ISPATCHES have been received at this Office from Rear Admiral Inglefield, in the wiver Plate, addressed to the Secretary of the Admiralty, of which the following are copies or extracts:

H. M. Ship Vernon, off Monte Video, June 9, 1846.

IT affords me the utmost satisfaction to have it in my power to acquaint you, for the information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that by the arrival of Her Majesty's steam vessel Alecto from the Parana yesterday evening, I learned that the convoy, consisting of one hundred and ten vessels of all sizes, had passed the batteries erected at Saint Lorenzo, by General Rosas, to obstruct their passage down that river, and had arrived in safety at Obligado, with the exception of the British barque Caledonia, and two Monte Videan vessels, which, having grounded opposite the batteries, were obliged to be burnt by our people to prevent their falling into the hands of the Buenos Ayreans.

Captain Hotham's anxiety to communicate this information to me, appears to have prevented him from sending me by this opportunity an official report of this operation, which cannot tail to reflect great credit upon all who took part in it; as soon, however, as I receive his report, I will forward it

for their Lordships' information.

In the meantime I should mention, that the English and French steam vessels were upwards of three and a half hours engaged with the bat- | San Lorenzo to your notice.

teries of St. Lorenzo, and although scarcely a vessel of the convoy escaped being hit, yet most providentially not a single casualty occurred on this occasion on board any of the vessels.

I am sorry, however, to add, that the satisfaction expressed in the foregoing part of my letter, is not unmixed with great regret for the loss of life on board the Lizard on her passage up the river, of the particulars of which their Lordships will be informed by the accompanying copy of a letter from Captain Hotham, enclosing reports from Her Majesty's steam vessels Alecto, Harpy, and Lizard, of their passages from Monie Video to the Bajada of Santa Fé, the Commanders of which vessels appear to have acted, while passing the batteries, with great judgment and gall intry.

Her Majesty's Ship Gorgon, SIR, San Lorenzo, 30th May 1846.

I HAVE the honour to transmit official reports from Commander Austen, of Her Majesty's steam sloop Alecto, Lieutenant Tylden, of Her Majesty's sloop Lizard, and Lieutenant Proctor, of Her Majesty's sloop Harpy, accompanied by a list of damages of their respective vessels. It is my duty to bring the good conduct of these several officers in their engagements with the butteries of

The Alecto was especially placed at a great disadvantage, her progress was retarded by towing three heavily laden vessels against a current of three knots, and a head wind; she was exposed to the fire of seven or eight guns during an hour and a half, and unable from the height of the cliff to make much impression in return.

The two little iron vessels, Lizard and Harpy, were enabled, from their light draught of water, to run close under the cliffs, and thus escaped many of the shots intended for them; the state of their hulls, and the list of killed and wounded, prove that, notwithstanding the precaution of their commanders, they suffered much; and those officers deserve credit for the able way in which their vessels were handled.

H. M. Steam Sloop Alecto, SIR, River Parana, 9th April 1846.

IN obedience to your orders, I have the honour to report to you, for the information of the Commander in Chief, that, on the afternoon of Monday the 6th instant, whilst passing up the river in Her Majesty's steam sloop under my command, with three schooners in tow, I observed the enemy assembled in force in the battery lately erected in the heights of San Lorenzo. At twenty minutes past two I commenced firing shell and rockets, with a view to disperse them.

At half past two the enemy opened a fire with round and grape from a masked eighteen-pounder, placed on the edge of the cliff, which was immediately followed by the rest of the enemy's guns, seven in number, all of them apparently long eighteen-pounders. The fire of the enemy was quickly returned from Her Majesty's sloop under my command with shot and shell.

In consequence of the current, and strong headwind blowing, our progress past the batteries was very slow, enabling the enemy to keep up a smart, and, at first, a well-directed fire with grape and round shot, for an hour and ten minutes, within musket range.

Her Majesty's steam sloop was struck by eight round shot in her hull, besides by numerous grape, but I am happy to say, that, on this occasion, we

had not a man hurt.

The schooners in tow were likewise fired into by the enemies, and were hulled in several places. I am unable to state what damages the enemy sustained from our fire.

I have the honour to inform you, that, in passing Tonelero, where, on the 10th February last, we were engaged in Her Majesty's steam sloop Alecto with the enemy's batteries, and had five men wounded, I observed a large party at work, erecting embrasures along the edge of the cliff.

