"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual

‘ care of populous parishes,’ have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish of Davenham and the chapelry of Witton, in the parish of Great Budworth, all in the county and diocese of Chester.

“ Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the mean time, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be

permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereafter provided :

“ And whereas the said parish of Davenham and chapelry of Witton are respectively of great extent, and contain a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular parts of the said parish and of the said chapelry hereinafter mentioned and described neither of which parts at present contains within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be together constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth :

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Bird Bishop of Chester, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all those parts of the said parish of Davenham, and also all those parts of the said chapelry of Witton, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all which parts, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—shall be together constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named “ The District of Dane Bridge.”

“ And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved

by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ SCHEDULE.

“ The district of DANE BRIDGE, being—

“ All those parts of the parish of Davenham and the chapelry of Witton, in the parish of Great Budworth, in the county and diocese of Chester, comprised within and bounded by an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked *a* on the map or plan hereunto annexed) in the centre of the bridge over the river Dane called ‘ Dane Bridge,’ and thence extending first northward along the middle of High-street, in the township of Northwich, in the said chapelry of Witton, as far as the canal connecting the river Weaver with the said river Dane, and thence

towards the south east, along the south western bank of the said canal, as far as the boundary between the said parish of Davenham and chapelry of Witton, near the western end of the street or road called Church-walk, and thence first eastward along such boundary, as far as Briery Eye Meadow, and thence westward along the northern boundary or fence of such meadow, and continuing in a straight direction as far as the said river Dane, and thence southward along the western bank of such river as far as the southern fence or boundary of a certain garden and premises (marked *b* as aforesaid) belonging to Mr. Joseph Dunn, and adjoining the high road to Middlewich, and thence westward along such fence or boundary as far as the middle of the said high road, and thence southward along the middle of the same high road to a point (marked *c* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Dock-lane, and thence towards the south west, along the middle of such lane, as far as a certain ditch (marked *d* as aforesaid) running into the said river Weaver, and thence towards the north west along the middle of such ditch as far as the eastern bank of such last-mentioned river, and thence northward along the said eastern bank of the said river Weaver as far as the said river Dane, and thence eastward along the middle of such last-mentioned river to the point where the said imaginary line commenced.”

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the

duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

“And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ SCHEDULE.

“The district of SAINT SIMON, LIVERPOOL, being—

under the provisions contained in the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled “ An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes,” be assigned to the church called “ Trinity Church,” recently erected and consecrated at Matfen, in the said parish of Stamfordham, and that such district should consist of the westernmost part of the said parish, and be bounded as follows, that is to say :

“ On the north by the chapelry of Kirkheaton in the parish of Kirkharle; on the north west by the chapelry of Bingfield, in the parish of Saint John Lee; and on the south west by the chapelry of Halton, in the parish of Corbridge; on the south by the parish of Bywell Saint Peter; and on the east by the remaining part of the parish of Stamfordham, from which it is separated by proceeding from the said parish of Bywell Saint Peter, in a northerly direction, along the road and the eastern fence of the enclosures, marked on the tithe commutation map, Nos. 189, 178, and 177; it then proceeds easterly along the turnpike road to the south east corner of the enclosure, No. 159; from which point it proceeds in a northerly direction along the eastern fences of Nos. 159 and 149, to the southern fence of No. 136; along which fence it turns easterly, and then northerly along the eastern fence thereof, and of Nos. 137, 115, 103, and 114; it then crosses the road and proceeds northerly along the eastern fences of Nos. 70, 60, 41, 201, 23, and 8; from the north east corner of No. 8, it proceeds easterly along the southern fence of No. 98, and then northerly along the eastern fence thereof, and of No. 91; it then crosses the road to the south eastern corner of No. 81; and then proceeds northerly along the eastern fence, and of No. 62 to the road; it then takes a westerly direction along the road as far as the eastern fence of No. 35; at which point it proceeds northerly to its northern fence, and then turns westerly along that fence as far as the eastern fence of No. 31; from which it proceeds in a northerly direction along the eastern fences of Nos. 31, 16, and 15; then westerly along the northern fence of No. 15, as far as the eastern fence of No. 131; from which it proceeds northerly

along the eastern fences of Nos. 131, 124, 101, and 103, to the southern fence of No. 83; along which fence it proceeds easterly, and then northerly along the same to No. 61; it then proceeds along the southern and eastern fences of No. 61; and then westward to the south east corner of No. 63, from which point it turns northerly along the eastern fences of Nos. 63, 64, 47, and 33, crosses the road, and continues along the eastern boundaries of Nos. 12 and 13; it then turns easterly along part of the south side of No. 7, and then northerly along the east side thereof, till it reaches the said chapelry of Kirkheaton, as shewn on the plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured blue:

“ That banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said church; and that the fees arising therefrom should be paid and belong to the Minister of such church:

“ That the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Lord Bishop of Durham has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said Edward Lord Bishop of Durham has signed and sealed this representation :

“ Your Majesty’s Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet.”

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.
