The Duke of fuliers ari ivid laft night at Brugh, two German miles from hence, having haftned his return to give the greater vigdr by his prefence to the Emperor's Com-And the Empetor, we are told, has writmillion. ten to the Directors of the Circle of Wellphalia to furnish their Quota of Troops in cale there shall be need of them to leduce this City to their Duty. They write from Heydelbeig that the Elector Palatin was to make as yellerday his Publick Entry into That'City.

Bruffers, August : 7. Parn, August 22. The King has fixed it is journey to Chamber for the 30th of this month. The Matquis de Saignelay parted from hence the last week to visit our Perts in Britany and Provence. The King has named the Abbot of Bezons to be Bilhop of Aires, and the Abbot of Moretz to be Bilhop of Rice. The News we had of the arrival of the New Spain Fleet, is confirmed. The last Letters from Germany gave an account that the Duke of Lorrain was marched with 35000 Men to fight the Turks who had befieged Gran.

Tork, August 8. This Evening was brought hither his Majefties Royal Charter to this City by Sir Henry Thompson of Cafflegate and Mr. Scot, being met at, fome diffance from hence by a great many bloffe and Foot to the number of near 5000, and received at the Gate of the City by the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Common Council in their Formalities, who paffed from thence amidft the continued Acclamations of the People, with Drums beating and Trumpats founding to the Lord Mayor's Houle, where the whole Company drank their Majefties Healths; The Streets were filled with Bonfites, the Mulick played, the Bells rung, and nothing was omitted that might on this occation express the Duty and Loyalty of the Inhabitants of this City.
