the miseries that await your loyal and devoted people of Ireland, and demand of them measures whereby your Majesty may indulge the dearest wish of your heart, to be enabled, under God, to save your people.

In referring your Majesty to the exection of railroads as a mode for procuring immediate amployment for the people, and consequent relief, we submit, that if the usual time expended in investigation, of such matters shall be employed, before Committees of Parliament during the next sessions as formerly, from this source no relief can be expected, as the time will have passed before the promoters of such works would be authorized by law to commence their operations; we, therefore, humbly submit to your Majesty, that you will be pleased to recommend, in your Address from the Throne to Parliament, that, for the facility of legislating on local Acts relating to Ireland, where the rules of the Legislature render previous inquiry before its Committees necessary to pass a law enabling and directing Committees of Parliament to whom such previous enquiries shall be entrusted to hold their sittings in Dublin, and exercise the same powers and authority for compelling the attendance of parties before them as when sitting at Westminster.

Such a law, may it please your Majesty, would, in our judgments, facilitate the dispatch of business by the Legislature for both countries, and be a vast saving of expence to the people of Ireland when obliged to apply to the Legislature for local Acts to encourage and protect enterprise and the investment of capital in the various improvements which science has of late years pointed out to man.

We assure your Majesty, that we are second to none in loyal attachment to your Person and Throne, and if we have approached your Majesty with the sad recital of the wretchedness of your people in Ireland, we have been impelled to it by an imperative duty as the representatives in Municipal Council of the inhabitants of the metropolis of that portion of your Majesty's dominions where, for many, very many years, your subjects, although living in the midst of plenty, were, nevertheless, on the brink of famine; subjects, who have been described, and truly described, as the most wretched people in Europe, and the cup of whose misery is full and overflowing in the rapid advances of famine and pestilence on our land.

May it, therefore, graciously please your Majesty to cause your Parliament to be summoned at an early day, that such measures may be passed as may enable your Majesty, under an All-wise Providence, to be the saviour of your Irish people from the scourge of famine, and that having been the instrument in His hands to avert the threatened calamity from Ireland, you may, for many, many years, govern a loyal, happy, and contented people.

To which Address Her Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:

"I have heard, with pain, the statement which you have thought it necessary to address to me, respecting the extreme poverty of a portion of my Irish subjects, and the aggravation of their distress, which you anticipate from a deficiency of food in the present year.

"The welfare and prosperity of Ireland are objects of my constant care and earnest solicitude: and the failure of the last potato crop, and its apprehended consequences, have not escaped my

attention.

"I have directed precautions to be taken, which may, I trust, alleviate the evils unavoidably attendant on this calamity; and I have summoned

Parliament to meet on an early day.

"I look with confidence to the advice, which I shall receive from the United Council of the realm: and I shall rejoice, if measures can be devised, which, under the blessing of Divine Providence, may relieve the wants of my Irish people, may improve their condition, and ensure their future happiness and contentment."

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with "certain modifications, the fourth report of the "Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and "Revenues," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the nineteenth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty five, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesias-"tical Duties and Revenues," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting each of the three portions of the vicarage of Bampton, in the county and diocese of Oxford, a separate benefice and vicarage.

"Whereas by the said recited Act it is enacted, that with respect to any parish in which both the profits and the spiritual charge are divided between two or more incumbents, each having a medicty or portion of the benefice, a plan may be framed by the bishop of the diceese, with the consent of the patron, and so as not to prejudice the interests of any existing incumbent, for

constituting any of such portions separate benefices, or for making such other arrangements as he may iudge likely to promote the efficient discharge of pastoral duties in such parishes; and any such plan may be carried into effect by the authority in the said Act provided:

"And whereas the Honourable and Right Reverend Richard late Bishop of Oxford, by virtue of the said recited provision, has duly prepared and submitted to us the plan contained and fully set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed:

"And whereas the arrangement proposed in the said plan appears to us likely to promote the efficient discharge of the pastoral duties of the said parish of Bampton; we, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that the said plan be carried into effect accordingly.

" SCHEDULE.

