No carriage will be admitted with company a second time with the same ticket, to prevent which, it must be produced at Constitution-hillgate, and Stable-yard-gate also, where a corner of it will be torn off by the Marshalmen in attendance; and no person can be allowed the privilege of the *entrée* by any other approach to the Palace than the gates last mentioned.

'The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better pro-"vision for the spiritual care of populous "parishes;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign, initituled "An Act to explain and amend an Act for "making better provision for the spiritual care " of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the thirteenth day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, that is to say :

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the "spiritual care of populous parishes;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and "amend an Act for making better provision for the "spiritual care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for altering the bounds of the district of Saint Mark, Wolverhampton, in the county of Stafford, and diocese of 'Lichfield.

"Whereas it is by the secondly-recited Act enacted, that it shall be lawful, by the authority provided in the first-recited Act, at any time or times, within twelve months after the date of the licence of the minister first licenced to any separate district, constituted under the provisions of the same Act, to alter the bounds of such district, although any alteration be not required with a view to the constituting of another separate district; provided always, that the scheme for making any such alteration shall be subject to all

the provisions relating to schemes for constituting separate districts under the said first-recited Act, and that any portion of any such separate district which, by any such alteration as aforesaid, shall become detached or excluded therefrom, shall, to all intents and purposes, again belong to and form part of the parish, chapelry, or district out of which such portion was taken, upon such separate district being originally constituted, or to and of any new district as shall be determined by the like authority:

"And whereas the said district of Saint Mark, Wolverhampton, was duly constituted out of the parish of Wolverhampton, in the said county of Stafford, and diocese of Lichfield, under the provisions of the said first-recited Act, by a scheme prepared by us, and ratified by an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of February last, and since duly gazetted:

"And whereas the Reverend Alexander Baring Gould was duly licenced as the first minister of the said district on the twenty-sixth day of June last:

"And whereas it has since been represented to us, and appears to us to be expedient, that the bounds of such district should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

" Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Bishop of Lichfield, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that the bounds of the said district of Saint Mark, Wolverhampton, shall be altered as follows; that is to say, instead of the imaginary line described in the schedule to the last-mentioned scheme, now forming the northern boundary of the said district, such district shall be henceforth bounded on the northern side thereof by an imaginary line extending eastward from the western boun-pary of the said parish of Wolverhampton, at New Bridge, along the middle of the Tettenhallroad, to a point (marked a on the map or plan hereunto annexed) opposite to the middle of a certain public highway known by the name of Whitmore End-lane, and thence extending eastward along the middle of such publick high-way as far as the middle of Waterloo-road, and thence towards the south east along the middle of such road as far as the middle of Darlingtonstreet; and that all that portion of the township of Wolverhampton situate on the southern side of such imaginary line shall be henceforth in-cluded in and form part of the said district; and that instead of the imaginary line described in the said schedule, now forming the eastern boundary of the said district, the same shall, be henceforth bounded on the north eastern, eastern, and partly on the south eastern sides thereof, by an imaginary line extending towards the south east, in a straight direction, from a point (marked b as aforesaid) in the middle of Darlington-street aforesaid, and opposite to the middle of Waterloo-road aforesaid, to the junction of Boblake, Salop-street, and Worcester-street,
