THE Queen has been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable Sir Henry Pottinger, Bart. K. G. C. B. Governor and Commander in Chief in and over the settlement of the Cape of Good Hope, to be Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the settling and adjustment of the affairs of the territories adjacent or contiguous to the eastern and north eastern frontier of the said settlement.

And Her Majesty has further been pleased to appoint Richard Woosnam, Esq. to be Secretary to such Her Majesty's High Commissioner.

The Queen has been pleased to order a congé d'elire to pass the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, empowering the Dean and Chapter of the cathedral church of St. Asaph to elect a Bishop of that see, the same being void by the death of the Right Reverend Father in God Doctor William Carey, late Bishop thereof; and Her Majesty has been also pleased to recommend to the said Dean and Chapter the Right Reverend Father in God Doctor Thomas Vowler Short, now Bishop of Sodor and Man, to be by them elected Bishop of the said see of St. Asaph.
