WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the sixth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, that is to say :

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish of Stoke Damerel, in the county of Devon, and in the diocese of Exeter.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incum-

bent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the meantime, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council, that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereafter provided :

“ And whereas the said parish of Stoke Damerel is of great extent, and contains a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of such parish hereinafter mentioned, such part not at present containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth :

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Bishop of Exeter, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Stoke Damerel, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—shall be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, “ The District of Saint James, Devonport.”

“ And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

## " SCHEDULE.

" The district of SAINT JAMES, DEVONPORT, being—

" All that part of the parish of Stoke Damerel, in the county of Devon, and in the diocese of Exeter, situate within the borough of Devonport, and bounded as follows; that is to say, on the north by Keyham Lake; on the east by an imaginary line, extending southward from the southern bank of Keyham Lake aforesaid, and in a straight direction, as far as the middle of Garden-street, and thence along the middle of such street, and continuing southward in a stright direction, as far as the fortifications of the town of Devonport; on the south by the said fortifications; and on the west, by the Hamoaze."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbent and to the patrons of the church of the parish out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and whereas one calendar month has expired since such draft was so transmitted, and certain objections, offered by the incumbent of the said parish of Devonport to the said scheme, have been laid before Her Majesty in Council, together with such scheme:

And whereas the said scheme has, notwithstanding such objections, been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Exeter.

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend George Bishop of Peterborough, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Saint Giles, and also all those extra-parochial places, described in the schedule hereunto annexed;—all which part and extra-parochial places, together with the boundaries thereof, respectively, are delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—shall be together constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, “ The District of Saint Edmund, Northampton.”

“ And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted,

when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

#### “ SCHEDULE.

“ The district of SAINT EDMUND, NORTHAMPTON, being—

“ All that part of the parish of Saint Giles, Northampton, in the county of Northampton, and

in the diocese of Peterborough, and also all those extra-parochial places, in the same county and diocese, comprised within and bounded by an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked *a* on the map or plan hereunto annexed) on the eastern boundary of the said parish, and in the middle of the road from the town of Northampton to Little Billing, and thence extending first northward along such boundary as far as the parish of Saint Sepulchre, in the same county and diocese, and thence first southward, along the boundary of such last-mentioned parish to the middle of Upper Mounts-street, in the said town of Northampton, and thence towards the south east along the middle of such street, and of a street or road called Lower Mounts, across the eastern end of Abington-street, and along the middle of a certain road leading to the Infirmary, as far as the middle of the road to Little Billing aforesaid, and thence eastward along the middle of such last-mentioned road to the point where the said imaginary line commences.”

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the patrons of the church of the parish out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and such draft has also been transmitted to the duly appointed curate to the church of the said parish, pursuant to the provisions of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled “ An Act to explain and amend “ an Act for making better provision for the “ spiritual care of populous parishes,” and whereas one calendar month has expired since such draft was so transmitted, and no objections have been made thereto :

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the first-recited Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Peterborough.

of Saint Paul, and also all that part of the said parish of Saint Peter, and also all that part of the said parish of Saint Philip and Saint Jacob, respectively described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all which parts, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—shall be together constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, “ The District of the Weir.”

“ The district of THE WEIR, being—

“ All that part of the parish of Saint Paul, in the city of Bristol, and in the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, situate on the southern side of an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked *a* on the map or plan hereunto annexed) on the boundary between the said parish of Saint Paul and the parish of Saint James, in the said city, opposite to the middle of Rosemary-street, and thence extending eastward along the middle of such street, and of Water-street, as far as the middle of Clark-street, and thence northward along the middle of such last-mentioned street to a point (marked *b* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Meadow-street, and thence eastward along the middle of such last-mentioned street as far as the middle of East-street, and thence toward the south east along the middle of such last-mentioned street as far as the boundary between the said parish of Saint Paul and the parish of Saint Peter, in the said city; and also all that part of the said parish of Saint Peter, situate on the eastern side of an imaginary line extending towards the south east from the northern boundary thereof, along the middle of Merchant-street, as far as the southern boundary of the same parish; and also all that part of the parish of Saint Philip and Saint Jacob, in the said city, situate on the northern side of an imaginary line extending eastward from the north western angle of such last-mentioned parish, across the end of Lower Castle-street, and along the middle of Ellbroad-street, and of Redcross-street and Thoroughfare-court, as far as the eastern boundary of the said parish of Saint Philip and Saint Jacob.”

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbents and to the patrons of the churches of the parishes out of

which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and whereas one calendar month has expired since such draft was so transmitted, and certain objections to the said scheme, offered by the incumbents of the parishes of Saint Paul, and Saint Philip and Jacob, Bristol, have been laid before Her Majesty in Council, together with the said scheme :

And whereas the said scheme has, notwithstanding such observations and objections, been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the two several registries of the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, at Bristol and Gloucester.

annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as hereinafter provided :

“And whereas the said parish of Earsdon and chapelry of Cramlington are respectively of great extent, and contain a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular parts of such parish and chapelry hereinafter respectively mentioned and described, neither of which parts at present contains within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be together constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth :

“Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Bishop of Durham, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Earsdon, and also all that part of the said chapelry of Cramlington, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all which parts, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—shall be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, “The District of Sighill.”

“And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district,



for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

“And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

#### “ SCHEDULE.

“ The district of SIGHILL, being—

“ All that part of the parish of Earsdon, in the county of Northumberland, and in the diocese of Durham, comprised within the township of Sighill, and also all that part of the township of Seaton Delaval, in the same parish, situate on the western side of an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked *a* on the map or plan hereunto annexed) on the boundary between such last-mentioned township, and the township of Holywell in the same parish, at the extreme south eastern corner of a certain field or close called the Front Field, and forming part of a certain farm called Avenue Head Farm, now in the occupation

of Messrs. George, John, and Thomas Duxfield, and thence extending towards the north east and north along the south eastern and eastern boundary of such field as far as the middle of the road leading from Sighill to Seaton Delaval, and thence towards the north east along the middle of such road to a point (marked *b* as aforesaid) opposite the south eastern corner of a certain field called the ‘Low Avenue Field’ forming part of the said Avenue Head Farm, and thence northward along the eastern boundary of such farm, and of another farm called Whitridge Farm, now in the occupation of the Seaton Delaval Coal Company, until the same boundary meets the north western boundary of the said township of Seaton Delaval; and also all that part of the township of Cramlington in the chapelry of Cramlington in the same county and diocese, situate on the southern side of an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked *c* as aforesaid) on the boundary between such last-mentioned township and the township of Horton, at the north east corner of a certain field called Brackney Beds Field, belonging to George Shum Storey, Esquire, and now in the occupation of Joseph Lamb and partners, and thence extending southward along the northern boundary of such last-mentioned field, and on the eastern side of an imaginary line extending southward along the western side of such field as far as the middle of the road leading from Cramlington to Seaton Delaval aforesaid, and thence westward along the middle of such road to a point (marked *d* as aforesaid) opposite the north western corner of a certain field called the Camp Field, belonging to the said George Shum Storey, Esquire, and now in the occupation of Joseph Lamb and partners, and thence extending southward along the western boundary of such field until the same meets the boundary of the township of Sighill aforesaid.”

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbent and to the patrons of the church of the parish, and to the incumbent and patron of the church or chapel of the chapelry, out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled “ An Act to

" explain and amend an Act for making better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes;" and whereas one calendar month has expired since such draft was so transmitted, and certain objections to the said scheme, offered by the incumbent of the said parish of Farsdon, have been laid before Her Majesty in Council, together with such scheme :

And whereas the said scheme has, notwithstanding such objections, been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the first-recited Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Durham.
