The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the sixth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme respecting the endowment of certain archdeaconsries.

"Whereas it was by the said Act enacted, that, so soon as conveniently might be, and by the authority therein provided, subject to the consent of the bishop, any archdeaconsry might be endowed by the annexation either of an entire canonsry, or of a canonsry charged with the payment of such portion of its income as should be determined on, towards providing for another archdeacon in the same diocese, or with such last-mentioned portion of the income of a canonsry, or by augmentation out of the common fund thereafter mentioned, provided that no archdeacon should be entitled to hold any endowment or augmentation, or other emolument as such archdeacon under the provisions of the same Act, unless he should be resident for the space of eight months in every year within the diocese in which his archdeaconsry should be situate, or as to any then archdeacon, within the diocese in which his archdeaconsry was situate before the thirteenth day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, subject to the same provisions as to licenses for non-residence which were enacted with respect to incumbents of benefices by the Act respecting pluralities and residence of the clergy, passed in the second year of your Majesty's reign:

"And whereas, in pursuance of the said

enactments, we have prepared and laid before your Majesty in Council certain schemes relating to the endowment of the archdeaconries of Craven, Richmond, Nottingham, Sudbury, Sarum, Salop (in Lichfield), York, Saint Alban's, Wilts, Salop (in Hereford), Monmouth, Llandaff, Montgomery, Saint Asaph, Bangor, Manchester, Chester, Merioneth, Derby, Carmarthen, Norwich, and Bedford, and the said schemes were severally ratified by Orders of your Majesty in Council, bearing date, respectively, the eleventh day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-one; the tenth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-two; the tenth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-three; the thirty-first day of January, the twenty-third day of May, and the nineteenth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four; the third day of February, and the twenty-sixth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five; and all the said Orders have been duly published in the London Gazette :

“ And whereas such of the said several schemes and Orders as provide yearly payments by us, in augmentation of the incomes of certain archdeaconries, contain a provision to the effect that every such whole yearly payment shall be made only on production to us of a certificate, under the hand of the bishop, that the archdeacon has duly resided during the then past year; and it appears to us that such provision is not in strict accordance with the hereinbefore recited provisions respecting the residence of archdeacons, as contained in the said recited Act, and that such last-mentioned provisions should be made to apply alike to all cases of the endowment or augmentation of archdeaconries under the same Act :

“ We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that, notwithstanding any thing in the said several schemes and Orders, or any of them, contained, every such endowment or augmentation as aforesaid shall be and be taken to be made and held, subject to the said hereinbefore recited provisions of the said Act, and that we, or our Treasurer, or any other treasurer or officer duly authorized and directed to make any payment to any archdeacon by or under any such scheme and Order, shall, before making such payment, require evidence that the archdeacon, claiming the same,

continued entitled, during the period for which such payment shall be claimed, to hold his endowment or augmentation, according to the said provisions of the said recited Act.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the several diocese of York, London, Bangor, Chester, Ely, Hereford, Lichfield, Lincoln, Llandaff, Norwich, Ripon, Saint Asaph, Saint David's, and Salisbury.
