A T the Court at Buckingham-Palace, the 20th day of May 1847,

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting "the building, of additional churches in populous "parishes," and of the provisions of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the sixth and seventh years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the division of the "rectory of Walton on the Hill, in the county " palatine of Lancaster, and for authorizing sales " and conveyances in fee or leases for long terms of " years, for building purposes, and other dispo-" sitions to be made of the lands and revenues " belonging to the said rectory and to the vicarage " of Walton on the Hill, for the endowment of " such separate rectories, and the augmentation of "such vicarage," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the eleventh day of May one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, that is to say,

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An "Act for building, and promoting the building, of "additional churches in populous parishes;" continued by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend "the Acts for building, and promoting the building, "of additional churches in populous parishes;" and further continued by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to prolong, for ten years, Her Majesty's Commis-"sion for building new churches," beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, when the last census was taken, the parish of Walton on the Hill, with the townships, districts, or places of Simonswood, Croxteth-park, and Toxtethpark, in the county of Lancaster and diocese of Chester, contained a population of seventy-nine thousand two hundred and sixty-nine persons; and that the said parish comprises and extends over the several towns, townships, districts, or places of Bootle-cum-Linacre, Everton, Fazakerley, Formby, Ainsdale, Kirkby, Kirkdale, Walton on the Hill, and West Derby; and is also claimed to extend over the townships, districts, or places

of Simonswood, Croxteth-park, and Toxteth-park; and that the tithes of the said respective townships or places have been commuted, or are about to be commuted, under the Act for the commutation of tithes in England:

"That the parish church of Walton on the Hill affords accommodation for one thousand persons:

"That there is within the township of West Derby, in the said parish, a chapel of ease to the parish church of Walton on the Hill, known by the name of the Ancient Chapel of West Derby, which is a perpetual caracy, and affords accommodation for seven hundred persons:

"That the advowson of the church of Walton on the Hill consists of a rectory and vicarage, and the Vicar has been entitled to the surplice fees received within the ancient or entire parish, and claims to be entitled to the great tithes of the said townships of Everton and Linacre:

" That the rectory or parish church of Walton on the Hill is now vacant:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that the endowments and sources of the income of the present rectory of Walton on the Hill are the rectory-house, offices, and garden; the glebe lands, containing one hundred and twelve acres, one rood, and thirty-three perches; and the tithes, or commuted rents charge, of the lands in the parish; and that the estimated income received from the glebe land and tithes, or rent charge, of the said rectory is about two thousand six hundred pounds per annum:

" That the endowments or emoluments belonging to the said chapel of ease at West Derby, or to the incumbent thereof, at present consist of two several sums of four thousand two hundred and ninety-nine pounds, seventeen shillings, and two pence, Three Per Cent. Reduced Bank Annuities, and two hundred pounds sterling, appropriated for the augmentation thereof by the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne for the augmentation of the maintenance of the Poor Clergy, partly from that bounty and partly from grants by Parliament in aid thereof, and donations by individuals for the like purpose; and also of an annual sum of twenty pounds, sixteen shillings, or thereabouts, paid by the Rector for the time being of Walton on the Hill, and an annual sum

of three pounds, six shillings, and eight pence, payable out of Her Majesty's duchy of Lancaster; and that the amount of the interest and dividends of the said funds, paid yearly to the perpetual curate of West Derby by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty, amount to one hundred and thirty-one pounds, ten shillings, and eleven pence:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances relating to the said parish of Walton on the Hill, as well as the provisions of a certain Act of Parliament, passed in the session holden in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act for the division of the " rectory of Walton on the Hill, in the county " palatine of Lancaster, and for authorising sales " and conveyances in fee or leases for long terms " of years, for building purposes, and other " dispositions to be made of the lands and " revenues belonging to the said rectory and to " the vicarage of Walton on the Hill, for the " endowment of such separate rectories, and the " augmentation of such vicarage," it appears to them to be expedient, that the said parish and rectory of Walton on the Hill should be divided into two distinct and separate parishes and rectories for all ecclesiastical purposes whatsoever, under the provisions of the said last-mentioned and of the sixteenth section of the Act. said Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, and that such division shall be made as follows, that is to say, that the township of West Derby shall be separated from the said parish or rectory of Walton on the Hill, and form one distinct rectory or district for ecclesiastical purposes, by the name of "The Rectory of West Derby," and that all the several other townships, districts, or places, which are comprised in the said parish or rectory of Walton on the Hill (except the said township of West Derby), shall form and continue a separate rectory or district for ecclesiastical purposes, by the name of "The Rectory of Walton on the Hill:"

"That the consent of the Right Reverend John Bird Lord Bishop of Chester has been obtained thereto, as required by the beforementioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, and also the consent of John Shaw Leigh, of Liverpool, in the county of Lancaster, Esquire (as patron of the said rectory or parish church of Walton on the Hill), and the consents of the Reverend Thomas Gerard Leigh (as Vicar of the said vicarage or parish church of Walton on the Hill), and of the Reverend John Stewart (as the minister or incumbent of the said church or chapel of West Derby), have been also obtained thereto, in testimony whereof, the said John Shaw Leigh, Thomas Gerard Leigh, and John Stewart, have respectively signed and sealed this present instrument:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners, therefore, beg leave to lay before your Majesty the before-mentioned circumstances, and fumbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed division be accordingly made and effected, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provi- "sion for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-second day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to make better provision for the spiritual care "of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish of Sheffield, in the county and diocese of York.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or, parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel; in use for the purposes of divine worship, and tofix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the mean time, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any

such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereinafter provided:

"And whereas the said parish of Sheffield is of great extent, and contains a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of such parish hereinafter mentioned, such part not at present containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Edward Archbishop of York, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Sheffield, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—shall be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly, and that the same shall be named, "The District of Carver Street."

