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Rome, August 11.

WE have by the way of *Osmano* an account, that the Venetians have taken *Coron*, one of the Richest and most considerable places in the *Morea*; And that Captain-General *Morofeni* marched afterwards towards *Madon* and *Nauarin*, which are about 30 miles from *Coron*. The Marquis de *Pavella* parted from hence the 8th Instant after having taken leave of the Pope for *Croatia*, to Command the Italian Volunteers which are in Count *Leslies* Army.

Lisbon, July 6. The Marquis *Balbiano* Envoy Extraordinary from the Duke of *Savoy*, had the 29th past his Audience of Leave of the Infanta, to which he was Conducted in the Kings Coach by the Introducer of Ambassadors. By a Vessel arrived from the *East-Indies* we have an account, that the Count d'*Alvor* Viceroy of the *Indies* for this Crown, had with the assistance of *Aureng-Zeb*, Emperor of the *Mogols*, reduced *Raya Sevagi* to such a condition that he was forced to Demand a Peace. We expect our Fleet from *Brest*, the beginning of the next month.

Madrid, August 16. They write from *Cadix*, that they had advice by the Flota which arrived in that Port the 29th of the last month from the *West-Indies*, That the Gallions were at *Cartagenia* in *March* last, staying there for the Plate, which was not yet brought from *Lima* to *Panama*, by reason the Pyrates which were in the South Sea, against whom the Viceroy of *Peru* was fitting out four Ships of considerable strength.

Warsaw, August 17. The last Letters from *Leopol* told us, that the Crown General having taken a general review of the Polish Forces at *Gliniani*, which he found to be about 16000 Foot and 8000 Horse, he gave orders for the Army to decamp the 12th past and to march to *Vijfa* near the *Wieszen*, where they would stay till those Troops that had not been yet able to joyn them, were come up. We have likewise an account that the Troops of *Lithuania* are in a Body and ready to march against the Enemy, but we do not know whether they will joyn the Forces of the Crown or act seperately. The Sieur *Mobilis* General of the Cossacks has drawn together about 8000 at *Niemirov*, where he expects orders from the King how to act. There is a report that the *Moscovites*

have defeated a great Body of Tartars in the *Ukrain*, and that they are resorting to *Czechrin*, and at the same time the Letters from *Moscow* give us great hopes that the Czars will come into the League against the Turks. The King of *Poland* who is now at *Vilva-Nova*, will begin the next week his journey towards *Russia*.

Vienna, August 29. To the account we gave you in our last that the Duke of *Lorraine* had repass'd the *Danube* with the Imperial Army near *Comorra* on the 24th Instant, we can at present only add that his Highness marches towards the Enemy, who have posted between *Pest* and *Kuccia*. Our Army is between 40 and 50000 strong, and through the great care of the Count de *Rabara* Commissary-General, is plentifully supplied with Provisions, and the Soldiers are full of Courage. The Besieged in *Esperies* continue to make a very desperate defence; They hung out the last week a White Flag, as if they desired a Parley, but when the Officers, which General *Schulze* sent to hear what they had to say, came near, they fired upon them, and some of them were killed; It is said that General *Caprasa* will be sent with 12000 Men towards Upper *Hungary*; And in the meantime the Emperor has caused a general Pardon to be published there, in which Count *Teckelej* and two more are only excepted. The Bishop of *Graz* has given a considerable sum of Money towards the repairing the Fortifications of *Nembusel*; The Garrison which the Duke of *Lorraine* has put into that place consists in 3500 men besides 800 Hungarians. The Letters from *Cracom* tell us, that the Polish Army marched towards the *Niefter* with design to destroy all the Country about *Camisjes*, thereby to deprive that Garrison of the means of subsisting; and that the Crown General had received advice that 12000 Turks commanded by *Solyman* Bassa, had pass'd the *Danube* in order to joyn with the Cham of *Tarany*.

Vienna, August 30. We have an account that the 27th Instant the Imperial Army pass'd the Rivers *Graz* and *Jpol* with a resolution to march towards the Enemy; There are some Letters which say, that the Serasquier Bassa upon notice of it, had quitted his Camp between *Vuccia* and *Pest* and repass'd the *Danube*. They write from *Croatia* that General *Leslis* was come back to *Turawitz*; and that the Croats who were with him in his late Expedition, were gone home with their Plunder; but had promised to return very suddenly to the Camp in a greater number. The Prisoners that have been brought hither from *Nembusel* do all declare that above 5000 persons

were killed in that place, and that the Garison at the beginning of the Siege consisted of above 3000 Men: The Count de *Maurinitz* whom the Emperor sent in Quality of his Envoy Extraordinary to England, is returned hither.

