#### The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS a Treaty has been concluded between Her Majesty and His Majesty the King of Saxony, whereby due protection has been secured within the Saxon dominions for the authors of books, dramatic works, or musical compositions, and the inventors, designers, or engravers of prints and articles of sculpture, and the authors, inventors, designers, or engravers of any other works whatsoever of literature and the fine arts, in which the laws of Great Britain and of Saxony do now or may hereafter give their respective subjects the privilege of copyright, and for the lawful representatives or assigns of such authors, inventors, designers, or engravers, with regard to any such works first published within the dominions of Her Majesty:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of Her Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority committed to Her by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the seventh and eighth years of Her reign, intituled "An Act to amend the law relating to " international copyright," doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the day of the date hereof, the authors, inventors, designers, engravers, and makers of any of the following works (that is to say), books, prints, articles of sculpture, dramatic works, musical compositions, and any other works of literature and the fine arts, in which the laws of Great Britain give to British subjects the privilege of copyright, and the executors, administrators, and assigns of such authors, inventors, designers, engravers, and makers, respectively, shall, as respects works first published within the dominions of Saxony, after the first day of September one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, have the privilege of copyright therein for a period equal to the term of copyright which authors, inventors, designers, engravers, and makers of the like works, respectively, first published in the United Kingdom are by law entitled to; provided such books, dramatic pieces, musical compositions, prints, articles of sculpture, or other works of art, have been registered, and copies thereof have been delivered

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according to the requirements of the said recited Act, within twelve months after the first publication thereof, in any part of the Saxon dominions:

And it is hereby further ordered, that the authors of dramatic pieces and musical compositions which shall, after the said first day of September one thousand eight hundred and fortysix, have been or be first publicly represented or performed within the dominions of Saxony, shall have the sole liberty of representing or performing in any part of the British dominions such dramatic pieces or musical compositions, during a period equal to the period during which authors of dramatic pieces and musical compositions first publicly represented or performed in the United Kingdom are entitled by law to the sole liberty of representing or performing the same; provided such dramatic pieces or musical compositions have been registered, and copies thereof have been delivered according to the requirements of the said recited Act, within twelve calendar months after the time of their being first represented or performed in any part of the Saxon dominions :

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary orders herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the ninth and tenth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to amend an Act, of the "seventh and eighth years of Her present Ma-"jesty, for reducing, under certain circumstances, "the duties payable upon books and engravings," it is enacted, that whenever Her Majesty has, by virtue of any authority vested in Her for that purpose, declared that the authors, inventors, designers, engravers, or makers of any books, prints, or other works of art, first published in any foreign country or countries, shall have the privilege of copyright therein, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, if she think fit, from time to time, by any Order in Council, to declare that, from and after a day to be named in such Order, in lieu of the duties of Customs from time to time payable on the importation into the United Kingdom of books, prints, and drawings, there shall be payable only such duties of Customs as are mentioned in the said Act:

And whereas Her Majesty hath this day, by virtue of the authority vested in Her for that purpose, declared that the authors, inventors, designers, engravers, and makers of books, prints, and certain other works of art, first published within the dominions of Saxony, shall have the privilege of copywright therein :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of Her Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Her by the said recited Act, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the first day of October one thousand eight hundred and fortysix, in lieu of the duties of Customs now payable upon books, prints, and drawings, published at any place within the dominions of Saxony, there shall be payable only the duties of Customs following (that is to say):

On books originally produced in the United Kingdom, and republished at any place within the dominions of Saxony, a duty of two pounds ten shillings per hundred weight.

On books published or republished at any place within the dominions of Saxony, and not being books originally produced in the United Kingdom, a duty of fifteen shillings per hundred weight.

On prints and drawings, plain or coloured, published at any place within the dominions of Saxony, s. d.

W HEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed

in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act " to amend and render more effectual an Act, " passed in the last session of Parliament, for " building, and promoting the building, of ad-" ditional churches in populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the fourteenth day of September one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, viz.

" Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circamstances of the parish of Kingswinford, in the county of Stafford, and within the diocese of Lichfield, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled " An Act to amend and render " more effectual an Act, passed in the last session " of Parliament, for building, and promoting the " building, of additional churches in populous " parishes," be assigned to the consecrated church, called Saint Mary's Church, situate the said parish of Kingswinford, and that such district should be named, " the Chapelry District of Saint Mary, Kingswinford," and be bounded as follows, viz.