I was enabled to make out ten altogether, three of which are finished. From having suffered by the enemy's fire at the same place on a previous occasion, and having reason to believe that guns were mounted on the three finished embrazures, I opened fire upon them with shell and rockets, but, finding they did not return it, after a few rounds I ceased firing. I enclose a list of damages received by Her Majesty's sloop Alecto from the enemy.

H. M. Steam Vessel Harpy, off San Lorenzo, SIR, Parana, 11th May 1846.

IN pursuance of orders from the Commander in Chief, I beg leave to acquaint you, that I arrived here in Her Majesty's steam vessel Harpy, under my command, after experiencing, this morning, a galling fire from the forts of San Lorenzo, both of musketry, field pieces, and other guns, within a distance of about sixty yards. The fire was kept up with great determination for more than an hour, and we were followed up by field pieces, together with a large body of concealed troops, who lined the banks, firing musketry as we passed. About ten minutes before we passed out of gun shot, I was hit by a round shot on the fleshy part of the right arm, but am going on favourably, although incapacitated from doing duty. I am happy to state no other casualty occurred on board. The Harpy is greatly cut up about the rigging, and has many musket balls and grape in her hull, funnel, topsides, and boats.

I beg you will bring to the favourable notice of the Commander in Chief, Mr. Bruce, Mate, who took charge of the ship when I was wounded, and also Mr. Ward, Second Master, for his cool and steady conduct in attending to the steering of the Harpy; as also the other officers and men under my command, for the able assistance they rendered in their respective duties; the pilot behaved with great credit, and has proved himself

so far an excellent pilot.

I am now repairing damages with all possible despatch, and shall be ready for sea very shortly.

H. M.'s Steam Vessel Lizard, above Fort Lorenzo, River Parana, Five SIR, P.M. 21st April.

I HAVE the honour to state, for the information of the Commander in Chief, that this morning, at the distance of six miles from Lorenzo, I observed large batteries had been erected on a commanding point, and that the adjacent coast was lined with artillery and field pieces. At half past eleven A.M. the southern batteries opened a heavy fire, and on approaching nearer, the other batteries and artillery commenced a quick and well-directed

fire also, which was returned by the Lizard by rockets and the forecastle gun, until the rocket stand was shot away, and the gun could no longer be elevated sufficiently to bear on the enemy; at the same time the heavy shot, grape, and musketry riddling the vessel from stem to stern, I ordered the officers and men to go below, but the step, I regret to say, had not the desired effect, two officers being killed in the gun-room.

The Lizard received seven shot between wind and water, besides nine cannon, fourteen grape, and forty-one musket balls in the hull and bulwarks, and seven cannon and grape in the funnel

and steam pipe.

The boats, main mast, and rigging, fore and aft,

are shot through and through by cannon.

I hoisted three ensigns before we entered the fire, and rejoice to state came out with two flying,

only having one at the main shot away...

The firing commenced at half past eleven A.M. and continued with rapidity until twenty-five minutes past one P.M. the wind and current strong against us, and great quantity of water in the hold, delayed us much in passing. I beg to say the officers and crew evinced great coolness, particularly John Trillia, the pilot, who conned the vessel with great judgment through the whole of the action.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better "provision for the spiritual care of populous "parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-first day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual "care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish of Stockport, in the county and diocese of Chester.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that; any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or, any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and tofix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity, of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any . observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall : not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the meantime, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council, that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereinafter provided:

"And whereas the said parish of Stockport is of great extent, and contains a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of such parish hereinafter mentioned and described, such part not at present containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Bird Bishop of Chester, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Stockport, described in the schedule hereunto annexed, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed, shall be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, "The District of Saint Mark, Bredbury."

"And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as

any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and conseerated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

#### " SCHEDULE.

" The district of SAINT MARK, BREDBURY, being-

"All that part of the parish of Stockport, in the county and diocese of Chester, comprised within the township of Bredbury."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron of the church of the parish out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and whereas one calendar month has expired since such draft was so transmitted, and no objections have been made thereto:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Chester.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

#### " SCHEDULE.

"The district of SAINT THOMAS, HYDE, being-

"All that part of the township of Hyde, in the parish of Stockport, in the county and diocese of Chester, situate on the eastern side. of an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked a on the map or plan hereunto annexed) on the boundary of such township where it is crossed by the highway, commonly called Hyde Back-lane, from Gee-cross to Hyde, and thence extending northward along the middle of such highway and of Back-lane to a point (marked b as aforesaid) opposite to the north eastern end of. Wood-street, and thence towards the north west along the middle of such street, and of Vernon-. street to a point (marked c as aforesaid) at the extreme southern end of Norfolk-street, and thence northward along the middle of such street as far as the middle of the turnpike road from Hyde to-Ashton-under-Lyne, and thence westward along the middle of such turnpike road to a point (marked d as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Clarendonstreet, and thence northward along the middle of such last-mentioned street, and continuing in a straight direction to the boundary of the said township of Hyde.

