A T the Court at Windsor, 4th February 1847,<br>\section*{PRESENT,}<br>The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Report of the Right Honourable the Lords of a Committee of Council, dated the 3rd instant, in the words following, viz. :

Your Majesty having been pleased, by your Order in Council of the nineteenth day of December last, to refer unto this Committee for consideration an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act for the more easy "recovery of small debts and demands in England," with directions to report to your Majesty their opinion upon the orders which it may be proper to make for the purposes of the said Act :

The Lords of the Committee, in obedience to Your Majesty's said Order of Reference, have taken the said Act into consideration, and are pleased humbly to report, as their opinion, to your

Majesty, that two Orders in Council to the effect following, should be made for the purposes of the said Act; that is to say,

## ORDER IN COUNCIL, No. 1.

That on the thirteenth day of March in this year the several courts holden for the recovery of small debts or demands, under the provisions of any Act or Acts cited in one or both of the schedules annexel to the said Act of the last session of Parliament and marked (A) and (B) respectively (except the Courts hereinafter more particularly specified), shall be abolished ; and that on and after the fifteenth day of March in this year the County Court of Middlesex, heretofore holden under the provisions of an Act, passed in the twentythird year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, intituled "An Act for preventing Delays and Expences in the Proceedings in the County Court of Middlesex, and for the more easy and speedy Recovery of Small Debts in the said County Court," shall be holden under the provisions of the said Act of the last session of Parliament, in the several districts
