An Act for granting certain duties on sugar nd molasses.

An Act to defray, until the first day of August one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, the charge of the pay, clothing, and contigent and other expences of the disembodied militia in Great Britain and Ireland, to grant allowances in certain cases to subaltern officers, adjutants, paymasters, quartermasters, surgeons, assistant-surgeons, surgeons' mates, and serjeant majors of the militia, and to authorize the employment of the non-commissioned officers.

An Act to relieve Her Majesty's subjects from certain penalties and disabilities in regard to religious opinions.

An Act for regulating the gauge of railways.

An Act to amend an Act, of the seventh and eighth years of Her present Majesty, for reducing, under certain circumstances, the duties payable upon books and engravings.

An Act to enable courts of law in Ireland to give relief against adverse claims made upon persons having no interest in the subject matter of such claims.

An Act to abolish deodands.

An Act to extend to all barristers practising in the superior courts at Westminster, the privileges of serjeants at law in the Court of Common Pleas.

An Act to provide forms of proceedings under the Acts relating to the duties of assessed taxes and the duties on profits arising from property, professions, trades, and offices in England.

An Act to continue, until the first day of October one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and to the end of the then next session of Parliament, an Act for authorizing the application of highway rates to turnpike roads.

An Act to continue, to the first day of October one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and to the end of the then next session of Parliament, the Act to amend the laws relating to loan societies.

An Act to continue certain turnpike Acts until the first day of October one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and to the end of the then next session of Parliament.
