HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with "certain modifications, the fourth report of the "Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and "Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to explain and amend two several Acts relating "to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in

Council a scheme, bearing the seventeenth day of December one thousand eight hundred and fortyfive, in the words following, that is to say:

- "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act " to carry into effect, with certain modifications, "the fourth report of the Commissioners of " Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to explain and " amend two several Acts relating to the Eccle-" siastical Commissioners for England," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for ratifying and carrying into effect a certain agreement made between us and the Prebendary of Kinvaston, in the collegiate church of Wolverhampton:
- "Whereas it is by the said recited Acts enacted, that, for the purpose of fully carrying into effect the provisions thereof, any arrangement may from time to time be made, with the consent in writing under the hand of any prebendary, for the sale, transfer, or exchange of any lands, tithes, or other hereditaments in the possession or enjoyment of such prebendary, or for substituting in any case any lands, tithes, or other hereditaments for any money payment, or any money payment for any lands, tithes, or other hereditaments:
- "And whereas, under other provisions and for the purposes of the said recited Acts, the whole property of the said prebend of Kinvaston will, upon the next vacancy thereof, become absolutely vested in us; but the Reverend Augustus Edward Hobart was, at the passing of the first-recited Act, and now is the prebendary thereof:
- "And whereas, under the hereinbefore recited enactments, and by virtue of the general authority of the said recited Acts, we have entered into an agreement with the said prebendary, a copy whereof is annexed by way of schedule to this scheme; and the said agreement has been duly executed by the said Augustus Edward Hobart under his hand:
- "We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that the said agreement, and all acts;

matters, and things done, and to be done, for carrying the same into effect, shall be valid and effectual in law, and binding upon the parties thereto, and upon all other persons whomsoever to all intents and purposes.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters herein contained, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or either of them.

"SCHEDULE.

"Articles of agreement made this fourteenth day of January, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, between the Reverend Augustus Edward Hobart, of Walton, near Loughborough, in the county of Leicester, Clerk, Prebendary of the prebend of Kinyaston otherwise Kinyarston, founded in the Collegiate Church or King's Free Royal Chapel of Wolverhampton, in the county of Stafford, of the one part, and the Ecclesiastical Commissionrs for England of the other part:

said, with all and singular the rights, members, and appurtenances thereunto belonging; and all tithes and all messuages, houses, edifices, buildings, shops, cellars, workhouses, orchards, gardens, lands, tenements, meadows, leasows, closes, pastures, field ground rent, services, woods, ways, waters, easements, pensions, portions, oblations, obventions, profits, emoluments, hereditaments, and advantages: whatsoever, save such messuages, gardens, stables, yards, shops, warehouse, vault, timber-yard, engine-house, coal-house, and hereditaments, situate. in Wolverhampton aforesaid, parcel of the corps; belonging to such prebend as were given and conveyed away in exchange for other lands situate in Wolverhampton aforesaid, in lieu thereof, and which other lands are comprised and comprehended in and intended to be demised by the now reciting presents to the said manor or prebend belonging or in anywise appertaining or reputed, accepted, taken, or known as part, parcel, or member ofthe said manor or prebend, in whose tenure, occupation, or possession soever the same, or any part thereof, were situate and should happen to, arise, spring, grow, or be due; all which, or the. greatest part of which tenements and premises, bythe now reciting presents granted and demised, ormentioned or intended so to be, were situate, lying, and being in the township of Wolverhampton and Kinvaston otherwise Kinvarston, one or both of them, in the said county of Stafford, together with the view of frankpledge of all courts, courts leet, courts baron, and all other courts, perquisites and profits of courts, privileges, franchises, customs, chief rents, fines, heriots, reliefs, jurisdictions, and services whatsoever due, incident, or belonging to the said manor, prebends, leets, or courts, or used or accustomed to and with the said prebend, or thereunto belonging or appertaining, with their and every of their rights, members, and appurtenances; and also all those seven; pieces or parcels of land, formerly four or five pieces, situate and being in the township of Wolverhampton, and in the parish of Wolverhampton aforesaid, and lying next or near to the turnpike road leading from Wolverhampton aforesaid to Cannock, in the said county of Stafford, containing, by admeasurement, seventeen acres, or there-. abouts, be the same more or less, theretofore in the occupation of Nathaniel Stirk, Francis Evans, George Windsor, David Cole, and Sarah Evans, and late of the widow Bennett, John Chedworth,

