The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the third day of Fe-

February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, that is to say :

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty’s reign, intituled “ An Act “ to make better provision for the spiritual care “ of populous parishes,” have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting two separate districts for spiritual purposes, one of such districts out of the parishes of Saint Andrew, Plymouth, and East Stonehouse, and the other out of the first-mentioned parish, all in the county of Devon, and in the diocese of Exeter.

“ Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district ; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall

not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the meantime, consent to the same ; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereafter provided :

“ And whereas the said parishes of Saint Andrew, Plymouth, and East Stonehouse, are respectively of great extent, and contain a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular parts of such parishes hereinafter mentioned and described, neither of which parts at present contains within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted separate districts in manner hereinafter set forth :

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Bishop of Exeter, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all those parts of the said parishes of Saint Andrew, Plymouth, and East Stonehouse, described in the schedule hereunto annexed, and therein numbered 1, and also all that part of the said parish of Saint Andrew, Plymouth, described in the said schedule, and therein numbered 2,—all which parts, together with the boundaries thereof respectively, are delineated and set forth in the maps or plans hereunto also annexed, and respectively numbered in like manner—shall be constituted separate districts for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be respectively named as follows, that is to say, the district, numbered 1. in the said schedule, shall be named,

“ The District of Saint Peter, Plymouth;” and the district, numbered 2. therein, shall be named, “ The District of Saint James, Plymouth.”

“ And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of each of the districts so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within either of such districts, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to the minister for the time being of such district, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within either of such districts shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said respective sums of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November, as the case may be, next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of either of such districts or new parishes shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from

recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ SCHEDULE.

“ No. 1.—The district of SAINT PETER, PLYMOUTH, being,—

“ All that part of the parish of Saint Andrew, Plymouth, in the county of Devon, and in the diocese of Exeter, situate on the northern side of an imaginary line extending eastward from the western boundary of the said parish, along the middle of Union-road and Union-street, to a point (marked *a* on the map or plan hereunto annexed and numbered 1) opposite to the middle of Queen-street; and on the western side of an imaginary line extending northward from such point, along the middle of Queen-street aforesaid, across King-street, and continuing thence in a straight direction through Pentey's Nursery to a point (marked *b* as aforesaid) opposite to the southern end of Cambridge-lane West, and thence eastward in a straight direction to the wall on the western side of such lane, and thence northward along such wall, and along the backs of the houses and courts on the western side of Claremont-street and Claremont-place, across Five Fields-lane, and thence in a straight direction to the eastern end of Mill Lake; and also all that part of the parish of East Stonehouse, in the same county and diocese, situate on the north eastern side of an imaginary line extending along the middle of that part of the high road from Plymouth to Stoke between Five Fields-lane and Mill Lake aforesaid.

“ No. 2.—The district of SAINT JAMES, PLYMOUTH, being,—

“ All that part of the said parish of Saint Andrew, Plymouth, bounded as follows; that is to say, on the north by the said district of Saint Peter, on the east by an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked *a* on the map or plan hereunto annexed and numbered 2) in the middle of Union-street aforesaid opposite to the middle of Athenæum-lane, and thence extending southward along the middle of such lane to Mill Bay-road, and thence westward along the middle of such road to a point (marked *b* on the last-mentioned map or plan) opposite to the middle of Athenæum-street, and thence south-

walk along the middle of such street, and continuing in a straight direction as far as the Hoe; and on the south and west by an imaginary line extending westward from such last-mentioned imaginary line along the northern boundary of the Hoe aforesaid, and of the buildings and premises adjoining thereto belonging to Thomas Gill, Esq. to a point (marked *c* on such last-mentioned map or plan) opposite to the middle of a certain lane or road leading from such buildings and premises into the Citadel-road, and thence northward along the middle of such lane or road and of the Citadel-road aforesaid, as far as the middle of Mill Bay-road aforesaid, and thence towards the south west along the middle of another lane or road leading to Mill-bay having the buildings and premises called Mill Bay Prisons on the south, and certain tenements and premises adjoining the soap manufactory and premises belonging to Thomas Gill, Esq. aforesaid, on the north, as far as the gateway at the eastern corner of such last-mentioned premises, and thence towards the north west along the north eastern boundary of the same premises as far as the waste leate, and thence towards the south west along such leate as far as the boundary of the said parish of Saint Andrew, and thence along such boundary as far as the middle of Union-road aforesaid."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbents and to the patrons of the churches of the parishes out of which it is intended that the districts therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and whereas one calendar month has expired since such draft was so transmitted:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Exeter.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the ninth day of February one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, viz.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Cheadle, in the county of Stafford, and in the diocese of Lichfield, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to Saint Chad's Church, at Freehay, in the said parish of Cheadle, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes,' and that such district should be named, 'The Chapelry District of Freehay,' and that such district should consist of the south and south eastern portion of the said parish of Cheadle, from the remainder of which parish the district is divided by a line commencing from the boundary between the parishes of Alton and Cheadle, near the Old Furnace, where that boundary meets the brook; and from thence proceeding in a westerly direction along a fence, which divides the two properties called High Shut Farm and Counslow Farm, to the road leading from Counslow to Kingsley; and thence in a southerly direction, along the middle of the said road, until it reaches the Old Toll-gate-house, and then, taking the middle of the old turnpike road, to the Cheadle and Ashbourn

turnpike road; thence, taking the middle of the said turnpike road, for about fifty yards, as far as Moss-lane; and thence, taking the middle of such lane, as far as the point where a brook crosses the said lane; and thence, taking the middle of the brook, as far as a small pool adjoining the Mill House Farm, and from the said pool, taking the line of a meadow fence belonging to the Mill House Farm, to the brook at Cheadle Mill, and then, taking the said brook, to the point near Huntley Hall, at which point another brook, flowing from the Brass Works through Littley Farm, falls into it; thence, taking Littley Brook about two hundred and ten yards, to a fence running westward from the brook, near a Colliery, following the said fence to the road leading from Littley to Huntley; and then, taking a northerly direction for about seventy-six yards, along the middle of the said road, to a fence at the bottom of a small hollow; and then, taking a westerly direction along such fence, to the plantation; and thence, following the fence of the plantation southwards about eighty-four yards, to a meadow; and thence, taking a westerly direction along the said fence for about sixty-five yards, to the northern corner of the said meadow; and thence in a straight line across the plantation to the corner of a croft (No. 1725 in the parish map) near Gun End, and then, taking the northern boundary of the said croft, till it meets the line of division between the parish of Draycott and Cheadle; the district is then bounded on the west and partly on the south by the said parish of Draycott; on the remaining part of the south by the parish of Checkley; and on the east by the parishes of Croxden and Alton, as such district is more particularly delineated on the map hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured pink :

“ That banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said church of Saint Chad; and that all the fees arising therefrom should be paid and belong to the Minister thereof for the time being :

“ That the consent of the Right Reverend John Lord Bishop of Lichfield, as Bishop of the diocese, has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said John Lord Bishop of Lichfield has signed and sealed this representation :

“ Your Majesty's said Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet.”

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.