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron of the church of the parish, and

to the incumbent and to the patron of the church or chapel of the district, out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and whereas one calendar month has expired since such draft was so transmitted, and no objections have been made thereto:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Chester.

between Her Majesty and His Majesty the King of Prussia, whereby due protection has been secured within the Prussian dominions for the authors of books, dramatic works, or musical compositions, and the inventors, designers, or engravers of prints and articles of sculpture, and the authors, inventors, designers, or engravers of any other works whatsoever of literature and the fine arts, in which the laws of Great Britain and of Prussia do now or may hereafter give their respective subjects the privilege of copyright, and for the lawful representatives or assigns of such authors, inventors, designers, or engravers, with regard to any such works first published within the dominions of Her Majesty:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of Her Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority committed to Her by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the seventh and eighth years of Her reign, intituled "An Act to amend the law relating "to international copyright;" doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the first day of September one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, the authors, inventors, designers, engravers, and makers of any of the following works (that is to say), books, prints, articles of sculpture, dramatic works,

musical compositions, and any other works of literature and the fine arts, in which the laws of Great Britain give to British subjects the privilege of copyright, and the executors, administrators, and assigns of such authors, inventors, designers, engravers, and makers, respectively, shall, as respects works first published within the dominions of Prussia, after the said first day of September one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, have the privilege of copyright therein for a period equal to the term of copyright which authors, inventors, designers, engravers, and makers of the like works, respectively, first published in the United Kingdom are by law entitled to; provided such books, dramatic pieces, musical compositions, prints, articles of sculpture, or other works of art have been registered, and copies thereof have been delivered according to the requirements of the said recited Act, within twelve months after the first publication thereof in any part of the Prussian dominions:

And it is hereby further ordered, that the authors of dramatic pieces and musical compositions which shall, after the said first day of September one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, be first publicly represented or performed within the dominions of Prussia shall have the sole liberty of representing or performing in any part of the British dominions such dramatic pieces or musical compositions, during a period equal to the period during which authors of dramatic pieces and musical compositions first publicly represented or performed in the United Kingdom are entitled by law to the sole liberty of representing or performing the same; provided such dramatic pieces or musical compositions have been registered, and copies thereof have been delivered according to the requirements of the said recited Act, within twelve calendar months after the time of their being first represented or performed in any part of the Prussian dominions:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary orders herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the present session of Parliament, intituled "An Act "to amend an Act, of the seventh and eighth "years of Her present Majesty, for reducing, "under certain circumstances, the duties payable "upon books and engravings," it is enacted, that whenever Her Majesty has, by virtue of any authority vested in Her for that purpose, declared that the authors, inventors, designers, engravers, or makers of any books, prints, or other works of

art, first published in any foreign country or ] countries, shall have the privilege of copyright therein, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, if she think fit, from time to time, by any Order in Council, to declare that, from and after a day to be named in such Order, in lieu of the Customs, from time to time, payable on the importation into the United Kingdom of books, prints, and drawings, there shall be payable only such duties of Customs as are mentioned in the said Act:

And whereas Her Majesty hath this day, by virtue of the authority vested in Her for that purpose, declared that the authors, inventors, designers, engravers, and makers of books, prints, and certain other works of art, first published within the dominions of Prussia, shall have the privilege of copyright therein:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of Her Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Her by the said recited Act, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the first day of September one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in lieu of the duties of Customs now payable upon books, prints, and drawings, published at any place within the dominions of Prussia, there shall be payable only the duties of Customs following (that is to say):

On books originally produced in the United Kingdom, and republished at any place within the dominions of Prussia, a duty of two pounds ten shillings per hundred weight.

On books published or republished at any place within the dominions of Prussia, and not being books originally produced in the United Kingdom, a duty of fifteen shillings per hundred weight.

On prints and drawings, plain or coloured, published at any place within the dominions of Prussia,

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And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary orders herein accordingly.