"And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall

have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereuponbecome, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, thereshall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be: and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid tothe minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

" The district of CARVER STREET, being-

"All that part of the parish of Sheffield, in the county and diocese of York, comprised within and bounded by an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked a on the map or plan hereunto annexed) in the middle of West-street opposite to the middle of the street or roadway in front of Westfield-terrace, and thence extending eastward along the middle of West-street aforesaid to a point (marked b as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Holly-street, and thence southward along the middle of such last-mentioned street and of Coal-pit-lane to its junction with South-street, and thence towards the south west along the

middle of such last-mentioned-street, as far as the eastern boundary of the district of Eldon, in the said diocese, and thence northward along such boundary to the point where the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbent and to the patrons of the church of the parish, and to the incumbent and to the patron of the church or chapel of the chapelry, out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and whereas one calendar month has expired since such draft was so transmitted, and no objections have been made thereto:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of York.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh

years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act" to make better provision for the spiritual care "of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parishes of Saint Margaret and Saint John the Evangelist, and the district of Saint Mary, Tothill-fields, all in the city and liberty of Westminster, and in the diocese of London.

" Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the meantime, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any

such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereinafter provided:

"And whereas the said parishes of Saint Margaret and Saint John the Evangelist, and district of Saint Mary, Tothill-fields, are respectively of great extent, and contain a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular parts of such parishes and district hereinafter mentioned, neither of which parts at present contains within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be together constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth:

" Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Charles James Bishop of London, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Saint Margaret, and also all that part of the said parish of Saint John the Evangelist, and also all that part of the said district of Saint Mary, Tothill-fields, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,-all which parts, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto also annexed,shall be together constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly, and that the same shall be named, "The District of Saint Stephen, Westminster."

"And whereas Angela Burdett Coutts, of Stratton-street, in the county of Middlesex, spinster, has transferred to our account and to our names in the books of the Governor and Company of the Bank of England, a sum of Three Pounds per Centum Consolidated Bank Annuities, sufficient to produce the annual sum of three hundred pounds, for the permanent

endowment of the minister of the district herein recommended to be constituted, and, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid, of the perpetual curate thereof; we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November, to the minister, for the time being, of the district so recommended to be constituted, and so soon as such district shall have become, according to the provisions of the said Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, to the perpetual curate thereof, the sum of three hundred pounds; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister, or of such perpetual curate as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish:

" And whereas it is by the said Act further enacted, that it shall be lawful, by the authority aforesaid, at any time to assign the right of patronage of any such district or new parish as aforesaid, and the nomination of the minister or perpetual curate thereof respectively, either in perpetuity, or for one or more nomination or nominations, to any ecclesiastical corporation aggregate or sole, or to either of the Universities of Oxford, Cambridge, or Durham, or to any college therein respectively, or to any person or persons, or the nominee or nominees of such person or persons or body respectively, upon condition of such corporation, university, college, person or persons contributing to the permanent endowment of such minister or perpetual curate, or towards providing a church or chapel for the use of the inhabitants of such district or new parish, in such proportion and in such manner as shall be approved by the authority:

"And whereas, in addition to the benefaction hereinbefore mentioned, provision has been also made by the said Angela Burdett Coutts for the erection of a church for the use of the inhabitants of the said district or new parish; and it has been proposed to us by the said Angela Burdett Coutts, and it appears to us to be expedient, that the patronage of the said district or new parish should be assigned in manner hereinafter mentioned:

"We, therefore, further recommend and propose, that the right of patronage of, and the nomination of the minister or perpetual curate to, the said district and new parish of Saint Stephen, Westminster, shall be assigned to, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said Angela Burdett Coutts for and during her life; and upon and after the decease of the said Angela Burdett Coutts such right of patronage and nomination shall be assigned to, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the Bishop of London, for the time being, for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

"The district of SAINT STEPHEN, WEST-MINSTER, being-

" All that part of the parish of Saint Margaret, and also all that part of the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, and also all that part of the district of Saint Mary, Tothill-fields, all in the city and liberty of Westminster, and in the diocese of London, comprised within and bounded by an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked a on the map or plan hereunto annexed) on the western boundary of such first-mentioned parish, and in the middle of the Vauxhall-bridge-road where such road crosses the King Scholar Pond Sewer, and thence extending towards the south east along the middle of such sewer as far as the middle of Churton-street, and thence towards the north east along the middle of such street as far as the Vauxhall-bridge-road aforesaid, and thence towards the south east along the middle of such road to a point (marked b as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Bentinck-street, and thence to-

wards the north east along the middle of such last-mentioned street as far as the western angle of Vincent-square, and thence eastward in a straight direction across such square to the south western end of Bell-street, and thence northward along the middle of such last-mentioned street to a point (marked c as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of a certain public passage called Shipcourt, and thence eastward along the middle of such passage as far as the middle of the Horseferry-road, and thence northward along the middle of such last-mentioned road, and of the street or road called Strutton-ground, to the northern boundary of the said parish of Saint John the Evangelist, and thence first westward and then southward along the boundary of the same parish to the eastern corner of certain property belonging to the Governors of Saint Margaret's Hospital, Westminster, and thence towards the north west along the north eastern boundary of such property to the northern angle thereof, and thence towards the south west along the north western boundary of the same property to the middle of Francisstreet, and thence also towards the south west along the middle of such last-mentioned street, and continuing in a straight direction to the point where the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbents and to the patrons of the churches of the parishes, and to the incumbent and patron of the church or chapel of the district, out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and whereas one calendar month has expired since such draft was so transmitted, and no objections have been made thereto:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of London.
