of your Privy Council, to approve of such district being assigned, and also to order that the same should be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent, that a description of the boundaries of such district was duly enrolled in your Majesty's High Court of Chancery, on the twenty-fifth day of October one thousand eight hundred and forty-three:

" Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent, that, having taken into consideration the present circumstances of the said district, it appears to them to be expedient, that the boundaries thereof should be altered, under and by virtue of the provisions contained in the sixth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to "further amend the Church Building Acts," as enlarged and extended by the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of your reign, intituled " An Act for the further amend-" ment of the Church Building Acts," and that the boundaries of such district should hereafter be as follow, that is to say:

" On the north by Hyde-park, from Hydepark-corner to the point where it meets the parish of Upper Chelsea; on the west and south by the said parish of Upper Chelsea and the river Thames; and on the east the boundary is formed by proceeding from the river Thames, in a northerly direction, up the middle of the Grosvenor Canal, as far as the Wooden-bridge; it then proceeds from the said Wooden-bridge, in a north westerly direction, along the middle of the road in front of Kemp's-row, as far as Avery-farm-row, up the middle of which it proceeds to Ebury-square, which it crosses to Little Ebury-street; it then proceeds in a north westerly direction along the middle of Little Ebury-street and Coleshill-street, until it enters the King's-road, along the middle of which it proceeds in a north easterly direction as far as Upper Eccleston-street; it then turns in a north westerly direction, up the middle of that street,

until it enters Belgrave-square, and then crosses that square, in a northerly direction, to Halkinstreet; it then proceeds up the middle of that street, in a north easterly direction, until it enters Grosvenor-place, and then up the middle of that place to Hyde-park-corner, where the boundary commenced, as the same district is more particularly delineated on the map or plan thereof hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured blue:

" That the consent of the said Charles-James Lord Bishop of London, as bishop of the diocese, and also as the patron, in right of his see, of the church of, the district parish of Saint Peter, Pimlico (within the ecclesiastical limits of which the said chapelry district of Saint Paul, Wilton-place, is situate, and which said district parish is a portion of and was divided off, under the provisions of the Church Building Acts, from the said parish of Saint George, Hanoversquare, by an Order of His late Majesty King William the Fourth in Council, bearing date the twenty-eighth of June one thousand eight eight hundred and thirty, and also the consent of the Reverend Thomas Fuller, as the incumbent of the said district parish of Saint Peter, Pimlico, have been severally obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section secondly hereinbefore referred to; in testimony whereof, the said Charles James Lord Bishop of London and Thomas Fuller have signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the boundaries of the said chapelry district, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.