" Whereas by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An " Act to carry into effect, with certain modi-" fications, the fourth report of the Commissioners " of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," it is enacted, that with respect to any parish in which both the profits and the spiritual charge are divided between two or more incumbents, each having a mediety or portion of the benefice, a plan may be framed by the bishop of the diocese, with the consent of the patron, and so as not to prejudice the interests of any existing incumbent, for constituting any of such portions separate benefices, and for making such other arrangements as he may judge likely to promote the efficient discharge of pastoral duties in such parishes; and any such plan may be carried into effect by the authority in the said Act provided:

"And whereas the parish of Bampton, in the county and diocese of Oxford, is a parish in which both the profits and the spiritual charge thereof are divided among three incumbents, each having a portion of the benefice within the intent and meaning of the said Act, there being three vicars separately instituted, each to a portion of the said benefice, such three portions being respectively commonly designated by the names of the first portion, the second portion, and the third portion; and the spiritual charge of the said parish is divided between and among the said three portionists, so as to be a charge upon them jointly and equally:

"And whereas the said parish of Bampton comprises the township and hamlets following; that is to say, the township of Bampton, with the hamlet of Weald, containing together a population of 1604; the hamlet of Lew, containing a population of 195; the hamlets of Aston and Cote, containing together a population of 727; the parochial chapelry of New and Old Shifford, with the hamlets of Brighthampton and Chimney, containing together a population of 228; the aggregate population of the whole parish (according to the last census) being 2754:

" And whereas the profits of the said benefice

are now divided and enjoyed among and by the said three portionists, in manner following; that

is to say;

"The incumbent of the first portion enjoys separately a house of residence, with its appurtenances and glebe land allotted to that portion under an Act of Parliament, passed in the fifty-second year of His late Majesty King George the Third; the incumbent of the second portion has a house of residence, with its appurtenances and glebe land allotted to that portion under the same Act; and the incumbent of the third portion has a house of residence, with its appurtenances and glebe land allotted to that portion under the same Act; the said houses of residence being all situated in the said township of Bampton, and the said glebe lands in the same township, and in the said hamlets of Weald and Lew:

"And whereas the residue of the profits and emoluments arising from the said benefice, consisting of tithes and corn rent, is divided equally among the said three portionists in a certain order and course, so that their incomes arising therefrom

are nearly equal:

And the yearly tenths, pensions, synodals, and other ecclesiastical charges payable out of the said benefice, including an annual pension of ten pounds to the dean and chapter of the cathedral church of Exeter, who are the patrons of the said parish and benefice, are paid by the said three portionists in equal shares:

- "And whereas, besides the parish church of Bampton, situate in the said township of Bampton, which affords accommodation for one thousand one hundred persons, there is a newly-erected and consecrated chapel in the said hamlet of Lew affording accommodation for one hundred and sixty persons, a newly-erected and consecrated chapel in the hamlet of Aston affording accommodation for five hundred persons, and an ancient chapel at Shifford affording accommodation for one hundred and sixty persons:
- "And whereas, upon the separation of the said three portions of the said vicarage, as is hereinafter mentioned, it is proposed to provide a more conveniently situated house of residence for the intended new vicarage of Bampton Aston than that now belonging to the said third portion, by mortgage, under the provisions contained in the

Acts in that behalf made and enacted, subject nevertheless to the further provision relating thereto hereinafter contained:

"And whereas it appears to me to be expedient, and likely to promote the efficient discharge of the pastoral duties in the said parish of Bampton, that each of the said three portions of the said parish and benefice should be constituted a separate vicarage and benefice, in conformity with the provisions of the said first-recited Act, and that the most convenient division and arrangement of the said parish and benefice for such purpose would be such as is hereinafter mentioned:

" Now, therefore, I, Richard Bishop of Oxford, with the consent of the said dean and chapter of Exeter, in testimony whereof they have hereunto set their common seal, do hereby recommend and propose, that upon the next avoidance of the said first portion, and upon the consent in writing, under the hand and seal of the then incumbents of the said second and third portions, or either of them who shall then survive and continue incumbent, or at any previous time upon the like consent of the incumbents for the time being of all the said three portions, or of such of them as are or is now existing, the said three several portions shall respectively become and be separate benefices and vicarages in manner following; that is to say, the said first portion shall become a separate benefice and vicarage by the name of 'The Vicarage of Bampton Proper,' and shall comprise and consist of the said township of Bampton and hamlet of Weald, which lie contiguous to each other, having distinct and known boundaries, and having for its church the present parish church of Bampton, and for the house of residence of its vicar, the house of residence now belonging to the incumbent of the said first portion:

"The said second portion shall become, in like manner, a separate benefice and vicarage by the name of 'The Vicarage of Bampton Lew,' and shall comprise and consist of the said hamlet of Lew, having a distinct and known boundary, and having for its church the present chapel of Lew aforesaid, and for the house of residence of its vicar the house of residence now belonging to the incumbent of the said second portion:

"And the said third portion shall become, in the same manner, a separate benefice and vicarage by the name of 'The Vicarage of Bampton Aston,' and shall comprise all the remaining portion of the said parish, consisting of the said parochial chapelry of New and Old Shifford, and the hamlets of Aston, Cote, Brighthampton, and Chimney, and having distinct and known boundaries, and having for its churches the chapels of Aston and Shifford, and for its house of residence the house now belonging to the said third portion, until a more convenient residence shall have been provided as aforesaid.