" Commencing at a point in the Kidderminster turnpike road opposite to Heath Brook Farm, and proceeding in a south easterly and easterly direction along the middle of the Heath Brook Pool and Dawley Brook, as far as the south eastern boundary of the field No. 2382 on the tithe commutation map of the parish of Kingswinford, when the line proceeds northerly along the castern fence which separates the said field from the field No. 2383 on the said map, as far as the Ashwood Railway, which it crosses; and then proceeds in an casterly direction along the ditches of the southern fences of three fields numbered, respectively, 2379, 2377, and 2374 on the said map; the boundary then turns northerly and runs along the ditch of the western fence of the Honey Suckle Field, numbered 2333 on the said map, to the south west corner of Helliott's Field, numbered 2334 on the said map, when it proceeds easterly along the ditch of the fence between the said two last-mentioned fields, and from thence in a straight direction between two fields numbered 2327 and 2328, when the line proceeds northerly, up the western fence of enclosure No. 2325 on the said map, to the garden and rick-yard of Becknells Field Farm-house; and then turns easterly, and runs along the northern fence of the said field No. 2325, to a gate in a foredraught leading from the said farm-house to Kingswinford, and crossing the said foredraught turns northerly, and runs along the ditch of the fence on the eastern side of the foredraught, to a stile opposite the corner of the rick-yard; the boundary again turns easterly from the said stile, proceeding along the footpath leading through Mansell's Meadow, No. 2275, into Stalling's-lane, and along the middle of that lane to the bridge over the Stourbridge Extension Canal in Stalling's-lane; it then proceeds southerly down the said canal as far as the bridge in Bromley-lane, at the corner of two fields numbered 989 and 990 on the map; from which bridge it then proceeds in a westerly direction, along the middle of the said lane, passing by Bromley-hall, Coal Leasows, and Burras's-barn, as far as the turnpil e gate in the road leading from Stourbridge to Wolverhampton, and crossing the said road runs along the fence between the little and big broad meadows, numbered 2441 and 2444, to Barnetlane, which lane it crosses and runs along the ditch between two fields, called the House Picce, No. 2470, and the Alms-house Piece, No. 2471, as far as Cort-lane; from thence it proceeds northerly and north westerly along the middle of the said lane, passing by Summer-hill, and continuing up the middle of the road or lane to Heath Brook Farm, as far as the Kidderminster turnpike road, and then north easterly up the middle of that road to the point where the boundaries of the district commenced, as the same is more particularly delineated on the map or plax hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured green :

"That banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said church, and that the fees arising therefrom should be received by and belong to the incumbent thereof:

"That the consent of the Right Reverend John Bishop of Lichfield has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section before mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said John Bishop of Lichfield has signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore; humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premices into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and busials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, initialed "An Act to carry into effect, with certain "modifications, the fourth report of the Commis-"sioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-first day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, initialed "An Act "to carry into effect, with certain modifications, "the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ec-"clesiastical Duties and Revenues," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for making better provision for the cure of souls in the parish of Merrington, in the county and diooese of Durham.

"Whereas, upon the passing of the said recited Act, the deanery of the cathedral church of Durham being then vacant, all the estate and interest which the succeeding dean thereof would, have had, if the said Act had not been passed (amongst other property usually held or enjoyed with the said deanery), in the tithes hereinafter particularly described, became, by virtue of the said Act, absolutely vested in us and our successors for the purposes of the said Act :

" And whereas it was by the said Act enacted that, except as therein otherwise specified, all the monies and revenues to be paid to us, and all the rents and profits of the lands, tithes and other hereditaments vested and to be vested in us by and under the authority of that Act, together with all accumulation of interest produced by and arising therefrom, should be from time to time carried over by us to a common fund; and by payments or investments made out of such fund, or if in any case it should be deemed more expedient by means of an actual conveyance and assignment of such lands, tithes or other hereditaments, or of a portion thereof, additional provision should be made, by the authority thereinafter provided, for the cure of souls in parishes where such assistance was most required, in such manner as by the like authority should be deemed most conducive to the efficiency of the Established Church; provided always, that in making any such additional provision out of any titles or any lands or other hereditaments allotted or assigned in lieu of titles so vested or to be vested in us, or out of the rents and profits thereof, due consideration should be had of the wants and circumstances of the places in which such tithes then arose, or had theretofore arisen :

" And whereas, after due consideration of the wants and circumstances of the said parish of Merrington, we have deemed it expedient to make additional provision for the cure of souls therein, in manner hereinafter mentioned :

" We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that all our estate and interest in the tithes of the township of Merrington, in the said parish of Merrington, or the rent charge or rent charges allotted or to be allotted in lieu thereof, shall forthwith and without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council, ratifying the same, become and be transferred to and absolutely vested in the Reverend John Tyson, the present Vicar of Merrington in the county and diocese of Durham, and his successors Vicars of Merrington, for ever.

" And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law im-med ately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her

Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Durham.
