A. to be four of Her Majesty's Inspectors of Schools.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the provisions of the ninth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the further amendment of the church building Acts," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a repre-

sentation, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of November one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, viz.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parishes of Netherbury and Poorstock, otherwise Powerstock, in the county of Dorset, and within the diocese of Salisbury, it appears to them to be expedient to unite and consolidate certain contiguous parts of the said parishes of Netherbury and Poorstock, and to form the same into one consolidated chapelry for the consecrated church, called Christ Church, situate at Melplaish, in the said parish of Netherbury, for all ecclesiastical purposes, under the provisions of the ninth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the further amendment of the church building Acts;" and that such consolidated chapelry should be called, 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Melplaish,' and should consist of the easternmost part of the parish of Netherbury, and the north westernmost part of the parish of Powerstock, as also a detached portion of the latter parish marked No. 246 (a) on the tithe commutation map of the said parish, and which portion is entirely surrounded by the parish of North Poorton; and that such consolidated
