" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish of Saint Ives, in the county of Cornwall, and in the diocese of Exeter.

" Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to

day, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the meantime, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council, that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereafter provided :

“ And whereas the said parish of Saint Ives is of great extent, and contains a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of such parish hereinafter mentioned and described, such part not at present containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth :

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Bishop of Exeter, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Saint Ives, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—shall be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, “ The District of Halsétown.”

“ And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the

first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ SCHEDULE.

“ The district of HALSETOWN, being—

“ All that part of the parish of Saint Ives, in the county of Cornwall, and in the diocese of Exeter, situate on the southern and south western sides of an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked *a* on the map or plan hereunto annexed) where a certain public footpath in front of a range of houses known by the name of Primrose-valley joins the north eastern boundary of the said parish, and thence extending towards the south west along the middle of such public footpath to the road leading from Saint Ives to Lelant, and thence northward along the middle of such road to a point (marked *b* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of the old road to Lelant aforesaid; and thence towards the north west along the middle of such last-mentioned road to a point (marked *c* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Belyer's-lane, and thence towards the south west along the middle of such lane to a point (marked *d* as aforesaid) opposite to the south eastern corner of a certain field called Taylor's field, and numbered 1403 on the tithe commutation map of the said parish of Saint Ives deposited at Saint Ives parsonage; and thence along the south eastern and south western boundary fences of such field, and along the south western boundary fence of another field numbered 1307 on the said tithe commutation map, and along the south western and northern boundary fences of another field numbered 1302 on the same map, and along the northern boundary fences of two other fields numbered respectively 1308 and 1307 on the same map, to the

constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, "The District of East Knottingley."

"And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures

relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

"The district of EAST KNOTTINGLEY, being—

"All that part of the township of Knottingley, in the parish of Pontefract, in the county and diocese of York, situate on the eastern side of an imaginary line extending northward from the southern boundary of the said township, along the middle of Wormersley-road, across Weeland-road, along the middle of Wood and Smallpages-road, across the Goole and Knottingley Canal, and along the middle of Bendle's-road and Primrose-hill, and thence continuing in a straight direction northward, through Darnbrook's-yard and Bell's-yard, and across the Air-street, to the northern boundary of the said township of Knottingley."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbent and patron of the church of the parish, and the incumbent and patron of the church or chapel of the chapelry, out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and whereas one calendar month has expired since such draft was so transmitted, and certain objections to the said scheme, offered by the incumbent of the chapelry of Knottingley, have been laid before Her Majesty in Council, together with the said scheme:

And whereas the said scheme has, notwithstanding such objections, been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of York.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the ninth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the further amendment of the church building Acts," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of April one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, viz.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parishes of Bishops Cannings and Bromham, in the county of Wilts, and within the diocese of Salisbury, it appears to them to be expedient to unite and consolidate certain contiguous parts of the said parishes of Bishops Cannings and Bromham, and to form the same into one consolidated chapelry for the consecrated church of Saint Mary, situate at Chittoe, in the said parish of Bishops Cannings, for all ecclesiastical purposes, under the provisions of the ninth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the further amendment of the church building Acts;" and that such consolidated chapelry should be called, "The Consolidated Chapelry of Chittoe;" and be bounded as follows, that is to say :

"On the north by the parish of Lacock; on the north east, and partly on the east, by that part of the consolidated district of Christ Church, Derry-hill, which is taken from the parishes of Chippenham and Bishops Cannings; and on other part of the east, that is to say, from the point where such consolidated district meets the roads from Calne to Melksham and from Chippenham to Devizes, by a line drawn, in a southerly di-

rection, down the middle of the said last-mentioned road from Chippenham to Devizes as far as the road to West Brook Green; on or towards the south, the boundary is formed by proceeding along the middle of the said last-mentioned road to West Brook Green in a westerly direction, including also, within the said consolidated chapelry of Chittoe, all the houses abutting on the south side of the said road, and being within a line drawn, at a distance of eighty feet from the middle of the said road, as far as the westernmost side of West Brook Green; the boundary then turns, in a northerly direction, up the western side of the said green, as far as West-lane; when it proceeds, in a westerly direction, to the last cottage in the said lane, including all the cottages abutting on the south side of the said lane within the said consolidated chapelry of Chittoe; it then turns northerly through Prickmoor Wood till it reaches Chittoe Brook, along the course of which brook it proceeds westerly to the point where the three parishes of Bishops Cannings, Melksham, and Bromham meet; and on the west, the boundary is formed by the parish of Melksham, as is more particularly shewn on the map hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured pink and green :

"Your Majesty's Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that it has been mutually agreed between the patrons of the parish churches of the said parish of Bishops Cannings and Bromham, with the approbation of your Majesty's said Commissioners, and also with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Bishop of Salisbury, in whose diocese the said parishes are situate, that the right of presentation, nomination, and appointment of an incumbent or perpetual curate to the said church of Saint Mary and consolidated chapelry of Chittoe should belong to, be in, and be exercised, when occasion may require, by the said Edward Bishop of Salisbury, and by his successors, bishops of Salisbury, for ever :

"That the consents of the said Edward Bishop of Salisbury, as Bishop of the diocese, and also of the Dean and Chapter of the cathedral church of Saint Mary the Virgin at Salisbury, as patrons of the parish church of the said parish of Bishops Cannings, and of Charlotte Starkey, of Spye-park, in the said county of Wilts, widow, as patron, in trust, of the parish church of the

said parish of Bromham, have been severally obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section before stated; and in testimony whereof, the said Edward Bishop of Salisbury, the said Dean and Chapter of the said cathedral church of Saint Mary the Virgin at Salisbury, and the said Charlotte Starky, have severally signed and sealed this representation :

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed consolidation and assignment be accordingly made, and the agreement in respect of the right of presentation, nomination, and appointment of an incumbent or perpetual curate of the said church or consolidated chapelry, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.
