Rome, August 11.

E have by the way of Quanto an account, that the Venetians have taken Cores, one of the Richeft and most confiderable places in the Morea; And that Captain-General Marofini mar-

ched afterwards towards Modon and Mauarin, which are about 30 miles from Coron. The Marquis de Payella parted from hence the 8th Inftant after having taken leave of the Pope for Croatia, to Command the Italian Volontiers which are in Count Leflies Army.3

Lubon, July 6. The Marquis Balbiand Envoy Extraordinary from the Dokd of Javay, had the 29th past his Audience of Leave of the Infanta, to which he was Conducted in the Kings Coach by the Introductor of Amballadors. By a Vellel arrived from the East-Indies we have an account, that the Count d'Alvor Viceroy of the Indies for this Crown, had with the allifance of Aureng Zeb, Emperor of the Mogols, reduced Raya Sevagi to fuch a condition that he was forced to demand a Peace. We expect our Pleet from Breffl the beginning of the next month,

Medeid, August 16. They write from Cadig, that they had advice by the Flota which arrived in that Port the 29th of the laft month from the Wefl-Indies, That the Gallons were at Cartagenia in March laff, flaying there for the Plate, which was not yet brought from Lima to Panama, by reason the Pyrates which were in the South Sca, against whom the Vicenoy of Peru was fitting out four Ships of conliderable firength.

Warfam. August 17. The last Letters from Leopol told us, that the Crown General having taken a general review of the Polish Forces at Gliniani, which he found to be about report Foot and Sobo Horfe, he gave orders for the Army to decamp the poth palt and to march to Vifia near the Exiellen, where they would flay till those Troops that had not been yet able to joyn them, were come up. We have likewife , an account that the Troops of Lithuania are in a Body and ready to march against the Esemy, thut we do not know whether ency will joyn the Forces of the Crown or act, feperately. The Sieur Mobile General of the Collack's has drawn together about 8000 at Niemirow jowhere he expects orders from the Kipg | Prifonerd , that have been brought hither from how to act. There is a report that the Mostovites Nemberfel de all declare that above 9000 perforis

bave defeated a great Body of Tartars in the Okrain, and that they are refortifying Czecbrin, and at the fame time the Letters from Molcow give us great hopes that the Czars will come into the League against the Turks. The King of Poland who is now at Villa-Nova, will begin the next week his journey towards Ruffia.

Vienna, August 29. To the account we gave you in our last that the Buke of Lorrain had repassed the Panube with the Imperial Army near Comorra on the 34th Inflant, we can at prefent only add that his Highacis marches towards the Enemy, who have polled between Peft and Faccia. Our Army is between 40 and 50000 frong, and through the great care of the Count de Rabata Commillary-General, is plentifully supplyed with Provisions, and the Soldiers are full of Courage. The Befieged in Esperies continue to make a very defperate defence; They hung out the last week a White Flag, as if they defired a Parley, but when the Officers, which General Schulzg fend to hear what they had to fay, came near, shey fired upon them, and fome of them were killed's It is faid that General Caprara will be fone with Iabao Men towards Upper Hungary; And in the meantime the Emperor has cauled a general Pardon tabe published there, in which Count Teckeley and two more are only excepted. 'The Bithop of Gran has given a confiderable fum of Money towards the repairing the Fortifications of Newbeufel; I he Geriion which the Duke of Lorrain has put into that place confilts in 3500 men bilides 600 Hungarians. The Letters from Cracom tell us, that the Polish Army marched towards the Nieffer with defign to deftroy all the Country about Caminies, thereby to deprive that Garifon of the means of fublifling; and that the Crown General had received advice that 32000 Turks commanded by Solyman Baffa, had palled the Danube in order to joya with the Cham of Tanay!

Eamburgh, August 27. The Elector of Branden-burgh was, when the last letters came from Berlin, Hamburgh , August 27. The Elector of Brandenat Polldam, where the Sicur de Groot Envoy from the Duke of Hanouer had had feveral Conferences with his Electoral Highaelles Minifters concerning the Differences depending between the Duke of Zell and this City; And we hope that by the interpolition of these Princes they will be very speedily accommodated. Francfort; September 6. The 31. past arrived here the Great Chancellor of Poland who is going for France in Quality of Ambaffador Extraordinary from that Crown; And on Tuciday laft he parted again from hence to continue his journey thicher. The last Letters from Fienna told uschad the Imperial Army marched towards the Enemy, who were encamped between Pef and Maceius and that the Duke of Lorrain was fending a firing Detachement to reinforce the Body commanded by General Schultz in Upper Hungary. We are told from Heydelberg that the Abbot Morel Envoy Extraordinary from France prefented the last week a Memorial to the Elector Palatin, representing that he had orders from the King his Mafter to enter into Conference with such Persons as his Ele-Atoral Highnefs fhould appoint concerning the Pretenfions of the Dutchels of Ofleans-1 . 11
