#### PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better pro-" vision for the spiritual care of populous " parishes;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to explain and amend an Act for " making better provision for the spiritual care " of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fourth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words ollowing, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the "spiritual care of populous parishes;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and "amend an Act for making better provision for the "spiritual care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for altering the bounds of the district of Gomersal, in the county of York, and diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas it is by the secondly-recited Act enacted, that it shall be lawful, by the authority provided in the first-recited Act, at any time or times, within twelve months after the date of the licence of the minister first licenced to any separate district, constituted under the provisions

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of the same Act, to alter the bounds of such ! district, although any alteration be not required with a view to the constituting of another separate district; provided always, that the scheme for making any such alteration shall be subject to all the provisions relating to schemes for constituting separate districts under the said first-recited Act, and that any portion of any such separate district which, by any such alteration as aforesaid, shall become detached or excluded therefrom, shall, to all intents and purposes, again belong to and form part of the parish, chapelry, or district out of which such portion was taken, upon such separate district being originally constituted, or to and of any new district as shall be determined by the like authority:

- " And whereas the said district of Gomersal was duly constituted out of the parish of Birstal, in the said county of York, and diocese of Ripon, under the provisions of the said first-recited Act, by a scheme prepared by us, and ratified by an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of February last, and since duly gazetted:
- " And whereas the Reverend Edward Marston was duly licenced as the first minister of the said district on the twentieth day of September now last past:
- " And whereas it has since been represented to us, and appears to us to be expedient, that the bounds of such district should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:
- " Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Thomas Bishop of Ripon, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that the bounds of the said district of Gomersal shall be altered so as to exclude from such district all that part of the township of Gomersal, situate on the western side of an imaginary line, commencing at a point where the rivulet, which runs through the village of Spen, terminates in the stream which separates the said township of Gomersal from the township of Cleckheaton, and thence extending towards the north, east along the bed of the said rivulet to the point (marked a on the map or plan hereunto annexed) where such rivulet first connects itself with the road in the village of Spen, and thence in a straight direction towards the north

west to the centre of a certain boundary post (marked b as aforesaid) on the northern side of the Leeds and Elland tnrnpike road, and at a distance of four hundred and five yards, or thereabouts, from the crown and centre of Spenbridge, on the said turnpike road, and thence continuing in the same direction, to the boundary between the said township of Gomersal and the township of Hunsworth; and that the said imaginary line shall henceforth form part of the boundary of the said district of Gomersal on the western side thereof.

- " And we further recommend and propose, that the portion of the said district which, by reason of the alteration hereinbefore recommended and proposed, shall become and be detached or excluded therefrom, shall, to all intents and purposes, again belong to and form part of the said parish of Birstal.
- " And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas due notice of the said scheme has been given in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, and no objections have been made thereto:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Ripon.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. 77 HEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed

in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An "Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, "passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of ad-"ditional churches in populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the fifth day of November one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, viz.

" Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Duffield, in the county of Derby, and within the diocese of Lichfield, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should, under the provisions contained in the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled " An Act to amend and render more effectual an " Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, " for building, and promoting the building, of " additional churches in populous parishes," be assigned to the church, called Saint John the Evangelist, recently erected and consecrated at Hazlewood, in the said parish of Duffield, and that such district should comprise part of the townships of Hazlewood, Windley, Postern, Duffield, and Belper, situate on the southern side of the boundary between a portion of the firstmentioned townships of Duffield and Hazlewood intermixed and that of Shottle; and that such district should be called, " The Chapelry District of Hazlewood," and should commence at a point where the above-mentioned boundary intersects the Derby and Wirksworth turnpike road, marked A on the map hereunto annexed, and extends in an easterly direction, along the line of the abovementioned boundary, to a point where it meets the boundary between the above-mentioned intermixed townships and that of Belper, marked B on the said map; thence in a southwardly and eastwardly direction, along the line of the lastmentioned boundary, to where it intersects the Ashbourne and Belper turnpike road, where the road leading from Chevin to Belper Lane End intersects such last-mentioned turnpike road marked C on the said map; thence in a southwardly directionn, along the centre of the road

leading from Chevin to Belper Lane End, to where it is intersected by the Blackbrook; then taking the line of such brook, across the centre of a reservoir, to where such brook enters the river Derwent, and to the centre of the river opposite the point marked D on the said map; thence in a southwardly direction, along the centre of the course of the river Derwent, to a point marked E on the said map (the centre of a bridge carrying the North Branch of the Midland Railway over such last-mentioned river); thence extending in a westwardly direction, along an imaginary line, being the boundary of the district of Milford, and continuing along such last-mentioned imaginary line, to where it meets the Carthouse-road, at a point where a footway leaves such last-mentioned road, and marked F on the said map; thence in a northwardly, westwardly, and southwardly direction, along the ancient boundary between the townships of Duffield and Hazlewood, to where such boundary intersects a watercourse flowing from the vicinity of Hazlewood-hall, and continuing, along the line of such ancient boundary, to a point marked G on the said map, where such ancient boundary meets a road leading from Duffield to Shottle-gate; thence from the lastmentioned point in a westwardly direction, along an imaginary line across the river Ecclesbourn, to a point marked H on the said map, where such imaginary line strikes the centre of the turnpike road first mentioned leading from Derby to Wirksworth, opposite to a culvert through which a stream passes dividing the townships of Duffield and Windley; and in a northwardly direction, extending along the centre of such last-mentioned turnpike road, to the point marked A on the said map where the boundary commenced, as the same is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured green:

"That banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said church of Saint John, at Hazlewood aforesaid; and that the fees to arise therefrom should be received for, on account of, and paid to, the present vicar or incumbent of the said parish of Duffield, during his incumbency thereof; and that, upon his avoidance of the said parish, such fees should belong and be paid to the minister for the time being of Saint John's Church, at Hazlewood aforesaid:

" That the consent of the Right Reverend | Lieutenant Charles Lamb to be Captain, vice Sir John Bishop of Lichfield has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said John Bishop of Lichfield has signed and sealed this representation:

" Your Majesty's said Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publiaction of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.
