HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for Eugland have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled "An Act for carrying into "effect the reports of the Commissioners ap" pointed to consider the state of the Established "Church in England and Wales, with reference "to ecclesiastical duties and revenues, so far as "they relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and "patronage," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the seventeenth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, in the words following, that is to say:

- "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners or England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An "Act for carrying into effect the reports of the "Commissioners appointed to consider the state of the Established Church in England and "Wales, with reference to ecclesiastical duties and revenues, so far as they relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and patronage," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for settling the ecclesiastical jurisdiction in and over certain parishes locally situate in the diocese of Rochester, but now subject to peculiar jurisdiction.
- " Whereas, in and by a scheme prepared by us, and laid before your Majesty in Council, bearing date the eighth day of August, and an Order of your Majesty in Council, ratifying the said scheme, and bearing date the same eighth day of August, in this present year, and since duly gazetted, certain provisions are made for abolishing, upon and after the first day of January next, all peculiar jurisdiction in and over certain parishes and places in the present diocese of Rochester, and subjecting such of them as are therein described to be locally situate within the city and deanry of Rochester to the jurisdiction of the Bishop of Rochester, and of the Archdeacon of Rochester until the archdeaconry of Rochester shall have been suppressed, and then of the Dean of Rochester:
- "And whereas some of the several parishes and places hereinafter named (all which parishes and places are now subject to peculiar jurisdiction) are locally situate on the borders of the said city and deanry of Rochester, but are not surrounded on all sides by portions of such city and deanry, and doubts have therefore been suggested respecting the intent and meaning of the said scheme and Order, so far as it applies to the future ecclesiastical jurisdiction within and over such parishes and places respectively:
- "We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that, in order to remove all such doubts, it be declared and provided by this present scheme, according to the true intent and meaning of ourselves and of the several parties consenting to the said former scheme, that, to all intents and for all the purposes, and subject to all the provisions in that behalf of the said recited Act and of

the said scheme and Order of the eighth day of August last, the several parishes and places first hereinafter named, that is to say, Cliffe, Darenth, Gillingham, the Grange otherwise the Grench, Graine, Ifield, Lidsing, Meopham, and Northfleet, shall be held to be now and henceforth locally situate within the limits of the said city and deanry of Rochester; and the five several parishes and places next hereinafter named, that is to say, Eynsford, Farmingham, Otford, Shoreham, and Stansted, shall be held not to be either now or henceforth locally situate within the same limits, but to be, after the said first day of January next, locally situate within the diocese of Canterbury and the archdeaconry of Maidstone.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas due notice of the said scheme has been given in accordance with the provisions of the Statute in that behalf, and no objection has been made thereto:

"Whereas it is by the secondly-recited Act. enacted, that it shall be lawful, by the authority provided in the first-recited Act, at any time or times within twelve months after the date of the licence of the minister first licensed to any separate district, constituted under the provisions of the same Act, to alter the bounds of such district, although any alteration be not required. with a view to the constituting of another separate district; provided always, that the scheme for making any such alteration shall be subject to all the provisions relating to schemes for constituting separate districts under the said firstrecited Act; and that any portion of any such separate district, which by any such alteration as aforesaid shall become detached or excluded therefrom, shall, to all intents and purposes, again belong to, and form part of, the parish chapelry, or district out of which such portion was taken, upon such separate district being originally constituted, or to and of any new district, as shall be determined by the like, authority:

"And whereas the said district of Saint James, Burnley, was duly constitued out of the parochial chapelry of Burnley, in the parish of Whalley, in the said county of Lancaster, and diocese of Chester, under the provisions of the said first-recited Act, by a scheme prepared by us, and ratified by an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, and since duly gazetted:

"And whereas it has since been represented to us, and appears to us to be expedient, that the bounds of such district should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

" Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Bird Bishop of Chester, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that the bounds of the said district of Saint James, Burnley, shall be altered as follows; that is to say, instead of that part of the imaginary line described in the schedule to the scheme hereinbefore mentioned as 'extending towards the south east from the river Calder, along the north eastern boundary of the workhouse premises in Burnley (marked a on the map or plan therewith), and continuing in a straight direction to a point opposite to the middle of Sydney-street, at the northern end thereof (marked b as aforesaid), and thence southward, along the middle of such street, to a point opposite to the middle of Bank-house street (marked c as aforesaid); and thence eastward, along the middle of such last-mentioned street, to a point opposite to the middle of Curzon-street (marked d as aforesaid)," and forming the northern boundary of the said district of Saint James, Burnley; such district shall be bounded on the northern side thereof by the East Lancashire Railway; and the imaginary line extending along the middle of Curzon-street (or, as it is now called, Parsonage-street), and now forming part of the eastern boundary of the said district, shall be extended northward along the middle of such last-mentioned street as far as the railway aforesaid; and that all that part of the said parochial chapelry of Burnley, now situate within the altered and extended boundaries so herein recommended as aforesaid, all which is delineated and set forth in the map

or plan hereunto annexed, shall henceforth be united to and form part of the said district of Saint James, Burnley; and that all that part of the said district which by reason of the alteration of the boundaries so herein recommended and proposed as aforesaid shall become and be detached and excluded therefrom, shall to all intents and purposes again belong to and form part of the said parochial chapelry of Burnley.

"And we further recommend and propose; that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the meantime, consent to the same. and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, whenduly licensed according to the same Act, shall bepermanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereinafter provided:

"And whereas the district of Oldbury-cum-Langley, in the said parish of Hales Owen, is of great extent, and contains a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of such district hereinafter mentioned and described, such part not at present containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Bishop of Worcester, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said district of Oldbury-cum-Langley, described in the schedule hereunto-annexed,—all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—shall be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, "The District of Langley."

"And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shallhave been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds; or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

- " The district of LANGLEY, being-
- "All that part of the district of Oldbury-cum-Langley, in the parish of Hales Owen, in the Worcester.

county and diocese of Worcester, situate on the western side of an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked a on the map or plan hereunto annexed) in the middle of the Wolverhampton Level of the Birmingham Canal, where it crosses the boundary between such district and the parish of . "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to make better provision for the spiritual care." of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish of Hackney, in the county of Middlesex, and in the diocese of London.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it

is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel o any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the mean time, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereinafter provided:

"And whereas the said parish of Hackney is of great extent, and contains a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of such parish hereinafter mentioned and described, such part not at present containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Charles James Bishop of London, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Hackney, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth

in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,shall be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, " The District of Homerton."

" And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid by equal halfyearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

" And whereas it is by the said Act further

aforesaid, at any time to assign the right of patronage of any such district or new parish as aforesaid, and the nomination of the minister or perpetual curate thereof respectively, either in perpetuity, or for one or more nomination or nominations, to any ecclesiastical corporation, aggregate or sole, or to either of the Universities of Oxford, Cambridge, or Durham, or to any college therein respectively, or to any person or persons, or the nominee or nominees of such person or persons or body respectively, upon condition of such corporation, university, college, person or persons contributing to the permanent endowment of such minister or perpetual curate, or towards providing a church or chapel for the use of the inhabitants of such district or new parish, in such proportion, and in such manner, as shall be approved by the like authority:

"And whereas certain persons have contributed and deposited with Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches certain sums of money towards providing a church or chapel within the limits of the district of Homerton, so herein recommended to be constituted; and it has been agreed by such persons that such church or chapel, when erected and completed, shall be offered for approval by us, and for consecration as the church or chapel of the said district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof:

" And whereas the principal contributors towards the said church or chapel have, by an instrument in writing under their hands, nominated to us the Bishop of London for the time being, as the patron in perpetuity of the said district of Homerton:

"We, therefore, further recommend propose, that the right of patronage of the said district of Homerton, and, so soon as the same shall have become a new parish as aforesaid, the right of patronage thereof, and the nomination of the minister or perpetual curate of such district or new parish, as the case may be, shall be wholly assigned to, and absolutely vested in, the said Charles James Bishop of London, and his successors, bishops of London, for ever.

" And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from enacted, that it shall be lawful, by the authority recommending and proposing any other measures

relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

" The district of Homerton, being-

Glyn, to a point (marked f as aforesaid) in the middle of the canal called the New Cut, in Hackney Marsh, and thence towards the south east, along the middle of such canal, to a point (marked g as aforesaid) in the middle of Homerton-bridge, and thence eastward, along the middle of the road leading to Temple-mills, across the bridge over the river Lca, and thence in a straight direction eastward as far as the boundary of the said parish at Temple-mills aforesaid; and on all other sides thereof by the original boundary of the said parish of Hackney."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron of the church of the parish out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constitued shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and whereas one calendar month has expired since such draft was so transmitted, and no objections have made thereto:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of London.
