last. The Commons of this City have resolved to make his Excellency a Present of 10000 Florins, and to make it up 25000 if he be confirmed in this Government, which he has accepted and given them thanks, but has ordered the faid mony to be employed towards the paying the Soldiers. The Letters from Vienna of the 26th of the last month tell us they had an account from the Imperial Camp before Newbeusel that the Besiegers had almost dryed the Dirch, that the Miners had paffed it, and had begun a Mine in the Wall of the place; That they had dismounted all the Enemics Cannon, and had done great Execution with their Bombs. Waldeck was gone from Vienna to Hungary with a Commission to command at the Siege of New-beusel, in case the Duke of Lorrain march against the Enemy, as his Highness was resolved to do so foon as he heard that they moved towards Gran, The Infantry of the Elector of Cologne's Forces arrived the 25 pall at Vienna.

The first Instant the Prince of Hague, August 3. Orange accompanied with the Count de Solms and several other Persons of Quality, went from hence to Breda; The Princess will remove the next week with the whole Court to Dieren, where the Prince will meet her Royal Highness. The Sieur Fuebs Envoy Extraordinary from the Elector of Brandenburgh, hath had several Conferences with the Deputies of this State concerning the Arrears of Subsidies that are due to his Electoral Highness. The States General having some time since given orders for the Cleansing and Deepning the Lower Rhin and Isles; they have appointed Commissioners to go and see what progress has been made in this Work, who are for this purpole accordingly gone to Scenk Scans.

The Heer Benting returned hi-Hague, August 7. ther the 15th Instant from England, having been sent the his Maiestv by the Prince of Orange. The States of Friezeland have, we are told, written to the States General to acquaint them that they have disbanded a Sergeant, a Drummer, and five Soldiers out of each Company of Foot in their Pay. It's believed that the Sieur Fuchs Negotiation will be very specdily terminated to the fatisfaction of both fides. The faid Sieur Fuchs and the Sieur d'Amerongen are gone to Amsterdam to endeavor to compose the Differences between the West-India Company of these Countries, and some of the Subjects of the Elector of Brandenburg, about the Ship called the Arms of Brandenburg, which was taken some time fince by the Ships of the faid Company. The Letters from Copenbagen tell us, that the King of Denmark is expected back fee mi Norway about the middle of this month.

Paris, August 11. The 19th of Fune the French Fleet commanded by the Mareschal d'Estree came to an Anchor in the Road of Tripoli. The 20th the Men of War and the Galiots carrying Mortars, took their Posts; The 22, in the morning they began to t row their Bombs with great fuccess, killing many of the furks, and setting fire to the Town in several places; The 24th the Tripolins being in a great conflernation, fent off in a Boat with a White Flag, a very old Man, Father in Law of Baba Haffan, who had formerly been their Dey, who coming on Board the Marcichal d'Estree, told him he was sent to desire a Peace; The Mareschal answered he would grant it them upon condition that they should restore all the Christian Slaves taken under French Colors, together with all the Effects taken from the Subjects of France; and that ten of the Principal Officers of the Divan thould be put into his hands as Hoftages. The 25th and 26th was spent in Negotiation, and the Tripolins at last agreed to pay 500 thou-

fand Florins for the Prizes they had taken from the French. The 27th they paid part of this sum in Silver, Gold, Jewels, &c. (the Mareschal d'Estree giving them 20 days to pay the rest ) and restored a Ship of Marfeilles then in Port with 180 French Slaves. The first Instant the Sieur Spanbeim Envoy Extraordinary from the Elector of Brandenburgh, had Audience of the King at Versailles, conducted by the Sieur de Boneuil Introductor of Ambassadors. Signior Ranuzzi the Popes Nuncio has been to Compliment the Duke de Bourbon upon his Marriage with Madamoiselle de Nantes. The Court will go about the end of this month to Chambor. The Marquis de Villars is returned from his Embassie in Denmarke.

Whitehall, Fuly 31. This day the Right Honorable George Earl of Berkeley was Sworn of His Majesties most Honorable Privy Council, and accordingly took his place at the Board.

Whiteball, August 4. This day the Parliament met at Westminster according to their last Adjournment; And my Lord Treasurer, whom His Majesty has appointed to perform the part of my Lord Keeper in his absence, having declared to the House of Lords. His Majesties Pleasure, That they should again Adjourn to the 9th of November next, And the same having been signified to the House of Commons by the Earl of Middleton one of His Majesties Principal Secretaries of State, Both Houses accordingly Adjourned to the 9th of November next.

This Afternoon Their Majeslies went from hence to Windsor to pass sometime there.
