" The district is bounded on the south west and west by the parish of West Hoathly; on the north west and north by the parishes of East Grinstead and Hartfield; on the north east by a continuation of the said parish of Hartfield; on the east and partly on the south by the remaining part of the parish of Maresfield, from which it is separated as follows, namely, by proceeding from a bound stone placed at the bend of the rivulet where the boundary of the parishes of Hartfield and Maresfield meet on the north east of Marlpit Farm, in a straight line south easterly from such bound stone, as far as the bend in the road eastwards of Misburn's Farm; and then proceeds down the middle of that road south easterly until it enters a lane to the south of Avery's Mill leading to Brickyard-lane; then proceeds westerly, up the middle of that lane, as far as Brickyard-lane, and along the middle of the latter lane, in a south westerly direction, until it enters into the Londonroad; and proceeds in a north westerly direction, up the middle of that road, as far as the private road leading to Courtland's Farm, up the middle of which said private road it then proceeds south westerly as far as the boundary line of the said parish of Maresfield and the parish of Fletching, by which latter parish it is bounded on the remainder of the south and south west, as such district is more particularly delineated on the map hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured pink:

"That banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in such church; and that the fees to arise therefrom should be paid and belong to the Minister thereof for the time being :

"That the consent of the Right Reverend Ashhurst Turner Lord Bishop of Chichester, as Bishop of the diocese, has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said Ashhurst Turner Lord Bishop of Chichester has signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the first year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend an " Act for the regulation of municipal corporations " in England and Wales," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that if the inhabitant householders of any town or borough in England or Wales shall. petition Her Majesty to grant to them a charter of incorporation, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty by any such charter if she shall think fit, by the advice of Her Privy Council, to grant the same, to extend to the inhabitants of any such town or borough within the district to be set forth in such charter, all the powers and provisions of the Act of the fifth and sixth William the Fourth, chapter seventy-six, for regulating corporations, whether such town or borough be or be not a corporate town or borough, or be not named in either of the schedules to the said Act; provided, nevertheless, that notice of every such petition, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order that the same may be taken into consideration by Her Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette one month at least before such petition shall be so considered :

And whereas the inhabitant householders of the township of Wolverhampton, in the county of Stafford, have presented a petition to Her Majesty in Council, praying that a charter of incorporation may be granted to such part of the borough of Wolverhampton as is comprised in the township of Wolverhampton; and the inhabitant householders of the borough of Halifax, in the west riding of the county of York, have presented a petition to Her Majesty in Council, praying that a charter of incorporation may be granted to the said borough; Her Majesty was this day pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said petitions be taken into consideration.
