of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament! holden in the first and second years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend " and render more effectual the church building " Acts," and that such district should consist of the township of Great Wyrley, and of the whole of the extra parochial place, called Cheslyn Hay, which adjoins such township, and is also within the area of the said parish, and that such district should be named, "The Chapelry District of Great Wyrley," and be bounded on the north by a brook which separates the remaining part of the parish of Cannock from the said township of Great Wyrley and the extra parochial place called Cheslyn Hay; on the north east by the parish of Norton; on the south east, and partly on the south, by the parish of Bushbury; and on the remaining part of the south and west by the parish of Shareshill, as such district is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured pink:

"That banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said church; and that all the fees arising therefrom should be paid and should belong to the minister or incumbent of such church for the time being:

"That the consent of the Right Reverend John Bishop of Lichfield has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section firstly hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said John Bishop of Lichfield has signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns, and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings,

and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.