"And whereas, having reference to the relative parochial charge of the said three vicarages, when so constituted as aforesaid, it appears to me just that the endowments of the said parish and benefice should be divided amongst the incumbents of such vicarages in the manner and proportion hereinafter mentioned: I therefore further recommend and propose, with the like consents, testified as aforesaid, that there be assigned to the Vicar of Bampton Proper, and his successors in perpetuity, the glebe lands at present belonging to the said first and second portions, together with all tithes and tithe rentcharges and income arising from tithes of or within the hamlet of Chimney, and the yearly sum of seventy pounds, part of the said corn rent of Haddon, subject to the appropriation of the yearly sum of sixty pounds, part of the said seventy pounds, towards the liquidation of the charge for building the house of residence for the Vicar of Bampton Aston, and subject also to the payment of the whole of the said pension of ten pounds to the said dean and chapter of Exeter:

"And that there be assigned to the Vicar of Bampton Lew, and his successors in perpetuity, the glebe lands at present belonging to the said third portion, and all tithes, tithe rent-charges, and income arising from tithes of or within the said parish of Clanfield:

"And further, that there be assigned to the Vicar of Bampton Aston, and his successors in perpetuity, all tithes, tithe rent-charges, and income arising from tithes of or within the said hamlets of Aston, Cote, and Brighthampton, and chapelry of New and Old Shifford, together with the remaining ten pounds, part of the said corn rent of Haddon.

"And I further recommend and propose, that the vicar of the said vicarage of Bampton Proper shall bear and pay the tenths and all other ecclesiastical charges now appertaining to the vicar of the said first portion, and also such burden of repair of the chancel of the parish church of Bampton as by law may belong to the vicars of the said three portions; that the vicar of the said vicarage of Bampton Lew shall bear and pay the tenths and all other ecclesiastical charges now appertaining to the vicar of the said second portion, except such burden of repairs of the chancel of Bampton church; and that the vicar of the said vicarage of Bampton Aston shall bear and pay the tenths and all other ecclesiastical charges now appertaining to the vicar of the said third portion, except such burden of repair of chancel as aforesaid.

"And further, that the income of the said third portion, until the severance of the said benefices shall come into operation as aforesaid, and that after such severance the income of the said vicarage of Bampton Aston, together with the said yearly sum of sixty pounds, part of the said seventy pounds assigned to the vicarage of Bampton Proper, may and shall be charged with the repayment of all money to be borrowed by mortgage under the provisions of the Act or Acts of Parliament hereinbefore referred to, and that the said yearly sum of sixty pounds shall be the primary

fund for that purpose, and, subject to such charge, shall revert to the said vicarage of Bampton Proper.

"And I further recommend and propose, that upon the taking effect of such severance as aforesaid, the Reverend Dacres Adams, the present incumbent of the said second portion, or if he shall not then be the incumbent of such portion, then the Reverend Ralph Barnes, the present incumbent of the said third portion, or if he shall not then be the incumbent of such portion, then the incumbent for the time being of the said second portion, shall become and be the vicar of the new vicarage of Bampton Proper; and the said Ralph Barnes, or the incumbent for the time being of the said third portion, shall become and be the vicar of the new vicarage of Bampton Aston; and the said new vicarage of Bampton Lew shall be the vicarage void.

"In witness whereof I, the said bishop, have hereunto set my hand and seal, this twentieth day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five.

And whereas due notice of the said scheme has been given in accordance with the provisions of the said recited Act, and no objection has been made thereto:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Oxford.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury having certified to the Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt, in pursuance of the Act, 10th Geo. 4th, c. 27, sec. 1, that the actual surplus revenue of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, beyond the actual expenditure thereof, for the year ended the 10th day of October 1845, amounted to the sum of five million two hundred and fifty-six thousand three hundred pounds, nine shillings and two pence;

The Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt hereby give notice, that the sum of £1,314,075 2s. 3d. (being one fourth part of the said surplus of £5,256,300 9s. 2d. will be applied, under the provisions of the said Act, between the 7th day of January 1846, and the 5th day of April 1846, to the following purposes, viz.
