“ SCHEDULE.

“ The district of *LITTLE LONDON*, being—

“ All that part of the township of Leeds, in the parish of Leeds, and district parish of Woodhouse, in the west riding of the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon, comprised within and bounded by an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked *a* on the map or plan hereunto annexed) in the middle of Woodhouse-lane, and opposite to the middle of Coburg-street, and thence extending westward, along the middle of such lane, to a point (marked *b* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Blackman-lane, and thence northward along the middle of such last-mentioned lane, and of a certain occupation road at the northern end thereof, and of a certain public footpath leading from the said occupation road to Woodhouse Carr, to the northern boundary of an estate belonging to the trustees of pious uses, near Walsh-row, and thence towards the north east, along the northern boundary of such estate as far as the middle of the Leeds and Meanwood turnpike road, and thence towards the south-east, along the middle of such last-mentioned turnpike road, to a point (marked *c* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Elmwood-street, and thence southward, along the middle of such street, and of Camp-road, to a point (marked *d* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of the street or roadway before Back Grove-terrace, and thence towards the south west, along the middle of such street or roadway, as far as the middle of Claypit-lane, and thence southward, along the middle of such last-mentioned lane, as far as the middle of Coburg-street aforesaid, and thence westward, along the middle of such street, to the point where the said imaginary line commenced.”

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbents and patrons of the churches of the parish and district parish out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and whereas one calendar month has expired since such draft was so transmitted, and no objections have been made thereto :

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Ripon.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled “ An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues,” duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the eighth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, that is to say :

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled “ An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues,” have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for making better provision for the cure of souls in the parishes of Saint Helen and Saint Nicholas, Abingdon, in the county of Berks, and diocese of Oxford.

“ Whereas the rectory of Saint Nicholas, Abingdon, in the county of Berks, and diocese of Oxford, being an ecclesiastical rectory without cure of souls, in the patronage of your Majesty, was vacated, on the thirteenth day of November
