

to Devizes, by a line drawn, in a southerly direction, down the middle of the said last-mentioned road from Chippenham to Devizes as far as the road to West Brook Green; on or towards the south, the boundary is formed by proceeding along the middle of the said last-mentioned road to West Brook Green in a westerly direction, including also, within the said consolidated chapelry of Chittoe, all the houses abutting on the south side of the said road, and being within a line drawn, at a distance of eighty feet from the middle of the said road, as far as the westernmost side of West Brook Green; the boundary then turns, in a northerly direction, up the western side of the said green, as far as West-lane; when it proceeds, in a westerly direction, to the last cottage in the said lane, including all the cottages abutting on the south side of the said lane within the said consolidated chapelry of Chittoe; it then turns northerly through Prickmoor Wood till it reaches Chittoe Brook, along the course of which brook it proceeds westerly to the point where the three parishes of Bishops Cannings, Melksham, and Bromham meet; and on the west, the boundary is formed by the parish of Melksham, as is more particularly shewn on the map hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured pink and green:

“Your Majesty’s Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that it has been mutually agreed between the patrons of the parish churches of the said parish of Bishops Cannings and Bromham, with the approbation of your Majesty’s said Commissioners, and also with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Bishop of Salisbury, in whose diocese the said parishes are situate, that the right of presentation, nomination, and appointment of an incumbent or perpetual curate to the said church of Saint Mary and consolidated chapelry of Chittoe should belong to, be in, and be exercised, when occasion may require, by the said Edward Bishop of Salisbury, and by his successors, bishops of Salisbury, for ever:

“That the consents of the said Edward Bishop of Salisbury, as Bishop of the diocese, and also of the Dean and Chapter of the cathedral church of Saint Mary the Virgin at Salisbury, as patrons of the parish church of the said parish of Bishops Cannings, and of Charlotte Starky, of Spey-park, in the said county of Wilts, widow

as patron, in trust, of the parish church of the said parish of Bromham, have been severally obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section before stated; and in testimony whereof, the said Edward Bishop of Salisbury, the said Dean and Chapter of the said cathedral church of Saint Mary the Virgin at Salisbury, and the said Charlotte Starky, have severally signed and sealed this representation:

“Your Majesty’s Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet.”

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed consolidation and assignment be accordingly made and effected, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.

A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

WHEREAS by our Order in Council of this day’s date, we were graciously pleased, for the reasons therein contained, to annul the Royal Proclamation of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, of the third day of February one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, directing that distribution should be made of the net proceeds of prizes captured from the enemy, of captures and seizures under the several Acts passed relating to the revenues of customs, and to trade and navigation, for the abolition of the slave trade, and for the capture and destruction of piratical vessels, and of the rewards conferred for the same, according to the scheme therein set forth; and it is expedient that provision should be made by us for the future distribution of such proceeds or rewards; we do make known to all our loving subjects, and all others whom it may concern, by this our Proclamation, by and with the advice and consent of our Privy Council, that our royal will and pleasure is, and we do hereby direct, that the distribution of such proceeds and rewards shall be made in the following manner, viz.

That flag officers or officer, commodores of the first class, and captains of the fleet, shall have one sixteenth of the net proceeds arising from