clesiastical Commissioners, or to such persons or person, and by such deeds and assurances, and in such manner as the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners shall direct, all the estate, right, title, and interest whatsoever of him the said Augustus Edward Hobart, as from the first day of January nstant, of and in all and singular the manors, messuages, farms, lands, rents, tithes, rents charge, and other commutations in lieu of tithes, tenements, and hereditaments comprised in the said hereinbefore in part recited indenture of lease, and all other the manors, messuages, farms, lands, rents, tithes, rents charge, and other commutations in lieu of tithes, tenements, hereditaments, fines, fees, perquisites, pensions, portions, reliefs, heriots, and all and every other sums and sum of money belonging, coming, arising, accruing, or payable, or to belong, come, arise, accrue, or be payable to him the said Augustus Edward Hobart, in right of his said prebend, including the hereditaments, rights, and premises, excepted out of and reserved from the said hereinbefore recited indenture of lease (except as hereinafter mentioned), and freed and discharged of and from all rights, titles, interests, incumbrances, claims, or demands whatsoever, at any time heretofore, or to be hereafter made, created, suffered, or occasioned by the said Augustus Edward Hobart, other than and except the said hereinbefore in part recited indenture of lease; and also that he the said Augustus Edward Hobart will, on the request of the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners deliver over to them or to any other person or persons they may appoint all counterparts of leases, terriers, rentals, maps, plans, and all other documents whatsoever relating to or in any way affecting the said estates and hereditaments, or any of them which are now in his custody, possession, or power, or which he can or may procure without suit at law or in equity, and shall and will afford to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners all the information and assistance in his power, when required so to do, in order to their obtaining full knowledge respecting the said prebendal estates, and the leases thereof, and especially the full particulars of the messuages, lands, and hereditaments comprised in the hereinbefore recited lease, and all other hereditaments, rights, and interests belonging to such prebend; and the said Augustus Edward Hobart hereby covenants and declares, that he hath not, since the twenty-first day of December one thousand eight hundred and

twenty-seven, granted, and will not at any time. hereafter grant, any renewed or other leases of any part of the said estates and hereditaments, and will not execute any grant or regrant of or admission to any copyhold or customary hereditaments, and will not receive any of the said rents, tithes, rents charge, commutations, fines, fees, perquisites, pensions, portions, reliefs, heriots, or other sum or sums of money which, since the said first day of January instant, have accrued, arisen, or become due to him in right of his said prebend, nor exercise any other right of ownership, or other power or privilege whatsoever, in relation to the said premises; and it is hereby declared and agreed, that neither this agreement, nor any deed or instrument to be executed in pursuance thereof, shall operate to confirm or give effect to any lease heretofore granted, or expressed to be granted, of any part of the said prebendal estates which is or may be void or voidable, at law or in equity, or in any way affect the right of the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and either in their own names, or in that of the said Augustus Edward Hobart, to recover from any person or persons whomsoever compensation for any now present or future waste or dilapidations in the said estates and hereditaments, or any part thereof, but that the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners shall be at liberty to take any proceedings they may think fit for the purpose of setting aside any such lease, or on account of any such waste or dilapidations as aforesaid, either during the life or continuance of the incumbency of the said Augustus Edward Hobart, subject to the proviso next hereinafter contained, or after his death or determination of his incumbency, in like manner as if this agreement, or any such deed or instrument, had not been made or executed; provided always, that in case any proceedings shall be taken by the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for setting aside any such lease, on account of any such waste or dilapidations as aforesaid during the lifetime or incumbency of the said Augustus Edward Hobart, they the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners shall indemnify and save harmless the said Augustus Edward Hobart, his heirs, executors, and administrators against all losses, costs, charges, and expences which he may pay or incur, or to which he may become liable in consequence, thereof, either under any express or implied covenant, on his part, for the quiet enjoyment of the premises comprised in such lease, or otherwise; and

the said Augustus Edward Hobart doth hereby further undertake and agree, that the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and their successors, shall have full power and authority, by themselves or by any other person or persons, to be from time to time appointed by them, and at the costs and charges of the funds vested in them in virtue of their said office, to use the name and act as the attorney of the said Augustus Edward Hobart, in asking, demanding, suing for, recovering, or receiving and giving receipts for the said rents, tithes, rents charge, commutations for tithes, fines, fees, perquisites, pensions, portions, reliefs, heriots, and other sum and sums of money, and settling and adjusting all accounts, matters, and things relating thereto, and also for setting aside any lease or leases heretofore granted, or expressed to be granted, of any part or parts of the said estates and hereditaments, and recovering possession of the same estates and hereditaments, or in any proceedings, either in law or in equity, relating to any waste or dilapidations as aforesaid; and, in consideration of the agreements hereinbefore contained on the part of the said Augustus Edward Hobart, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners hereby undertake and agree, with and out of the funds placed at their disposal by the said Acts, some or one of them, to pay to the said Augustus Edward Hobart, so long as he shall continue prebendary of the said prebend, the said annuity or yearly sum of one hundred and thirty pounds, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of July and the first day of January in every year, the said annual sum to commence from the said first day of January instant, and the first half-yearly payment thereof to be made on the first day of July now next ensuing, and a proportionate part of the said annual sum up to the time of the said Augustus Edward Hobart's ceasing to be the incumbent of the said prebend, in respect of the portion which shall have elapsed of the then current half year to be paid to the said Augustus Edward Hobart, his executors or administrators, within twenty-one days after his ceasing to be incumbent of the said prebend as aforesaid, and the said annual sum to be paid free of all deductions, except on account of the income tax; and, for securing the said annuity, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners agree to give, and the said Augustus Edward Hobart agrees to accept, a written undertaking, under the seal of

