Rome, Sept. 22.

HE Letters from Natles tell us, They had advice by a Veffel arrived there from the Levan, that the Venetians had taken Modon in the Morea; but it needs a Confirmation.

Venice, Sept. 29. The Forces of this Republick, according to the Advices we have received this week, continued Encamped on the fecond of this month in the Neighborhood of Coron, Captain General Morofini being refulved not to remove from thence till the Fortifications of that Place which had been ruined during the Siege were repaired. He had caufed all his fick Men to be transported to St. Maura; And had fort fix Galleys to Calamata to encourage the Mainotes to calt off the Ottoman Yoak, and to put themfelves under the Protection of the Republick. By a Saique arrived from Zara we are informed that the Chevalier Janeo was marched with a Body of Morlaques to make an Incursion into the Turkish Territories.

tories. Lembourg, Sept. 16. We have Letters from the Ar-my of this Crown of the 10th Inflant, which was then ftill Encamped near the Nieller. The Crown General had held a Council of War, where it was refolved that the Army fliould march the 11th to meet the Forces of Libuania, who advanced very flowly towards them, and that after their Conjunction they fhould pais the Niefler, and enter into Moldzvis. The freiheft account we have of the Enemy, is, That the Scrafquier Soliman Mahomet was marching with an Army of about 30000 Men towards the Niefter; and that in the mean time the Tartars had undertaken to defend the paffage of that River. It is confirmed that the Turks have put a great Convoy into Cami nice, fo that that place is now fufficiently provided The Colwith all things necessary for its defence. facks in the Service of this Crown are continually abroad in Parties to obferve the Enemy, and have of late defeated faveral small Bodies of Tartars. The ! Moscovites for ifi: Czekrin, and thereby give great j alousie to the Turks. The King and Queen of Poland are expected in few days at Zolkiew, where their Majeffics have used to pass the latter part of the year, as we are told they intend now to do. They write from Mofcow that the Czars had declared that they would appoint Commissioners to meet at some convenient place on the Irontiers with those of this Crown for the composing the Differences about the Limits.

V.enna, Sept. 30. The Elector of Bavaria parted from hence the 24th Inflant with the Archdutchels his Wife, their Imperial Majefties accompanying them to Our Lady of Brun, two Miles from hence, where they Dined. Their Electoral Highneffes having taken leave of their Imperial Majefties, continued their Journey towards Munick. Prince Waldeck and the Baton de Dingben are returned hither from the Imperial Army, which they left Encamped between the Rivers Ipol and Gran, where the Doke of Lorr in intended to continue till he had an account from the Baron de Mercy of the fucces of the defign upon Agria; His

Highnels, notwi haanding the ill condition in which the Turks left Novigrad, has given Orders for the fortifying that place, towards the Expenc: whereof the Pope has given a good Sum of Money. Wc have advice that the Seralquier finding all his Endeavours for the fetting on foot a N-gotiation for a Peace or a Truce ineffectual, has repalled the Bridge of Effeck, and has feparated his Forc.s, fending part of them towards Zigeth, and the reft towards Sclavonia and Bosnia. The 6000 Men with which Count Palfi had Orders to match towards Creatiz to joyn the Forces Commanded by General Leflie, were according to the laft account we had of them advanced no farther than the Kaban, and feei g the lateness of the year as well as the Detachements the Seralquier has fent to reinforce the Ottoman Forces on that fide, will in all likelihood hinder the execu-tion of the defign Count Leslie had formed to attack Poffega, it's believed thefe ! roops under the Orders of Count Palfi will be Countermanded. They write from Nembeufel, That they had quite clean-ied the great Ditch, and brought the Water in-to it as before the Siege; That the Trenches were all filled up; That they are at prefent repairing the two attackt Baftions, and that the Governor had fummoned in 2000 Peafants out of the Neighbouring Counties to work on the faid Fortifications. The Letters from Upper Hungary inform us that General Schultz was before Cafcham; And that General Caprara was marched directly towards Tockay, refolving to take that place whatever it coll, that he might thereby open a passage and correspondence b. tween Transi vania and Zatmar. The Picfident of the Council of War, the Committary General, and the Baron d'Abele, have frequent conferences together about fetling the Winter quarters. It's fait the Troops of Brunfwick and Cologne will have theirs in Hungary, Silefie and Meravia. The Count de Coningimark. Maighre de Camp General of the Forces of the King of Sueden is arrived here, and we are told he is treating with the Ambifiador of Venice, about his entring into the fervice of that Republick during the prefent War, as General of their Forces by Land. We receive just now certain advice that Cafebaw has furrendred upon Articles. And there are Letters which fay that the Garifon and Iuhabitants of Tockay had fent Deputies to General Caprara to cipitulate.

Ratisbonne, Ollob. 5. We have an account by an Express which came from Fienna the fecond Inftant, That the Empress was the day before brought to Bed of a third Son, to the great joy of that Court. The Letters from Hangary tell us, That the Imperial Army Commanded by the Duke of Lorrain would separate in few days, and go into their Winter-Quarters, his Highness having received advice that the Serasquier had repared the Bridge of Effeck, having sent a Derachement to reinforce the Onoman Troops on the fide of Scizvonia, that they might be able to make head againft General Leflie's Army, which was Encamped the 20th of this Month near Turanowitz, having a Bridge over the Drave, which they had secured by planting several Pieces of Cannon at the head of
