

of three pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, on the said principal sum, or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid; and if and when it shall happen that the principal and interest, directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned, shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of forty days after the same shall become due, it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors, their successors or assigns, to recover the same, and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof, by distress and sale in such manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in being at the time of such distress and sale; and such mortgage deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us, and shall bind as well the said Samuel Bishop of Oxford as every succeeding bishop of the said see, until the principal and interest, costs and charges shall be paid off and discharged.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that the sum of one thousand six hundred and sixty-nine pounds so to be borrowed shall be paid to us, to be applied for the purposes of this scheme, and that the receipt of our treasurer, for the time being, indorsed on the said mortgage deed, shall be a good and sufficient discharge to the said Governors and their successors for the same, who shall not be bound or required to see to the application thereof; and that upon the receipt of the said sum of one thousand six hundred and sixty-nine pounds, there shall be applied and paid by us to such persons, at such times and in such manner as we shall deem expedient, the whole or any part or parts of such sum, in or towards completing the said house as a fit episcopal residence for the Bishop of Oxford.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, in conformity with the provisions of the said Acts, or either of them.”

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every

part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Oxford.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled “ An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes,” duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of May one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, that is to say :

“ Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Maresfield, in the county of Sussex, and within the diocese of Chichester, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church of Saint James, situate at Nutley, in the said parish of Maresfield, under and by virtue of the power or authority for such purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled “ An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes,” and that such district should be named, “ The Chapelry District of Nutley,” and that the boundaries thereof should be as follow, that is to say :