the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for payment thereof, out of the funds and revenues placed at their disposal by the said Acts of Parliament, some or one of them, and containing a declaration that the rents and profits of the said prebendal estates shall not stand specifically charged by way of equitable security with or towards the payment thereof; provided always, that nothing herein contained shall alter or affect the right or interest of the said Augustus Edward Hobart in or to any advowson or rights of patronage or presentation belonging to him in right of his said prebend; and, lastly, it is hereby agreed by the the said Augustus Edward Hobart and by the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that the costs of this agreement, and of making the valuation upon which the calculation for the said annuity is based and calculated, shall be borne by the said Augustus Edward Hobart and the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners in equal proportions; and that the costs of all deeds and assurances for conveying and assigning or assuring the said estates and premises to, or in trust for, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners shall be paid by them; and the costs of the said undertaking, to be given by the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for payment of the said annuity, shall be paid by the said Augustus Edward Hobart: in witness whereof the said Augustus Edward Hobart hath hereunto set his hand and seal, and the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners have hereunto affixed their seal, the day and year first above written.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to "make better provision for the spiritual care of po-"pulous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for authorizing the sale of certain property lately belonging to the prebend of Sacrista, in the collegiate church of Southwell.

" Whereas it is by the said recited Act enacted, that all the same and the like powers and rights of ownership as are possessed and enjoyed respecting and over any lands, tenements, or other hereditaments whatsoever, by any absolute owner thereof, shall be enjoyed by us with respect to and over all or any lands, tithes, rent charges, tenements, and other hereditaments vested in us under certain Acts therein mentioned (being the Acts under which the property hereinafter described is so vested in us), and may, subject to the provisions of the same Acts and of the now reciting Act, be exercised by us by proper instruments in writing; duly executed according to law, with a certain proviso respecting the application of every sum of money received as the consideration or purchase money for the sale, transfer, or conveyance by us of any such lands, tithes, tenements, or other hereditaments, or of any estate or interest therein. and with a further proviso, that none of such lands, tithes, tenements, or other hereditaments be sold. transferred, or conveyed except by the authority of a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying the same:

ninth year of the reign of His said Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend " and render more effectual an Act, passed in the " last session of Parliament, for building, and " promoting the building, of additional churches " in populous parishes," particular districts were, by virtue of and in conformity with two Orders of your Majesty in Council, respectively dated the twenty-third day of June one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, and the fifteenth day of January one thousand eight hundred and fortytwo, duly assigned to the consecrated churches or chapels, called Trinity Chapel and Saint Mary's Chapel, both situate in the parish of Saint Mary, Lambeth, in the county of Surrey, and within the diocese of Winchester:

"That the said Orders in Council did not direct that marriages should be performed in the said chapels:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending the said districts so assigned to the said two chapels, it appears to them to be expedient that banns of marriage should hereafter be published, and that marriages should hereafter be performed in the said chapels, called Trinity Chapel and Saint Mary's Chapel; and that a supplemental Order for that purpose should be made, pursuant to the provisions of the fourth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the seventh and eighth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An "Act concerning banns and marriages in " certain district churches or chapels;" and that all the fees arising from the publication of banns of marriage and the performance of marriages in the said chapels should be paid and belong to the present Rector of the said parish of Saint Mary, Lambeth, during his incumbency thereof, but upon and after his avoidance of the rectory of such parish the said fees should belong and be paid to the incumbents for the time being of the said chapels, called Trinity Chapel and Saint Mary's Chapel:

"That the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Richard Lord Bishop of Winchester has been obtained thereto, as required by the lastmentioned Act; in testimony whereof, the said Charles Richard Lord Bishop of Winchester has signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns and the performance of marriages, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.
