Our will is, therefore, and We charge, that this Our Proclamation seen, ye forthwith proceed to the Market Cross of Edinburgh, and all other places needful, and there, in Our name and authority, make publication hereof, that none pretend ignorance; and Our will and pleasure is, that Our Solicitor do cause printed copies hereof to be sent to the Sheriffs of the several shires, Stewarts of stewardries, and Bailiffs of regalities, and their Clerks, whom We ordain to see the same published; and We do appoint them to send copies hereof to the several parish churches within their bounds, that, upon the Lord's Day immediately preceding the

day above mentioned, the same may be published and read from the pulpits, immediately after Divine Service.