Hamburg, August 27. The Elector of Brandenburg was, when the last Letters came from Berlin, at *Poydam*, where the Sieur de *Groot* Envoy from the Duke of *Hanover* had had several Conferences with his Electoral Highnesses Ministers concerning the Differences depending between the Duke of *Zell* and this City; And we hope that by the interposition of these Princes they will be very speedily accommodat'd. We have an account of a great Fire that hath lately happened at *Dresden*.

Frankfort, September 6. The 31. past arrived here the Great Chancellor of *Poland* who is going for *France* in Quality of Ambassador Extraordinary from that Crown; And on Tuesday last he parted again from hence to continue his journey thither. The last Letters from *Vienna* told us that the Imperial Army march'd towards the Enemy, who were encamped between *Pest* and *Vaccin*; and that the Duke of *Lorraine* was sending a strong Detachment to reinforce the Body commanded by General *Schultz* in Upper *Hungary*. We are told from *Heydelberg* that the Abbot *Morel* Envoy Extraordinary from *France* presented the last week a Memorial to the Elector *Palatin*, representing that he had orders from the King his Master to enter into Conference with such Persons as his Electoral Highness should appoint concerning the Pretensions of the Dutchess of *Orleans*.

Cologne, September 7. The Commissioners appointed by the Elector of *Trier* and the Duke of *Faliers*, came hither the second Instant with a Guard of 20 Horse; since the Troops in *Garison* here have taken the Oath they required of them; and several Persons who were banished by the present Magistrate are returned hither under the Protection of the said Commissioners, and an Order has been published forbidding all Persons to molest them. They write from *Vienna* of the 30th past, that the last Letters they had from the Imperial Army, left them near *Berken* marching towards the Enemy; And that the Duke of *Lorraine* had resolv'd in his march to attack *Novigrad*; but that there was a report that the *Seraskier* had sent orders to the *Garison* to abandon the place, which they had done, having saved all their Baggage and Cannon. The Letters from *Hungary* tell us, that the Imperialists have lost a great many Men before *Esperies*. We are told from *Strasbourg* of the third Instant that the Intendant de la *Grange* was gone into the Upper *Alsace* to visit the Fortifications of *Brisac*, *Hummingen*, *Freibourg*, and *Schelsbadt*.

Bagua, August 31. The Regiment of Horse Guards march'd from hence the 28th Instant to the *Veluwe*, where the Prince of *Orange* has appointed a review to be to morrow of the Estates of this State; It's said there will be between 12,000 and 17,000 men. The Sieur *Picks* Envoy from the Elector of *Brandenburg* is gone home to give his Electoral Highness an account of this Negotiation, and is expected back here about the end of this month. The States of *Holland* will be dissolved to morrow. The Sieur *Guldenslop*, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of *Sweden*, is expected here very suddenly, part of his Baggage, which came by Sea, being already arriv'd at *Amsterdam*. The Letters from *Germany* put us in expectation of a second Battle be-

tween the Imperialists and the Turks; For they tell us that the *Seraskier* was encamp'd with an Army of 60000 men between *Pest* and *Vaccia*, and that the Elector of *Bavaria* and the Duke of *Lorraine* were marching with the Imperial Army towards them.

Winchest r, September 3. *Alicia Lists* being Convicted of High-Treason at the Sessions of *Oser* and *Terminer* and Goal-Delivery held here, for harbouring of *John Hicks* a Rebel, received Sentence of Death accordingly. And yesterday she was Executed.

Windfor, September 2. Yesterday the Count de *Thun* Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperor, had his Audience of Leave of the King; And this day of the Queen, being Conducted by Sir *Charles Costrel* Master of the Ceremonies.

Windfor, Sept. 3. The first Instant Don *Simon de Souza de Magalhens* Envoy Extraordinary from the King of *Portugal*, had his first Audience of his Majesty, and this day of the Queen, Conducted by Sir *Charles Costrel* Master of the Ceremonies.

Windfor, September 4. This day the Prince of *Mourbach* Envoy Extraordinary from the Elector of *Cologne*, had Audience of the King and of the Queen, being Conducted by Sir *Charles Costrel* Master of the Ceremonies.

Whitehall, September 5. The Count de *Thun* Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperor, had this day Audience of Leave of the Queen Dowager, being Conducted by Sir *Charles Costrel* Master of the Ceremonies.
