## REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING-ROOM.

The Ladies, who purpose attending Her Majesty's Drawing-Room, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *legibly* written thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance in the Presence-chamber, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to Her Majesty.

And those Ladies, who are to be presented, are hereby informed, it is absolutely necessary that their names, together with the names of the Ladies who are to present them, should be sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's-Office, *before twelve o'clock* on Thursday the 25th instant, in order that they may be submitted for the Queen's approbation; it being Her Majesty's command, that no presentation shall take place unless the name of the Lady presenting, together with that of the Lady to be presented, shall appear on the card to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, which names shall correspond with those previously sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's-Office.

It is particularly requested, that in every case *written cards only* be delivered.

*Board of Green Cloth, St. James's-Palace, March 23, 1847.*

NOTICE is hereby given, that the carriages coming to Her Majesty's Drawing-Room, on Saturday the 27th of March, are to fall into the line at the top of St. James's-street, come down the left hand side, and enter at the iron gate nearest to the Palace, set down at the Arcade, return by the iron gate nearest to Marlborough-house, and pass through Pall-mall into St. James's-square, by George-street. When called, they are to pass from St. James's-square, by Charles-street, into Regent-street, Jermyn-street, come down St. James's-street as before, take up, and go away through Pall-mall.

No hackney carriages will be permitted to come within the gates.

For all persons having the privilege of the *entrée*, tickets will be delivered at the Board of Green Cloth, on Thursday next, between the hours of eleven and three o'clock; their carriages are to enter the gate at Constitution-hill, proceed down St. James's-park, through Stable-yard, into the Ambassadors'-court, set down, and go out into Cleveland-row. The carriages of the Ambassadors, Foreign Ministers, Cabinet Ministers, and Great Officers of State may afterwards wait in the Ambassadors'-court, and those of all other persons having the *entrée* may wait in Stable-yard or St. James's-park till called; they are then to take up in the same order as they had set down, and pass away up the left hand side of St. James's-street.

No carriage will be admitted with company a second time with the same ticket, to prevent which, it must be produced at Constitution-hill-gate, and Stable-yard-gate also, where a corner of it will be torn off by the Marshalmen in attendance; and no person can be allowed the privilege of the *entrée* by any other approach to the Palace than the gates last mentioned.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend an Act for making better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the thirteenth day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, that is to say :

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend an Act for making better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for altering the bounds of the district of Saint Mark, Wolverhampton, in the county of Stafford, and diocese of Lichfield.

"Whereas it is by the secondly-recited Act enacted, that it shall be lawful, by the authority provided in the first-recited Act, at any time or times, within twelve months after the date of the licence of the minister first licenced to any separate district, constituted under the provisions of the same Act, to alter the bounds of such district, although any alteration be not required with a view to the constituting of another separate district; provided always, that the scheme for making any such alteration shall be subject to all

the provisions relating to schemes for constituting separate districts under the said first-recited Act, and that any portion of any such separate district which, by any such alteration as aforesaid, shall become detached or excluded therefrom, shall, to all intents and purposes, again belong to and form part of the parish, chapelry, or district out of which such portion was taken, upon such separate district being originally constituted, or to and of any new district as shall be determined by the like authority:

"And whereas the said district of Saint Mark, Wolverhampton, was duly constituted out of the parish of Wolverhampton, in the said county of Stafford, and diocese of Lichfield, under the provisions of the said first-recited Act, by a scheme prepared by us, and ratified by an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of February last, and since duly gazetted:

"And whereas the Reverend Alexander Baring Gould was duly licenced as the first minister of the said district on the twenty-sixth day of June last:

"And whereas it has since been represented to us, and appears to us to be expedient, that the bounds of such district should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Bishop of Lichfield, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that the bounds of the said district of Saint Mark, Wolverhampton, shall be altered as follows; that is to say, instead of the imaginary line described in the schedule to the last-mentioned scheme, now forming the northern boundary of the said district, such district shall be henceforth bounded on the northern side thereof by an imaginary line extending eastward from the western boundary of the said parish of Wolverhampton, at New Bridge, along the middle of the Tettenhall-road, to a point (marked *a* on the map or plan hereunto annexed) opposite to the middle of a certain public highway known by the name of Whitmore End-lane, and thence extending eastward along the middle of such public highway as far as the middle of Waterloo-road, and thence towards the south east along the middle of such road as far as the middle of Darlington-street; and that all that portion of the township of Wolverhampton situate on the southern side of such imaginary line shall be henceforth included in and form part of the said district; and that instead of the imaginary line described in the said schedule, now forming the eastern boundary of the said district, the same shall, be henceforth bounded on the north eastern, eastern, and partly on the south eastern sides thereof, by an imaginary line extending towards the south east, in a straight direction, from a point (marked *b* as aforesaid) in the middle of Darlington-street aforesaid, and opposite to the middle of Waterloo-road aforesaid, to the junction of Boblake, Salop-street, and Worcester-street, and thence along the middle of such last-mentioned

street, as far as Brickiln-street, and thence towards the south west along the middle of such last-mentioned street till it joins the original south eastern boundary of the said district; and that all that portion of the said township of Wolverhampton situate on the north eastern side of such last-mentioned imaginary line, and now within the said district of Saint Mark, Wolverhampton, shall henceforth become and be detached or excluded from the said district, and shall, to all intents and purposes, again belong to and form part of the said parish of Wolverhampton; and that all that part of the said township of Wolverhampton situate on the western and north western sides of the same imaginary line shall be henceforth included in and form part of the said district of Saint Mark, Wolverhampton.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas due notice of the said scheme has been given in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, and no objections have been made thereto:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Lichfield.
